

#### **Comberton Walkers and Comberton 10K**



#### Transport news: zebras and 20s

Pedestrians, cyclists and drivers will all have noticed the new addition to Comberton's roads: the zebra crossing. This long-awaited feature will be very well used, and will be especially beneficial to the young whose sight is not quite developed to judge car speed well, those pushing a buggy or encouraging a toddler to cross quickly in a gap between cars, wheelchair users, and those who walk slowly or unconfidently.

This new crossing is an example of local government at work. It took considerable personal effort of former Parish Councillor Sophie Higman, and financial support from the Parish and County Councils to implement this comparatively small but important change. It also took time – from the initial idea, doing the research into footfall and canvassing opinion on where to situate the crossing, obtaining funding from the Parish Council, and winning funding for an excellent proposal submitted to the County Council. After many months of waiting, some may have worried that it wasn't going to happen after all. However, behind the scenes contractors were scheduling a time to install the posts, do the electrics, reconfigure the pavement, and get to work with the black and white paint.

The zebra crossing is a reminder that slow progress is nevertheless progress. With the 20 mph project launched last year, we have already made the first significant steps of doing all the research needed to show demand and feasibility. The County Council has assisted in making a plan for exactly where a 20 mph area would start and end, and where speeds could drop from 60 mph to 40 mph. This plan was determined by County rules, and the finer details were carefully deliberated by a traffic professional. We now have a viable plan, and the next step is to secure funding for this project.

Whilst I have stood down from the Parish Council due to family and work commitments, I have remained a member of the Parish's Transport Working Group. In this position, I aim to keep 20 mph on the agenda for future budgets. The Parish has already put seed funding aside to support slower speeds in Comberton, it may be a case of adding to this over coming years to reach the target cost. As with the zebra crossing, it will take time to get there but it will be well worth the wait when we all benefit from safer, quieter and less polluted roads.

Young and old, please bring your strings, flutes, and clarinets, or simply your voices. You are not required to read music, just to hold a tune.

On Monday evening 12 June we held our inaugural gathering, an 'Open Evening', enjoying wine and cheese, a talk and some guided tours. Forty three supporters came. Sara Day, who is the Granta Church Recorder for The Arts Society – formerly NADFAS – gave us a fascinating talk and was able to walk around later, answering specific questions. Thank you Sara!

Sara explained that nearly 50 years ago the Victoria and Albert Museum had realised that it knew very little about the contents of the 16,000 or so C of E churches in the land. A majority of these churches date from the Middle Ages. NADFAS was tasked to start making a record. By chance, we find the local Granta Group are recording and photographing in St Mary's, in the very year the 'Friends' came into being. If anyone has information of interest about items in the Church which may have been given, please contact Sara through the Trustees.

St Mary's is particularly notable for its Medieval benches, not pews because they are not closed by doors! When the recording is finished, in a year or two, the Church will be given a fine illustrated book to add to its Treasures.

The assembled company were then guided around the Exterior and Interior features. Outside, the North Aisle roof, newly leaded for the second time, some historical poor or inappropriate repairs and several cracked stone window frames. Inside, we were able to study the damage from ingress of water as well as a closer inspection of our Medieval woodwork. We then moved on to the Displays. One featured a large Illustration of the Works which need to be done, as identified in the 2014 Quinquennial (5 yearly) Inspection, with estimated costs. This illustration forms one side of our folded Prospectus. On the reverse you will find our Appeal details. The Prospectus has proved to be very popular. 
#### FOSM Comberton Grade Listed Buildings

Grade 2 dwellings in Comberton.

We hope to show this display again at the Church Fete.

Other boards and tables showed fascinating pieces of Church records, old development plans, village faces looking out at us from old



photographs, and excerpts from new historical accounts of Comberton Church and village. We were even brought a rusted iron cannon ball, billiard ball sized, which might well have been fired to smash the Church windows and destroy the "superstitious images" during Cromwell's time!

