The Parish Council met on 10 May 2017.

Parish Council membership and member responsibilities

Cllr Hywel Griffiths was elected as the Chairman and Cllr Nick Taylor was elected as the Vice-Chairman. Other members were appointed to the Planning Committee or various working groups.

The Council also reviewed its policies and landholdings.

The Council still has a vacancy so if you are interested in joining the Council please contact the Clerk for an application form. Also following the recent resignation of Jill Preston if no ten electors contact the District Council's Returning Officer within the prescribed timescale the Parish Council may co-opt to fill the vacancy. The next elections for all seats will be held in May 2018.

Recreation Ground Co-ordinator vacancy

we then leave ourselves open to larger new developments because we would be deemed a more sustainable village. The omission sites relate to fields surrounding our village whose land owners believe they suitable for large scale development and their exclusion from the local plan was an omission. I had hoped to fight our case on this but the process does not allow me to talk in the session.

Planning - Caldecote recently had 71 new houses approved, whilst Hardwick has had one site of 98 and a second of 155. Some of our residents in Barons Way have been pestered by unsolicited mail from a Developer wanting to buy their house or houses with the view of demolition thus gaining access to enable potential new development behind. The wording of these letters has caused distress to some of the residents as one may expect.

Parking/ Accidents - residents have brought up the issue of car parking on West Street, between Barons Way and the Crossroads. I appreciate several of you have no off road parking, but stretching the parking over a greater distance would at least allow cars to pull into the gaps? The issue with parking in and around the Doctors has also been mentioned, particularly cars left partially blocking drives. As mentioned before, if there is space feel free to park in my farm yard on the right hand side if needs be?

Tractors speeding through the village- not guilty but will pass these concerns on. Madingley Park and Ride - I mentioned this previously regarding the City Deal considering a P&R three times the size of the one at Trumpington on the slope facing Comberton to the south of Madingley Mulch. From the brow of Long Road hill one would just see a massive car park! This hopefully will NOT happen and our Green Belt will remain intact.

Bus Route - there will be a bus route associated with the P&R, and this will either be an on road, or off road option and this has to be decided. I can understand the thinking behind an off road route, but £207 million?? Surely stealing a bit of grass verge and creating a bus lane on Madingley Road would be more cost effective and preserve the Green Belt?

Tennis Courts - some enthusiastic tennis players have tidied the hard Courts on the recreation ground.

Traffic - I am sure many of you will have noticed the massive increase in traffic along Long Road on Friday afternoons, presumably using it as a rat run. Sadly this can not be stopped, and may well be a sign of worse things to come.

Putting the doom and gloom to one side, our village looks a picture and remains a very pleasant little bit of Britain in which to live.
