

Let us lighten your load

From Rev David Newton - Flourishing

I'm not entirely sure when 'wellbeing' entered our vocabulary, but in recent years it has become a popular notion.

Schools are talking seriously about the wellbeing of staff and students alike; classes are being designed to foster greater wellbeing, in part to counter a perceived loss of the stuff amongst children and adolescents. My wife was head of Enrichment and Personal Development at her previous school and 'wellbeing' was central to what this was all about.

Personally, I'm a fan of this new semantic fashion. It seems like a wholistic kind of word – more than health or happiness even – it brings within its sphere social, spiritual, physical, and psychological aspects. And thinking about whether our culture is enabling or hindering the wellbeing of children and adults alike can only be a good thing.

I heard on the radio the other day someone talking about basic psychological needs we have as humans. She listed them as: competence, autonomy and relatedness. These she suggested are the foundations of wellbeing: feeling like we're good at something, being able to make decisions and do things for ourselves, and having regular social interaction with people who know us.

These goods, she went on, were far more influential to our happiness – or wellbeing – than any material goods we might pine after. On reflection, it seems to me that these foundations of wellbeing are all being hacked away at a little in contemporary society, and we would do well to sit up and think about how we can better foster these psychological goods in our communities.

In many ways the Christian Faith is centred on wellbeing – or 'human flourishing'. At its best it asks the question of what it means to and how we might flourish as humans, and then sets about making that flourishing a reality.

Like all human institutions the church usually fails to live up to its own vision, but my prayer is that the church might play its role in talking about what wellbeing is all about, and doing its bit – alongside others – to help foster it. For living well is what Jesus set us free for.

Caring for our Church Yard

Our church yard is a very important part of our village life. It is where many of us will have laid loved ones to rest and it provides a focal point where we can come to remember and give thanks.

It carries a huge amount of history and has graves that go back centuries. It also has a long future and needs to be well maintained so that it continues to be a sacred space for the whole community for centuries to come. For this reason, the church yard is regulated by rules set by the diocese, which were updated significantly in November 2017.

These govern the kind of monuments allowed, and the forms of inscription. Details can be gained from a good stone mason or from Rev. David Newton.

They also regulate what is allowed on, or around, a grave or a memorial for cremated remains. This is because the grave space continues to belong to the churchyard and it continues – for centuries to come – to be under the care of the church council and the vicar.

What can be placed on or around a grave

So, we wanted to take this opportunity to remind, or let you know, what is permitted, and what is not.

No trees or shrubs may be planted without 'a faculty' (a special license from the diocese); bulbs are welcome. We recognise that in the past many things have been planted on graves and that such plants may be greatly treasured. We will therefore not be asking these to be removed, but nothing that breaks the regulations should be planted from now onwards.

No artificial flowers are allowed, except Remembrance Day poppies and Christmas Wreaths, and these must be removed within 2 months. No lighting is permitted.

Cut flowers are welcome but should be removed when withered. Vases are permitted, but only where provision has been made for them in the base of the memorial stone. For the sake of those who mow, please do not put anything in glass. Finally, toys or similar objects are permitted where appropriate, for up to 12 months following a





FOSM Chairman's Short Report

In January 2018 the FOSM Trust was granted Charity Status (N0.1176591)

Mark McKeown agreed to produce two Pop-up publicity banners. Collaborating with Impulsepop we converted our pictorial "Restoration Phase One-Urgent" chart and our "Village Listed Buildings 3-D model" into suitable form. Thank you, Mark.

In April we enlarged our leading group by appointing Brian McCabe Trustee (confirmed by EGM), Margaret Hardy as minute secretary and Sandra Hyde as Sage! Paul Hardy agreed to be Ticket Master.

After instruction by the PCC, Purcells took their Quinquennial Inspection Report (QIR 2014) and created a Specification for the urgent work which then went out to Tender. The Herringbone quote for £52,000 was accepted.

Our estimate from QIR 2014 had given FOSM a figure of approximately £26,000 which, added to the cost of lead theft, made our fund raising target £35,000 over 6 years. Restoration work was begun in July 2018 and signed off at the end of September.