Donations received during the evening and our luxury Hamper raised well over £500. The bottle of port in the Hamper was a gift from the Dean of Chapel at Jesus College, the Rev. Dr. Paul Dominiac. Newly in post, he had invited members of St. Mary's Church to afternoon tea before Evensong on 23 May to become better acquainted. We enjoyed some lovely singing in Chapel and we look forward to cultivating a more active link with Jesus College.

Thank you to all our supporters, donors and our little band of helpers. May they grow in number! I also wish to thank my fellow First Trustees, John Crang, Godfrey Curtis and Richard Elleray for their continuing hard work for the Trust.

Being a Friend of St.Mary's has caused me to have a new awareness of Comberton village life, past and present. With each fund raising event I find out more history but I am also trying to re-imagine the Church and Village more closely engaged in the years to come. We plan to add new pieces of research to existing accounts and create a more detailed education resource for and about our Church.

## Report: County Council Hardwick Division June 2017 Council Structure ...

Cambridgeshire County Council has now been returned by the electorate to a Conservative led administration. For the last four years there has been "No Overall Control", which has been challenging for all concerned. At the election, the Conservatives asked the electorate to put them back in control of the County Council, and this was shown by the results. The Conservatives have 36 out of 61 seats – a healthy majority of 11.

The first Full Council meeting since the elections took place on the 23rd May. Because the County Council now has a Committee System, and must maintain such a system by law for at least another two years, the Conservatives are determined to make it work more quickly, more efficiently and for the benefit of the residents of Cambridgeshire. Previously the Council structure before the elections consisted of five main committees proportionally made up of 13 members from across all parties:

- \* Adults
- Children and Young People
- \* Economy & Environment
- \* Health
- Highways and Infrastructure

At the Full council meeting, the Conservatives proposed, and it was agreed, to have seven main committees, consisting of 10 members from across all parties. The two extra committees are:

- \* Commercial & Investments
- \* Community & Partnerships

These two additional committees are very important. The Commercial & Investments committee will look at how the Council can best use its assets, whilst at the same time looking to bring in a revenue stream via such projects as their Housing Development project. This will enable the Council to maintain front line services. The Community & Partnerships committee will look at how the Council can and will work more closely with parish councils and communities - to work more collaboratively and efficiently. There will be a Lead Councillor located in each District area. In SCDC, Cllr Lina Joseph has been nominated as the Lead Councillor. At the Full Council meeting it was also agreed that the previous Leader and Deputy Leader would remain in position. Therefore Cllr Roger Hickford remains Deputy Leader of the Council.

It was also agreed not to have any more verbal questions, which was a platform for "showboating" by certain councillors, but instead to facilitate and accommodate more written questions so the Council is more open and transparent, and has a written record of questions asked. It was also agreed to limit the call in facility, as the committee system is by its nature its own scrutiny function.

The Conservatives are very pleased to be back in control of the County Council, and you have two councillors, who both have positions of responsibility and influence. A part from being involved in these committees, I will also be representing the County Council in Outside bodies. This is still a work in progress and I will let you know which groups I have been appointed to. I have already started to meet Service Directors and Officers from different areas in order to get up to speed on all the challenges your community faces.

#### **Highways & road maintenance**

I receive reports from officers regarding road closures and maintenance and I share them on my Facebook page. If you and residents would like instant information please do follow me.

I am aware that parishes would like to see the grass and verge cutting reinstated and we are working on this. I will keep you posted.

We have increased the budget for repairing potholes and resurfacing. I will be meeting your local highways officer to discuss concerns in the electoral division. We ask parish councils to make all your highways concerns known to me, so I can prepare and compare to ensure all issues are being looked at and dealt with. It is my objective to develop a spreadsheet with all the issues raised, so they can be tracked and sorted asap. This system has worked well in the past, but only with the cooperation of the parish councils and residents. Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority (CA)

The CA met on 31 May. This meeting dealt mainly with formalities and appointing of committee members. You can find more information here: CA Meeting May We share similar views on challenges our county faces and we will be working jointly in order to tackle issues such as transport, skills, housing, etc. We want to avoid duplications and make sure there is a multi-level partnership. Choo Choo the next stop is Cambridge North!

