From Rev. David

Help

In 1965 John Lennon wrote a Beatles hit entitled 'Help!' Apparently, following their meteoric rise, Lennon wrote the song to express the stress he was feeling; underneath a calm exterior was a cry for help. I'm sure most of us can identify with that feeling - the mask stays on but underneath, the face has cracked, and we are longing for help.

Oddly though, it is one of the hardest things to ask for. It means admitting that everything is not quite okay, accepting that independence and autonomy are bizarre ideals that simply cannot bear much semblance to reality. But often we'd rather struggle on, pretend we can cope on our own, than learn genuine interdependence.

Some, of course, are better at asking for help than others. I had a friend at University who seemed to excel at it. No embarrassment; just a calm confidence that enabled her to go to CBT, to ask for essay help, to crash out with friends when needed. Looking back, there was a lot I could have learnt from her

Asking for help is something I'm still learning; I'm realising I can't do it all, however fast I pedal, and more importantly that asking for help is a good thing.

Unfortunately, some narratives we live with, including some Christian ones, make asking for help quite difficult. There is an old prayer that goes like this:

'Jesus has no hands but yours no feet but yours no body but yours with which to touch the world...'

It has, in my view, had rather pernicious consequences. It perpetuates the lie that 'I' must run myself ragged and do all I can because there is no one else. It can lead to a rather arrogant form of Christianity which says 'I' have the resources, and 'you' have the need.

Instead, I'm beginning to learn that Jesus is more often found ahead of us, working through the hands and feet of others - even if they don't know it; I'm learning that to cry 'help' might actually be the entrance into a far richer life.

After a season of consolidation and much optimism in 2017 we began our 2018 Saturday and midweek campaigns in the Cambridgeshire Cricket Association (CCA) Junior 4 West and Cambridge Business House League Division 3, respectively. After a poor start to the season, losing 8 out of our first 9 games across all competitions, we rounded off the season in style. gaining maximum points from our last 6 CCA games to catapult us into 2nd place in Junior 4 West and thus gain promotion back to Junior 3 for the first time since 2012!

Comberton Cricket Club 2018 Season Review Cont.

We will be holding nets over the winter; equipment is provided, and all abilities are welcome!

May

We started the season against Cherry Hinton II and faced an opposition with at least four first teamers who usually play in Senior 2. The gulf in class was clear as they racked up a daunting total of 285-4; Will Glasse (2-71) the pick of the attack. In reply a blistering innings from Patel (96) gave us hope but we finished on 206-8 to go down by 79 runs.

Our first midweek game versus Swaffham Bulbeck ended in a final over, 8 wicket defeat: Patel (68) again and Darren Ward (31*) the shining lights with the bat. A disappointing collapse versus Cam Kerala II next up saw us slip from 141-4 to 155 all out. Patel (60) continued his superb start to the season with able support from Cundell (35). Defending a below par total, we fought hard in wet conditions but went down by 3 wickets despite the efforts of Patel (2-23), Glasse (2-29) and Paul Samways (2-20).

A 6 wicket defeat against Qualcomm followed, although skipper Preece (50) provided entertainment with the bat with some cavalier strokeplay and Luke Osbourne (2-26) snared a couple of wickets with the ball.

Later that week we took on Cambridge NCI IV at Parker's Piece and fell apart as 89-2 became 113 all out with only Patel (40) making a substantial score. A heroic bowling performance led by Preece (3-28) and Samways (2-20) took the game into the last over but we were left ruing dropped catches as NCI squeezed home to a 1 wicket win.

A walkover win over Girton II gave us our first 20 point haul of the season but we then crashed out of the Lower Junior Cup with a poor fielding display in an 8 wicket loss to Barrington II; Samways (45*) and Ed Willan (34) our main contributors with the bat

June

June began with a narrow 11 run defeat against Cherry Hinton II. Fielding first, Patel (4-32) had bowled superbly at the death to keep the opposition to 189-8. In reply, we were never comfortably ahead of the required run rate and finished on 178-8 despite solid knocks from Patel (47), Cundell (47) and lusty blows from stalwart Derek Wick (22) at the death.

Comberton Cricket Club 2018 Season Review Cont.

A 6 wicket defeat in the Pye Cup against Bottisham & Lode followed with Patel (53) notching yet another half-century and the returning Tim Vries (3-23) bowling incisively.

Our first 'on the field' win of 2018 was achieved against Great Shelford III as brilliant knocks from Cundell (102*) and Samways (67) powered us to 227-2. A tight bowling and fielding display led by Glasse (2-30) ensured we closed out 50 run winners.