A final sum of £46,389 was paid, of which the Church Commissioners paid 40%. ChurchCare gave £3,000 and FOSM contributed £14,000.

The PCC makes an annual payment to the Diocese for its part of the Lordsbridge Team 'Ministry Share', ie clergy salaries. They have very little left over for other costs.

In 2017 Malcolm Wright led appeals to various Trusts for Grants. Through Jane Hughes we obtained a grant from the Ridgeon Family Trust.

On-line applications in 2018 were time consuming. It became clear that successful applicants must demonstrate how the Community will benefit. SCDC awarded the PCC a grant of £1000 from the Community Chest. By October 2018 the FOSM had raised over £20,000 in 2 years.

At the October Trustees meeting we agreed that we should be involved in the proposal to improve Disabled Access into Church (Community Benefit). This limited work would also involve Churchyard wall repairs on the Northwest corner.

An appropriate record of all our Donations so far is under discussion

The Quinquennial Inspection is expected in 2019. This will pick up on restoration of the perimeter churchyard wall and the external ironwork (QIR 2014 9.3)

The Nave roof still leaks onto the pews. I have been told unofficially that restoration, with new lead replacing 100 year old lead, could cost £60-£70K.

In 2018 3 pieces were submitted to Contact, and we organised and advertised 4 events in 5 months. These were Song Cycle in April, Bedford Gallery Quire Workshop in June, Open Gardens in July and Accord in October. Also in October, Village Voices held a concert in St.Mary's, which included the Meridian School Choir. They donated 50% of their fundraise to the FOSM. Thank you, Village Voices.

In September Malcolm Wright switched from FOSM fundraising to helping raise funds for the 20th Anniversary of Comberton Twinning Association. We thank him enormously and wish him every success.

St. Mary's Church Organ was dedicated on 1st August 1919 as our Village War Memorial. Chris Westgarth and Jane Hughes have worked on the funding for the Organ Restoration. Work should commence this month and be completed by Easter. What fun to have an Organ Recital and other events for fundraising this coming summer and autumn!

I shall be sad to step down as Chairman of FOSM on 10th January 2019 but it is good to know we have achieved so much. The target for the next two years-£4000 per annum- is to complete the loan repayment and also to fundraise to support the PCC paying for outstanding Fabric Repair. St. Mary's Church definitely needs the Friends to continue their fund raising activities and I will remain a Trustee to give my ongoing support.

I am grateful to Richard, Godfrey, John, Brian, and also Margaret and Sandra for our work together. I am particularly grateful for the organisational and keyboard support of my wife Jane. Good luck.

vote in the House of Commons on the Withdrawal Agreement. (By the time you read this, I'm hoping it will have been and gone!)

At the end of 2018, South Cambridgeshire received some fantastic news - Addenbrooke's is to get a new children's hospital. The need for a dedicated children's hospital in our region has been talked about for longer than I have been on the scene, so it is wonderful that it will now be delivered.

The Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, confirmed that up to £100 million will be contributed by Government. We all know Addenbrooke's is a centre of excellence and this new children's hospital will enable them not only to continue to provide first class care in a new purpose built hospital but will also free up valuable space in the existing building.

Looking ahead, 2019 promises to be a big year for Addenbrooke's as the Royal Papworth Hospital moves to the site and plans for a train station pick up pace! Bringing improved infrastructure and increased funding to South Cambridgeshire are key priorities for me so I am pleased to share with you a number of recent announcements about the next financial year.

Cambridgeshire County Council received a funding boost, with an increase in core spending power of 5.7%, taking the Council's funding allocation to £386.5 million.

This increase in core spending power is more than double the average increase in England. This is a very welcome boost to spending on services in South Cambridgeshire.

The Autumn Budget also announced £6,294,319 for Cambridgeshire for adult and children's social care to help alleviate winter pressures on the NHS.

I continue to press for improved funding for our schools, and am working on a new campaign to drive the message home hard to Ministers, ahead of this year's major Government spending review.

Cambridgeshire Police have seen an increase in their funding from central Government and in addition, the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) has launched a consultation on the Police's share of Council Tax for 2019/20.
