PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 9 March 2011.

Hillfield Road damage of grass

Further to the last month's report in response to complaints about the ongoing damage to the grass in Hillfield Road the Parish Council has considered its responsibilities to protect the grass areas and therefore decided to install wooden bollards on the grassed areas to prevent vehicles mounting the kerb and damaging the grass. The installation of the bollards will take place shortly. The Council will continue to monitor the grass in other areas.

Annual Parish Meeting

Every English Parish must have a Parish Meeting. All Parish and Town Councils throughout England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting between the dates of 1st March and 1st June (inclusive). This is not a Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors.

The meeting will be held this year at 7.30pm on Weds 27 April. Come to the meeting and join in the discussions. Everyone welcome.

Is a Parish Meeting the same as a Council meeting? No. Although a Parish meeting is convened, chaired and minuted by the Parish Council, it is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors (including councillors who are registered electors).

What is the purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting? - The purpose is to enable the registered electors to discuss parish affairs and to pass resolutions there-



on. This meeting is also an opportunity for the Parish Council (and higher tiers of local government) and community group leaders to explain their activities over the last year.

Who can attend the meeting? - Anyone may attend but only registered electors in the parish may speak and vote.

Will I be able to ask questions and make resolutions? - Yes, there will be an opportunity to ask questions of any of the speakers and also any registered elector may ask questions of the Council. Where ever possible and if the information is to hand then the questions to the Council usually be answered by the Chairman or by the Parish Clerk or a designated Councillor. Sometimes it is necessary to make enquiries after the meeting or refer the question to the Parish Council or someone else for an answer. If you have a question please send it to the Clerk as far in advance of the meeting if at all possible. An elector may also make suggestions and comment on parish issues and propose resolutions at the meeting. Resolutions relating to allotments are legally binding but all others are persuasive only, but will be considered by the Parish Council at their meetings.

Who will chair the meeting? – The Chairman of the Parish Council must chair the meeting, if present. In his absence the vice chairman must preside if present. If neither is able to attend, then the meeting will elect a chairman from those electors present.

Will Parish Councillors be there? – Although there is no compulsion, Councillors normally attend. They will speak if required, but the purpose of the meeting is to enable the ordinary electors to have their say. Councillors will listen with interest and as electors themselves, also have the opportunity to raise questions and make comments if they wish.

Will notes be taken of the meeting? - Yes, a written record of the meeting will be taken by the Parish Clerk kept in a special book. The rules on the signature and admissibility of minutes are the same as those for Parish Council meetings.

How long will the meeting last? - As long as need be within reason but this is at the Chairman's discretion. It really depends on those present and the number of questions and the discussion that is raised. Generally, the meeting will last no longer than 2 hours.

Will the Press be there? - A table will be provided for the local press as the Council do for all their public meetings.

Councillors have **three** main components to their work.

Decision Making

Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support and where money should be spent locally.

Monitoring

By keeping an *eye* on how well things are working councillors make sure their decisions lead to efficient and effective services.

Getting Involved Locally

Councillors, as local representatives, have responsibilities towards local people and organisations.

Effort required:

TIME - As with most things, the more you put in, the more you (and your community) will get out.

The Council employs a Clerk to support the Council in its work both at meetings and also between meetings.

Comberton Parish Council meets each month on the second Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

All members are encouraged to take on an area of responsibility to help share the workload and to ensure that the Council maximises its efficiency. The Council has one committee (Planning) and several working groups which offer members a chance to use their skills and knowledge for maximum benefit or to review a matter in more depth before a decision is reached. Sometimes these Committees or Working Groups will meet in between the meetings of the full Parish Council.

COST - Being a Councillor should cost you little. There is usually cover for subsistence and travel allowances if your duties take you out of your local Council's area. These allowances will be within a maximum laid down by the Government.

OK so you're ready!