Another midwicket defeat, this time by 6 wickets against Parkside was next as only Preece (35), bloodied after a top edge into his face mid-innings, made any significant impression on the scorecard.

Against Coton II we racked up 291-6 (our highest total for at least 15 years) as Patel (136) smashed a maiden hundred with able support from Willan (43) and Samways (42). We completed an emphatic 179 run victory with Vries (4-19) dismantling the top order and Patel (3-10) extinguishing the tail to conclude a superb all round performance.

Next up we went down to a 9 wicket defeat against a powerful Bluntisham side defending only

85; Vries (32*) being our main contributor with the bat. We closed out June with a comprehensive defeat against Cam Kerala II as they blasted 290-6 (Cundell with 2-53 the leading bowler). In reply we slumped to 111 all out with Tim Saunders (43) the sole man to provide any resistance.

July

July began with a further 20 points on the board, as Great Shelford III could not raise a side. This meant over three weeks without cricket (!) before we faced Cambridge NCI in our penultimate midweek fixture. In a well contested and competitive game we posted 145-4 as Samways (45) and Preece (45) both wielded the willow with flair. We sadly went down to a 4 wicket defeat with only two balls left in an exciting run chase despite the ever-reliable seamers of Patel (4-31) and a fiery spell from Tom Kirker.

Nevertheless, we gained revenge over Cambridge NCI IV a few days later in the CCA. After solid contributions from our top order (Patel 45, Willan 30 and Samways 31), a swashbuckling partnership of 63 for the 6th wicket between Joe Cary (37*) and linchpin Carl Glasse (23) was crucial in getting

us to 213-6. A reliable display in the field kept NCI to 185-7 with Patel (2-22) and Deepthi Fernando (2-27) spearheading the bowling attack.

August

August began with walkover wins against Elsworth in midweek and Coton II a few days later on the Saturday. Whilst the points on the board were welcome, the situation sadly reflected the issue of reduced participation in cricket with large numbers of defaults occurring across the county this season.

We took on Steeple Morden the following week in a crucial clash that we had to win to keep up our promotion hopes. Losing the toss and batting first on a wet wicket we subsided from 50-1 to 107 all out with only Saunders (31) making a substantial innings. After a steady start from the Steeple Morden top order our prospects did not look good until Saunders took two blinders at gully and fine leg off Nik Patel (5-24) to remove their key batsmen.

The remaining middle order batsmen were removed with ease to put us on the front foot but their number 9 played a crucial knock to take them close. With the score on 106-9 Dip Patel (3-18) bowled their number 11 to ensure a 1 run win and spark chaotic scenes amongst the Comberton contingent.

Yet another walkover win against Girton II followed before our final game of the season in a winner-takes-all clash for second place and promotion against Steeple Morden again. A dominant, unbeaten opening stand of 273 from Cundell (130*) and Samways (128*) put us in a fantastic position having lost the toss.

Some lusty blows from the Steeple Morden top order coupled with dodgy fielding led to some nerves in the Comberton camp but Martin Collins (4-40) bagged the majority of the top order to guarantee a 66 run win and celebratory drinks in The Three Horseshoes after the game.

Dog Owners

We would like to remind owners that you can be prosecuted for failing to pick up after your dog. But in March the law changed and dog owners can also face an on the spot fine for failing to have bags in their pockets...

There has been a noticeable increase in fouling especially around Harbour Avenue, Barton Road and Hillfield Road.

Dogs are very much welcomed into the village; however we do ask that their owners behave responsibly. Apart from the obvious unpleasantness when we tread in dog excrement, there are some serious health issues, so picking up after our dogs is not a choice it's a responsibility. Failure to do so can result in a pretty hefty fine. If dogs are not wormed regularly and their faeces picked up, there is the danger of toxocariasis.

There are numerous dog waste bins and plenty of normal waste bins (which can also be used) around the village and we ask that dog owners 'bag it and bin it'.

On public footpaths and byways where a bin is not so readily available we ask that owners either bag it and carry it to the

nearest bin or follow National Trust guidelines and use a stick to remove the excrement from the pathway. On the recreation ground, dog owners are also required to keep their dog under control (this includes the recreation ground extension) and away from the children's play equipment (and of course use one of the 3 bins sited on the rec).

So the basic rules are

Always make sure you have a ready supply of bags for picking up after your dog...(Nappy sacks are ideal and cheap)

Take a torch with you for early morning or night-time walks

Always make sure you bag it and bin it

Just because you and your dog are in an open space does not mean you don't need to clear up...if necessary follow National Trust guidelines

Let's make Comberton a responsible dog-owner village!




