#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 14 March 2012.

#### South Cambridgeshire District Council Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLĂA)

South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC) is assessing the need for housing in the district for the period 2017-2031. Last year it invited landowners and developers to put land forward as possible sites for development in the future. SCDC is considering all the sites that were put forward and will publish an "Issues and Options" paper detailing the most suitable sites in Summer 2012. It will consult on this. Several of these sites are in Comberton. At the meeting the Parish Council formed its position on development in the village. The Parish Council took the view that in principal it was against development of more than the eight dwellings per site that are currently permitted under the "Group Village" designation. The sites currently under consideration by SCDC are -

- Land adjoining (north) to 69 Long Road, Comberton (Site 004) •
- 40 48 West Street, Comberton (Site 079)
- 50 54 West Street, Comberton (Site 080) .
- Land to the rear of 42 Swaynes Lane, Comberton (Site 087)
- Land south and east of 42 Swaynes Lane, Comberton (Site 088)
- Land to the west of Birdlines, Manor Farm, Comberton (Site 110)
- Land off Long Road (south of Branch Road), Comberton (Site 158)
- Land at Green End, Comberton (Site 181)
- Land to the East of Bush Close, Comberton (Site 255)



#### Annual Parish Meeting

Every English Parish must have a Parish Meeting. All Parish and Town Councils throughout England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting between the dates of 1st March and 1st June (inclusive). This is not a Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors. The meeting will be held this year at 7.30pm on Weds 23rd May Come to the meeting and join in the discussions. Everyone welcome. Is a Parish Meeting the same as a Council meeting? No. Although a Parish meeting is convened, chaired and minuted by the Parish Council, it is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors (including councillors who are registered electors).

- What is the purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting? The purpose is to
- enable the registered electors to discuss parish affairs and to pass resolutions thereon. This meeting is also an opportunity for the Parish Council (and higher tiers of local government) and community group leaders to explain their activities over the last year.
- Who can attend the meeting? Anyone may attend but only registered electors in the parish may speak and vote.
- Will I be able to ask questions and make resolutions? Yes, there will be an opportunity to ask questions of any of the speakers and also any registered elector may ask questions of the Council. Where ever possible and if the information is to hand then the questions to the Council usually be answered by the Chairman or by the Parish Clerk or a designated Councillor. Sometimes it is necessary to make enquiries after the meeting or refer the question to the Parish Council or someone else for an answer. If you have a question please send it to the Clerk as far in advance of the meeting if at all possible. An elector may also make suggestions and comment on parish issues and propose resolutions at the meeting. Resolutions relating to allotments are legally binding but all others are persuasive only, but will be considered by the Parish Council at their meetings.
- Who will chair the meeting? The Chairman of the Parish Council must chair the meeting, if present. In his absence the vice chairman must preside if present. If neither is able to attend, then the meeting will elect a chairman from those electors present.
- Will Parish Councillors be there? Although there is no compulsion, Councillors normally attend. They will speak if required, but the purpose of the meeting is to enable the ordinary electors to have their say. Councillors will listen with interest and as electors themselves, also have the opportunity to raise questions and make comments if they wish.
- Will notes be taken of the meeting? Yes, a written record of the meeting will be taken by the Parish Clerk kept in a special book. The rules on the signature and admissibility of minutes are the same as those for Parish Council meetings.
- How long will the meeting last? As long as need be within reason but this is at the Chairman's discretion It really depends on those present and the number of questions and the discussion that is raised. Generally, the meeting will last no longer than 2.5 hours.

Each year in the autumn in Contact the Parish Council invites applications for grants from village groups and organisations. At its next meeting the Parish Council will be considering applications from: St Mary's Church £750 (church-yard upkeep) and Comberton Scouts approx £800 (half the cost of the annual fireworks). Also it will consider requests from Cambs County Council Summer Reading Challenge, Victim Support (ongoing development of work and support of peoplein local community whose lives have been affected by crime), The Police Shrievalty Trust (work improving the security of the homes of elderly, vulnerable or disabled people) *Friday night late night bus service* 

Cllrs Harangozo reported that the District Council would not support this and so alternative funding would have to be found. This is to be an agenda item for the Parish Council's April meeting. If you have any views on this please take the time to write to the Parish Council and Whelan arrange a joint village meeting to discuss the proposed withdrawal of the Friday night bus to Cambridge. The Parish Council has agreed, if supported by enough of the other local villages, to apply for a Community chest Grant towards the cost of keeping the bus running. For more information please contact Cllr Harangozo. *Recreation ground* 