Having decided that you want to be a councillor there's three things that need to be done

1. You need to **Qualify**
2. You need to complete **Nomination Papers**
3. You need to **Stand for Election.**

To Qualify You need

to be:

- (a) a British or EU national citizen
- (b) 18 years of age
- (a) free of either a criminal record or bankruptcy
- (c) on the list of electors for that Parish

or during the whole of the preceding twelve months have either

- (i) occupied land as owner or tenant within the Parish.

- (i) lived within three miles of the Parish boundary

The Nomination Process

You must obtain from and when completed return to the Returning Officer a valid Nomination Paper containing details of your name and address plus your number and prefix letter from the current register of electors.

The Returning Officer has this information and the Clerk of the local council also normally has a copy if you need to double check your details.

The nomination paper must also contain similar particulars of a Proposer and a Secunder from the same Parish.

The Election Procedure

Ordinary elections of local councillors take place on the first Thursday in May every four years.

FOR COMBERTON PARISH COUNCIL 2011 IS AN ELECTION YEAR.

The next Parish Council Elections are held on 5th May 2011.

Nomination papers need to be lodged by noon 4th April 2011.

The responsibility falls on **YOU** to make sure you complete the paperwork and get it in on time to the Returning Officer.

However you will find the Parish Clerk extremely helpful and she will generally give you guidance if you are new to the process.

Ask the Clerk at the Council how you can obtain a pack of information on standing as a councillor in the next local elections.

THE WAGER

Shortly before Christmas, a good of friend of mine and I bet a bottle of a fine single malt whiskey. We made our wager because I think the world is going to get warmer due to Climate Change over next ten years than it was over the previous 10 years, but he insists it will not.

I am prepared to risk something as precious as a bottle of single malt because I am persuaded that we are all risking lot more. Our globalised industrial life-style has created a perfect storm of climate change, the end of growth in resource extraction and the economic decline of western democracies.

Writing as a Christian within a Baptist church, I cannot ignore our own contribution. It was an English Baptist lay preacher like myself, Thomas Newcomen, who in 1710 invented the first steam engine that operated by a piston moving in a cylinder.

The steam engine was fired by coal and was used to pump water out of coal mines, enabling coal production to greatly increase in 18th century England. Today, the world emits 4,000 times the amount of carbon dioxide from fossil fuel burning that Britain did in Newcomen's day, much of it coming from steam power plants that generate electricity.

Burning coal and other fossil fuels must decline greatly in this century: these fuels are getting harder to extract and we have to stop putting all that carbon dioxide into the air. This means that electricity and running cars will get a lot more expensive, which means we will not be able to afford to use these nearly as much.

This means our lives will have to change. Central heating, cars and electrical appliances may become rarities. We will have to live simpler lives. Some would say poorer, but if we could organise ourselves so we don't actually need these things, then are we really poorer or are we just living more simply?

Why am I writing about this as a church person in a village magazine? I have two reasons.

First, Christ encourages us to live meeker, simpler lives. I feel we could do well to embrace His message as a positive aspiration rather than dismiss it negatively as a hair-shirt, spoil-sport, condemnation of living well.

Second, we will need to pull together to make the changes needed, because it won't be easy. Villages like ours are likely to regain their economic role as a centre to work in, not just to live in, but increasingly we will need to look out for one another as these changes accelerate.

Comberton Baptist Church is keen to do what we can to contribute to this transition in the village, even though it may take a lifetime to accomplish. We have a few ideas on how things could be developed, but of course ideas on their own don't solve problems, people working together do. If you are interested in exploring this further, do please contact us via our website.

thority have now become subscription services. However, the budgets we are given have not increased to take this into account. This means that every school, however big or small, has to make some very hard decisions – do we buy in this service, or that one? Because, perhaps, we can no longer afford both, it seems to come down to -- what can we possibly 'do without'? It is very painful to be put in the position of choosing between services which in the past we have valued equally highly.

