Parish Log Book

I wanted to learn more about the years of the Great War 1914 – 1919 and so I visited the Records Office of the County Archive in Cambridge. One of our Churchwardens, Mary Jenkins, was my guide. In particular, I wanted information about the Church Organ, which is also the Village War Memorial for World War I.

What I discovered was that when the Rev. Percival Gardner-Smith (Vicar of Comberton 1916 – 1923) was in his second year as Vicar, he opened a blank book and began by writing the following;

"Foreword

"These are days in which records are kept of everything. Not only are births, marriages and deaths registered with the utmost care, but events of much less consequence are duly noted and recorded.

"In some vast palace of pigeonholes the Government records the amount of our incomes, the number of our days, the horsepower of our motors, and even the illnesses from which we suffer. What the Government does, we all do. Some keep diaries; some labour at accounts, parochial, household and personal; some write minutes of proceedings of committees and societies innumerable; all of us seem convinced that our own doings are of such vast importance that posterity should be provided some record of our activities.

"Yet a Parish Log Book is a rarity. Many incumbents labour to puzzle out the history of the past, few think it worthwhile to record the history of the present. Are we not as interesting as our fathers?

"At least the historical researches of our successors would be greatly facilitated if we took the trouble to leave behind some record of the main events in the parishes in which we are called to work. The entries might be trivial, but time lends interest even to trivialities, and it is always possible that some record may be useful in the days to come.

"So we are determined to begin a Parish Log Book, expressing the hope that it will be passed on to our successors and kept with the registers of the Church."

Parish Log Book Cont.

In his retirement, the Rev. Gardner-Smith also wrote "Comberton Parish Church, a descriptive and historical account". It is a ready source of study about our ancient Church.

Come and buy one and help support the cost of all the repairs going on this year! Meanwhile I will continue the search to uncover the story of the Organ!



This month as part of our celebration of the 70th anniversary of the NHS we continued the medical theme with a talk on the life of James Barrie, a medical surgeon.

Barrie was born in 1795 and died in 1865. He was a medical doctor who joined the army and served in many places abroad as an army doctor. He quickly became recognised as an exceptional surgeon and a keen advocate of cleanliness in hospital situations. He served in many foreign countries with the army and eventually became the inspector general of military hospitals..

He was actually the first person to successfully to perform a caeserean in Africa and apart from his work in the military hospitals he became known for his work in improving the life of the inhabitants of countries where he served in the army.

This seems a very straightforward life of an exceptional doctor but when he died the woman who was sent to lay out the body dashed out declaring that the body was that of a woman.

Some how this person had successfully avoided dectection throughout her life in the army. After many years of speculation and research it was established that the doctor was a woman named Margaret Anne Bulkley, the daughter of a grocer from Cork.

This was established by comparison of the handwriting of Margaret as a young adult and two letters written by James Barrie.

How the secret was kept is difficult to imagine and particularly at a time when it would have been an impossibility for a woman to have qualified as a doctor. An intriguing story and still somewhat of a mystery.

Co-options to the Parish Council

The Parish Council was pleased to co-opt Tim Scott and Pamela Black as members of the Council. There remains one vacant seat on the Council.

If anyone is interested in applying, please contact the Clerk. The Parish Council encourages residents to consider joining the Council and undertaking this important role.

Recreation Ground Coordinator and Handyman

Following the recent resignation of Mr Mister as Handyman and Recreation Ground Co-ordinator, the Parish Council would like to thank Mr Mister for all his hard work during his time in this role, and to express appreciation for keeping the village well maintained and tidy. As the Council is sure you will agree, the village has been looking much improved of late. The vacancy will be advertised in due course.

Bennell Farm reserved matters application

This application was concerned with details of the appearance, layout, landscaping and scale for 90 dwellings with associated roads, footpaths, landscaping and open space. The Parish Council reiterated its previous objections including: the height, design and location of the proposed affordable homes, which are not in keeping with the surroundings; the position of the pumping station; overlooking of adjacent properties; and the effect on the sewerage system.

Application for extension at the Baptist Church

In May 2017 the Parish Council recommended refusal for an application on the grounds of overdevelopment, lack of car parking spaces, highway safety and inappropriate incursion into the Green Belt. As the Council believes that nothing has changed from the previous application, it has therefore reiterated its comments and objection.

Local Highways Improvements Scheme

A bid for speed reducing measures in the village is being submitted under the Local Highways Improvements Scheme.

Fire Safety Advice from the Cambridgeshire Fire Service

Cambridgeshire residents have been urged to stay fire safe when outdoors this summer.

With temperatures hitting significant highs, fires in open areas of land can easily spread and become out of control. Events north of the country, with significant moorland fires at Saddleworth Moor and Winter Hill, have shown how these fires quickly spread and take hold of open areas of land.

Group Commander Kevin Napier, head of community fire safety at Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "We want to help ensure that people enjoy the sunny weather while it's here safely. High temperatures and dry areas of land can be perfect conditions for a fire to spread. Something as simple as not stubbing a cigarette out properly, or using a disposable barbecue on grass, can start a fire that can develop quickly."

There are seven simple steps we urge residents to take to help prevent an outdoor fire:

- 1. Ensure cigarettes are completely out
- 2. Do not throw cigarettes out of car windows onto grass verges or vegetation
- 3. Put disposable barbecues on bricks, do not place directly on grass
- 4. Do not leave glass bottles lying on the ground, the sun's rays reflect through the glass and can start a fire
- 5. When camping, do not leave campfires unattended and make sure it is completely out before you leave it
- 6. Use barbecues on a hard, flat surface, away from grass, shrubs or fencing
- 7. Talk to your children about the dangers of starting a fire.