#### **Transformation Team**

The Transformation Team is working on all the major change programmes and service design initiatives which are vital to achieving large scale improvement and cost reduction over the next five years. The team officially started in December 2016, and since then lots of work has been done to look at existing projects as well as innovative thinking about work that could transform and improve Council services.

One of the areas they have been working in is Adult Social care. Neighbourhood Cares will be a brand new team changing the way we deliver care, providing better outcomes for our service users at a reduced spend.

Another project is In Touch Project. 35 Smartphones have been rolled out to Reablement staff. Each smartphone has been installed with In Touch, an application that enables mobile working for Support Workers to access information whilst out in the community delivering care, & all recipients have been trained to use it. In Touch also links to the Cygnum database (the resource management & planning system that is used by Adult Social Care) in real time. Those who will receive devices include the Support Workers who visit service users to carry out care related activities & the office based Care Coordinators who allocate these visits.

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 14 June 2017.

#### Bennell Farm outline planning application

The meeting was attended by the planning consultant for the developers. It was explained that the application was broadly the same as before but did not now include a pavilion, pitches and a car park, with the land concerned to be retained by the developers as agricultural land. The developers are now looking at the draft layout for the houses.

Residents had an opportunity to ask questions. In response to a query about changes to the original plan, the consultant explained that the plan was an indicative master plan including required amendments such as foul drainage, and that the plan was only intended to show that 90 dwellings could fit onto the site. The next application, which could show further changes, would provide more detail. Residents expressed concerns about the lack of detail, traffic and screening on the boundary, commenting that the density was too high. The consultant responded that the detailed application would cover such aspects under reserved matters, and the design guide now only showed small pockets of 2.5 storey dwellings around the development rather than the previously shown 3 storey buildings.

Further consideration of the outline application was deferred to the Parish Council's July meeting, until the SCDC Planning Officer can be present. The developer's planning consultant will also be invited to attend.

#### Use of Pavilion office by match officials and offer of furniture

The Parish Council considered a request from the Football Club that the Clerk's office at the Pavilion be used to accommodate match officials, following the Club's recent promotion to the Kershaw Premier league. The Council had no objections in principle that the office be used by the match officials and agreed to clear the office and dispose of the locked tall cupboard and desk. The Council has decided to offer the items of furniture to residents free of charge, so if anyone is interested, please contact the Clerk for further information.

#### Proposed pavilion extension and pitch improvement

The Parish Council is making enquiries about the plans to the Pavilion and pitch improvements, and agreed that the Football Club may have input into the design and costings.

#### Bus service

The Parish Council decided to write to Heidi Allen MP highlighting the concerns of residents about the bus service stopping at 7 pm on weekdays and there being no service on Sundays, and asking her to exert pressure as appropriate to secure a better bus service for the village.

#### Parking by the new pedestrian crossing

Concerns about delivery vehicles parking near the new pedestrian crossing have been raised with the delivery firm and a response is awaited. Other concerns include vehicles straddling the verge, parking on the crocodile markings, vehicles not stopping at the zebra crossing when pedestrians are crossing, and new signage being obscured by vegetation. The Parish Council is to speak to the PCSO about these issues and ask the County Council to cut back the vegetation to improve visibility. The Council urges drivers to refrain from parking close to the zebra crossing and to comply with the law. It will be considering this further at its next meeting, along with other parking issues in the village.

#### Mobile Breast Screening Unit

The Council agreed to write to Comberton Village College asking them to reconsider and to resume the granting of access to the Mobile Breast Screening Unit, to enable them to visit the College car park again. This is considered to be a vital service for the community, and the alternative facilities are not easy to access by public transport, although the Village Help scheme can provide transport to the screening unit at Trumpington. The Parish Council will raise the matter with the Screening Unit to ascertain what facilities they need.