It is at times like these that I particularly value the support of Network 11. As I think I have mentioned before, this is an informal partnership of Comberton Village College and its ten feeder primary schools. We employ a co-ordinator who arranges an enormous number of joint events for children, focus groups for staff, as well as meetings for Heads and Chairs of Governors. As Heads, we have a dedicated Network 11 meeting for a whole morning each half term. It is there that we discuss how we can best work together for the good of all our children – and how we can support each other.

At the moment, those discussions are very much about opportunities for sharing resources, expertise and experience to mitigate the effects of the reduction in services. The government has made it clear that partnership is the way forward for schools and we feel very much vindicated in our decision to set up Network 11 about two years ago.

On a lighter note the Network 11 Year 3 singing event at CVC recently was a great success, with parents enjoying a performance of a wide range of songs sung by Year 3 children from various schools. Coaching workshops had previously been held by CVC students in the primary schools, offering great role models to the younger children. Also, by the time you read this, all the Year 6 children will have taken part in a Network 11 Careers Convention hosted by St John's College, Cambridge, where they will be introduced to a number of future career opportunities and asked to think about their own talents and enthusiasms.

Network 11 offers so much to all of the eleven schools involved – to the children and young people, to the staff, the governors and, not least, to the Heads.



Fertiliser

This is the time to feed and weed (preferably in that order).

The fertiliser is predominately Nitrogen in a slow release form, but it may also need Phosphate and Potassium as well as vital trace elements.

Weed Control

Once the weeds and grass are actively growing a selective herbicide to kill broad leaved weeds such as dandelions, daisies and clover within the grass can be applied.

Actions required in Early Spring

- Mow lawn at least once per week.
- Treat Moss
- Apply Spring Feed
- Spray Weeds in lawn with Selective Herbicide
- Seed any bare areas and cover with turf dressing (water if dry)

Some of the above tasks can be carried out by the lawn owner, other tasks may need some professional intervention.

ADDING COLOUR WITH ANNUALS

Level gardens are usually given a structure by trees and shrubs. Perennials are used to provide a constant source of favourite plants in fixed positions in the garden. However, most gardens have patches that may have been occupied by spring flowering bulbs. The question is what to do with those areas when the bulbs have died back after spring. These are excellent places for overplanting with annuals. Annuals provide good blocks of summer colour within a garden.

Formal or blocks

Formal planting makes use of regular geometric patterns; this method is exemplified by alternate planting of two contrasting plants, for example bright red geraniums with their zonal patterned leaves together with silver-leaved cinerarias. This formality can work well with municipal planting, but often looks a little out of place in a garden with a free-flowing structure. The big advantage of block planting is that formality is lost; the blocks can be irregular in shape, or wind between perennials. This is why they do well for overplanting bulbs.

Annuals last one season only. There are two reasons for this: the plants may be monocarpic and die soon after producing their seeds, or they may be frost tender. It is this latter group, flowering throughout the summer, that is most valuable in the garden. Annuals are either sown from seed, often under glass, in spring, or bought as small plants ready for bedding out as soon as frosts are over.

Annuals to try

Corn flowers with their true blue flowers make a splendid display and are good for cutting for flower arrangements. There are also some mixed pink, mauve and white shades available. Small plants for the front of a border could be the blue ageratum with frothy flowers and attractive to bees or lobelia with a variety of shades of blue. Both work well against the edge of the lawn. Larkspurs are larger and make a good show with red, pink, blue or white varieties; these do well when planted in adjacent blocks. I particularly like the pastel shades of Love-in-a-mist; they add a gentleness to the planting. Calendulas, which include many types of marigolds, give depth to yellow/orange shades. Cosmos provide large red, pink or white flowers and have finely traced leaves; their height makes them suitable for positions further from the front of the border.

Local gardens to see in April

10th April, eight gardens in Barton are open; one of them is an attractive 6-garden site known as the Six Houses which were built for retired gardeners. Trinity Hall Wychfield site (off Storeys Way) is a mixed site of a large Edwardian garden adjacent to the modern gardens of their new buildings. 17th April, Churchill College gardens are open.
