

Centenaries in 2019 at St Mary's Church Comberton

During the summer of 1919, St. Mary's installed a hand-pumped Pipe Organ, purchased by public subscription and a 2 Guinea Donation from Jesus College. In a Service on Friday 1 August 1919, the Organ was Dedicated as a "Thanksgiving for Victory in the Great War 1914-1919 and in Memory of the Fallen". The Cambridge Independent Press (15 August) reported this event and followed with the news that on the recent Bank Holiday Monday (4 August), there had been a celebration for "Returned Soldiers". About forty Demobilised Comberton men were "entertained on the Vicarage Lawn to a meat tea, dancing and sports". Earlier, on 27 May 1919, Henry John Day had been laid to rest in St. Mary's Churchyard. John had joined the North Staffordshire Regiment and was a Prisoner of War* when the Armistice was declared. By that time, Germany was short of food and Allied PoWs were exposed to malnutrition and disease. John was not well enough to be released, but was transferred to the British Military Hospital, at Curragh in southern Ireland. He died there of Tubercular Meningitis (TB) on 22 May 1919.

The Cambridge Chronicle recorded his funeral at St. Mary's, and showed Military Volunteers bearing his coffin to the graveside. The Chronicle reported that his death was due to an "Undermined Constitution". Later, when the family had the Headstone placed, it bore a heavy inscription. As well as Henry John, they commemorated his older brothers Walter and Alfred who had served in the 11th Battalion, the Suffolks. Both brothers were killed on 1 July 1916, the first day of the Battle of the Somme. Their bodies were never found. Perhaps some of the villagers attending the celebrations took a quiet moment to stand by the grave?

Please come and join us at the Centenary Organ Rededication Service at St. Mary's on Sunday 4 August 2019, at 4p.m. There will be Organ Music before the Service and a Tea to follow! I am indebted to Angela Foreman and the Day family for research material.



Your Village Hall Needs You!

How would you like to do a valuable and rewarding job for the village? As many of you know, the village hall is at the very heart of our community life for all age groups, being the venue for many classes, functions and social activities. A very committed and capable band of volunteer trustees keeps the hall running but if you or your friends and family want to use the hall, someone needs to take the bookings and that is where you could come in.

On moving to the village over 12 years ago I was persuaded by the then-chairman to take on the role of Lettings Secretary for the hall as a way to become involved in village life and to get to know people and it has been everything he promised and more, and I have loved doing it. However, having gone from a stay-at-home mum with a part-time job to now working a 47 hour week I simply don't have the time to perform the role any longer and I resigned at the recent AGM, meaning that someone else does need to take over to ensure the continued smooth running of the hall for the enjoyment of so many people.

You would typically spend an hour or so during an average week answering phone calls and emails from potential hirers and sending booking paperwork to them, which is almost all done via email these days. Hirers will need to collect keys from you prior to their function, but that can be arranged to suit you (I ask hirers not to come at weekends, for example). You will have the backing of a friendly and supportive group of trustees and I am happy to have a lengthy handover period to settle someone new into the role. I simply am not able to continue in this role so please do give some serious consideration to whether you could do something to help the community by taking on this important, fun and sociable position. An honorarium is payable.



Heidi Allen MP Newsletter

Before I launch into my usual monthly constituency update, I thought it important to explain what has happened recently in terms of my own party allegiance. As you will know, I left the Conservative Party in February to sit as an Independent MP because I was concerned the Party had drifted to the right and it was more concerned with its own survival than the national interest. Early polling results gave us, as Independents, the confidence to formalise into a party structure. named "Change UK" to fight the European elections at the end of May. However it soon became clear that the Brexit Party was storming ahead. Believing passionately that the National interest must always come first. and that Nigel Farage did not have the right answers for the country's future. I felt our support should shift to other Remain parties who were faring better than us in the polls.

I was unable to convince a majority of Change UK MPs of this strategy and they remained steadfastly of the opinion that the party should seek to achieve as many votes for itself rather than collaborate with other parties

Now the European elections are over, I remain unwavering in my strong belief that the country must always come first. As such, I have stepped down from Change UK and returned to sit once again as an Independent with four other colleagues – Sarah Wollaston, Luciana Berger, Angela Smith and Gavin Shuker.

There are two principal reasons as to why I have done this.

I do not believe I can serve my constituents and country well if I put party interests ahead of theirs. Secondly, the political landscape remains very volatile. In the coming weeks and months I can easily envisage MPs leave the Conservative Party because they cannot tolerate a new Prime Minister who advocates a hard Brexit or no deal Brexit. Equally, there are Labour colleagues who will no longer tolerate Jeremy Corbyn's inability to fight as an opposition leader should.

Recognising that it is very difficult for MPs to leave their parties and immediately join other ones, I believe my role will be to help convene a safe neutral space in the centre ground of Parliament and offer a home for those MPs. It will allow us to work alongside the Liberal Democrats, Greens, SNP, Change UK and Plaid Cymru in the national interest, ensuring we do not crash out of the EU with no deal.