The Parish Council received a report from its Recreation Ground Working Group (RWG) and also a report on a meeting with representatives from the Football Association and correspondence from the Football Clubs. The Parish Council remains committed to seeking advice and developing the recreation ground extension in a responsible way for the benefit of all. There is a clear indication that this is a feasible and exciting project. It was agreed that the RWG should prepare a project plan to extend and improve the pavilion and that the Parish Council would appoint an architect. Consideration of whether a new recreation ground gate and also if chicanes should be installed on the safer routes to school path was deferred to a future meeting. Work to extend the recreation ground car park is due to commence on 16<sup>th</sup> April and is expected to take approximately 3 weeks. The Parish Council is trying to arrange alternative parking for the sports clubs, recreation ground users and also the Connections Bus which visits on a Tuesday evening. The Council urges everyone not to park in Hines Lane whilst work is taking place. *Parish Council contact details*

#### **The Bride Price**

Of all the parables and metaphors that Jesus Christ used to communicate his message about the relationship that was possible between God and individual human beings, the one he used most often was the picture of a betrothal and a wedding. In his day, a young man would visit the father of the girl and offer him the bride price. If that were settled, then the young man would go to the girl and make the proposal in the course of the evening by pouring a cup of wine and offering it to her. If she took the cup and drank from it, she was saying 'yes'. The man would then say, 'I go to prepare a place for you.' He would then leave and go and build their new house, generally an extension onto the family home.

#### NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All

One of the many joys of working in a primary school is watching children's growing independence as they progress throughout the school. For some of our Reception children just coming to school all day, every day, can prove a bit of a challenge at first but by the time they reach Year 6 (the top class) our eleven-year-olds are more than ready for the move to secondary school.

Some of this increased confidence comes naturally, of course, but a lot of it is carefully encouraged and extended by the staff. School trips are a good example. In the Reception class our children's first trip is a village walk, usually culminating in a visit to Watts Wood, to look at signs of the season, for example. It's a long walk if you're only four and can be quite an adventure. Later in the year they may make a short trip into Cambridge – to the Folk Museum, perhaps. Mr Spicer, our Reception class teacher, always says that the coach ride itself is clearly a real highlight for many, never mind the exciting things they went to see!

By the time they reach Years 1 and 2 the children are able to go a little



further and spend a few hours out of school. Just recently the children in these year groups went to Amey Cespa, which is a recycling facility near Waterbeach. It fitted in perfectly with their new curriculum theme called 'Plastic Fantastic' and they clearly had a 'fantastic' time.

As the children travel up the school, trips become more demanding. For the last two years, for example, we have taken the whole of Key Stage 2 (the juniors) to the Corn Exchange to watch a full production by Shakespeare4Kidz of an adapted Shakespeare play. For some, this will be their first experience of going to a theatre.

It is in Year 5, when the children are 9 and 10 years old, that the most challenging trip of all takes place. This is their first residential visit when they spend Monday to Friday at Hilltop Outdoor Centre in Norfolk. The activities are led by fully trained instructors and are designed to promote teamwork, challenge fears and, of course, provide lots of fun! The children climb up things, swing off things, ride mountain bikes, go rock-pooling and generally have a wonderfultime. This year's Year 5 are due to go shortly after the Easter break and past experience tells us that they will come back full of boundless energy and confidence. The staff will come back tired! #### DEAR CONTACT

As a Comberton resident I was disappointed to see that the parish council have planted a large number of trees on the recreation ground extension, an area which was purchased for the provision of playing fields. In the recent parish questionnaire tabling the responses of 359 households, the greatest number of respondents (117) said they wanted to see provision for football, with the next largest response of 94 people wanting provision for cricket. I am very disappointed that the parish council is clearly not listening to the people of the village and furthermore is refusing to enter into open and honest discussions with its residents. I have attended a couple of the parish council meetings where Comberton Crusaders have been attempting to work with the parish council to move this project forward, and was shocked to learn that there is a restrictive covenant on the recreation ground extension banning the planting of trees. When asked to explain how they were intending to get round this issue, the parish council declared that they were (and I quote) "not prepared to discuss the covenants" with the public and when they did realise they had to confront the issue at the end of their meeting in December, they ejected the public and took confidential minutes to which the public are not allowed access. I can only assume that the parish council has chosen to either ignore, breach or have overturned this covenant, which leads me as a resident to have no faith that they won't do the same with the covenant restricting the construction of buildings on this land, which would in my opinion be far worse for the village than a bit of grass. It saddens me that our parish council, who are supposed to be working in the **public** interest, on land purchased for the village with our money, refuse to engage in open and honest discussions with the residents. I for one applaud Comberton Crusaders for being "vociferous" enough to voice their willingness to offer what must be a considerable amount of knowledge and hard work to get funding for, and progress made with, this land, something that no other individual or group has done. I do hope that those who speak out so forcefully against the football club will be as keen to offer their time and hard work to see this land turned into a useful space that the whole community can use, rather than leaving it as a very expensive piece A Comberton resident of wasteland being paid for with our money.

