### Friends of St Mary's Church Comberton Trust

Greetings from the Chairman and Treasurer of the Friends of St Mary's Church Comberton Trust.

We received a wonderful grant of £2000 for roof and other repairs from Cambridgeshire Community Foundation. This donation was made on behalf of the Ridgeon family.

We have also received a grant from the All Churches Trust for £1000 following a successful application made on our behalf by Malcolm Wright. If you would like to help him with our Big Grant Push in 2018 please contact the Trust Chairman David Hughes (details at bottom).

The main role of the Trust Treasurer, is to pay in donations and grant monies, pay out any expenses and transfer monies to the Church PCC to cover their expenditure in relation to repairing the Church fabric.

Unfortunately for the next few years, the Trust also has to raise money to pay back an interest-free loan that was used to cover the costs after the second theft of lead from the Church roof. We have a target to raise at least £35,000 in the next few years.

We are awaiting revised costs for the work involved in bring the Church fabric (the building and associated fittings, bits and pieces) up to specification – the diocese does a quinquenninal (regular five year architect) inspection which highlights things both large and small that are in need of prompt attention.

Once we have these costs then we can raise the money needed; then in agreement with the PCC, schedule to transfer monies to cover these repairs. We have already identified a mechanism to the PCC for Listed Buildings used as Places of Worship which will allow the VAT to be recouped by them for most of these items, and indeed for other maintenance costs that the PCC always spends.

Already this year we have given St. Mary's PCC nearly £3370 to cover works undertaken in the past twelve months.

This magazine covers the end of our first year as a Trust. We therefore will have a record of the monies that the Trust has received and due from grants, from our donors at our events, those giving one-off and better still setting up Standing Orders.

As we write this, the Friends Account stands at over £8050. This means that after our first year anniversary we can apply to register the Trust as a viable Charity which brings us a Charity Number and significant advantage in seeking grants.

We have already been granted Charitable Status by HMRC which means that, at the end of this year, we can claim back 20% as Gift Aid on most of the donations, including those put into our cash buckets at events. This allowed us to join TheGivingMachine shopping scheme.

So if you would like to help us financially with a one-off donation, setting up a standing order or donating something that we could use at an Auction of Promises event then please contact one of us. These would be a great Christmas present to make to protect St Mary's Church building for the village and for the future.

Likewise your own help - even for just a couple of hours - would be really welcome next year as we need a few people to help submit grant applications, create publicity and newsletters, set up events and think up novel fund raising projects. Bedford Gallery Quire is returning to the Church to lead a Workshop in the summer. We're also planning a Concert or two. And there will be a Beating the Bounds! What is that you ask? Watch this space!

Next meeting Thursday December 14<sup>th</sup> which will be our Christmas Lunch 12.45pm for 1pm. There will be a raffle





The unauthorised section of hedging and fencing that was removed will be reinstated by the Parish Council.

# Dog fouling on the recreation ground

South Cambs Enviromental Health Officer has provided the following guidance –

- If an individual is seen allowing their dog to foul the area concerned, then a report should be made to the District Council The initial report can be made via our online report it form scambs.jdi-

consult.net/envirocrime/ or via the contact centre on 03450 450063. We would then follow up the report with the reporter to gather further details and take a statement. - Continued use of clear signage, making it clear where dogs can or cannot be exercised and the expectation to clean up mess and use any bins provided.

- Where individuals are identified through reports, or further investigation, we would aim to take action using a fixed penalty notice or Community Protection Notice.

- If known individuals allow their dogs to roam free on the recreation ground you can report this to SCDC for further investigation on 03450 450 063.

A range of public events will be held across the area from 20 Nov with GCP officers available to discuss the options in more detail with people in the community. ### Heidi Allen MP for South Cambs Newsletter

Welcome to my latest newsletter, lots has been happening since I last wrote!

Many of you will be aware of the plans from Uttlesford District Council to create North Uttlesford Garden Community which, if permitted, could have an adverse impact on the Southern part of the constituency. As such, I attended a meeting with Hinxton, Ickleton, Duxford, Pampisford, Whittlesford and Sawston Parish Councils to discuss their concerns. I too am worried these plans may negatively impact on us by significantly increasing congestion. I have submitted my views to Uttlesford District Council and will continue to keep residents aware of developments as they occur.

You will know there are plans to reduce the number of MPs from 650 to 600, so that each constituency has a similar number of electors. On 17<sup>th</sup> Oct, the Boundary Commission published their revised proposed boundaries for South Cambridgeshire. I was bitterly disappointed to read that their proposals still see South Cambs losing the wards of the Mordens, Bassingbourn, Melbourn and Meldreth. The Boundary Commission's report on the previous consultation acknowledged that I had put forward a counter proposal which had garnered significant public support and that most responses received generally opposed their suggestion. However, they still felt these Cambridgeshire villages should be moved to sit under a Herts regional authority, in spite of acknowledged strong local ties to the area. I will be challenging these proposals again. If you agree that these villages should be retained in South Cambridgeshire rather than transferred to a Hertfordshire constituency, you can comment until the 11<sup>th</sup> Dec. Please see my website for details of my opposition strategy and how to join in the consultation.

You will remember in my last newsletter that the Department for Transport have launched a consultation on accessibility issues for disabled people using public transport. I have been working with local and national groups to bring about improvements for disabled people. BBC Look East kindly filmed a piece for me at Whittlesford station, demonstrating issues disabled people face when there is no lift connecting the platforms.

South Cambs District Council have coincidentally also launched a consultation on taxi licensing which aims to provide more stringent standards. The Council is proposing to introduce a policy requiring all hackney carriages to be wheelchair accessible vehicles. This important consultation closes on 5<sup>th</sup> Jan 2018. You can find details at www.scambs.gov.uk/consultations

Parliament returned in October after the conference recess, and since then, my main campaign has focused on improving the Universal Credit benefit system. I raised this issue during Prime Minister's Questions on the 11th Oct and the Prime Minister kindly agreed to meet with me to discuss this in more detail. There will be a further debate in the House ahead of the budget and I am optimistic the Government is listening and will reduce the 6 week delay claimants currently experience before receiving their first payment.

It is always a pleasure to visit schools in my constituency and at the beginning of Oct, I was grilled by the Perse Pelican's Mini Parliament! I thoroughly enjoyed listening to their thoughtful contributions and answering their questions. I have more school visits planned in November, so if you are a teacher or a governor of a local school and would like to arrange a visit, please do get in touch.

Another important part of my job is to support local enterprise in their efforts to grow and contribute to our local economy. So I was pleased to be able to open the new John Henry Group operations centre in Longstanton. This family business company has gone from strength to strength and I was delighted to be able to cut the ribbon and declare their new centre open!

Finally, Christmas is approaching (how did that happen!?) so it's time to switch on those lights! The "Light Up Cambourne" event on 25th Nov will start at 5pm in the Market Square, Great Cambourne, with lights on at 6.15pm. Caxton's event will be on 9th Dec at 5pm opposite Caxton Manor.