#### DEAR CONTACT

I write to let residents know that Comberton Crusaders and myself are no longer seeking to work with the Parish Council to develop the recreation ground extension into grassed areas for football pitches. The PC have gone ahead and planted a third of the area with trees, thereby compromising any development project, demonstrating its unwillingness to pursue a flexible and fully-consultative solution and renegeing on its original 2005 commitment to utilise this land in full for playing fields. I no longer have any confidence that a development project can succeed for the following reasons:

- This tree planting has now precluded the only practical drainage solution by cutting off access to the drainage ditch.
- The space now left for football pitches is too small to allow the number and flexibility of pitch layouts that Comberton Crusaders need for our children's teams. Furthermore, the area is too small to allow other sports facilities, in addition to football, that other clubs and interests in the village might have wanted.
- The PC have no strategy for extending car parking provision, having left insufficient room for any flexibility of use of either the rec or rec extension that could have helped to achieve the additional parking that will be required if further pitches are created.
- The PC refuse to discuss with us or with any of the community the issue of the restrictive covenant on the land which disallows the planting of trees, leading us to believe that they may have now opened themselves up to the possibility of legal action, something with which Comberton Crusaders cannot be associated.

Without additional facilities in this village, Comberton Crusaders will continue to have 10 of its 13 teams play in Barton, Bourn, Caldecote and Eversden, with the associated environmental impact of 50 odd children being ferried out of the village for their matches. We will continue to pay other Parish Councils thousands of pounds a year in pitch hire fees, money that could have been coming to Comberton PC to help offset the £64,000 investment of public money in this land, and Comberton will continue to have a shocking shortage of sports facilities for the size of the population. The children of Comberton have been let down: the wood will not benefit any of this generation as it will be 50 to 100 years before these trees can be climbed, swung in or otherwise enjoyed actively – and it is active outdoor activities that the children want. This was not the place for an ecological project - the PC should be seeking to improve access to what we already have - ie Watts Wood and other areas where mature trees are already growing. As a secretary of a youth football club, my responsibility is to ensure good quality facilities for the 200 local children registered with our club and that will continue to be my focus. 

DOGS



Dogs are very much welcomed into the village; however we do ask that their owners behave responsibly. Apart from the obvious unpleasantness when we tread in dog excrement, there are some serious health issues, so picking up after our dogs is not a choice

it's a responsibility. (Failure to do so can result in a pretty hefty fine). There are numerous dog waste bins around the village and we ask that dog owners 'bag it and bin it'. On public footpaths and byways where a bin is not so readily available we ask that owners follow National Trust guidelines and use a stick to remove the excrement from the pathway. On the recreation ground, dog

owners are also required to keep their dog under control (this includes the recreation ground extension) and away from the children's play equipment. (And of course use one of the 3 bins sited on the rec).

The hedgerows will have started their blossoms; particularly good are the Blackthorns with their white flowers all the way down their branches, looking like a snow fall. In gardens Magnolias will be in blossom; I am always stunned by their profusion. The old favourite *Clematis montana* will be at its best. This clematis has either white or pink flowers. There are some interesting new varieties *C. montana* 'Freda' has deep pink flowers, there are also some double varieties to look out for; 'Jacqui' is a double white with pinkish tips to the petals, the deepest double pink is 'Rosebud'.

Showy shrubs. Camellias are my favourite flowering shrub and are at their best this month. Although they are lime haters and do badly in Comberton soil, they will grow very well in large pots containing lime-free ericaceous compost. They need watering with natural rain water and special liquid feeding occasionally during the summer months. Rhododendrons are also brilliant shrubs for a large variety of different colours. Although most are intolerant of lime in the soil, there are now some that have been bred that are able to grow in our soil, these are the Inkarho rhododendrons and are worth a try. I would like to plant one this year.

**Fritillaries.** Good plants for a limey soil are the fritillaries. *F. Imperialis* is the very tall species that is available in yellow and orange. They look good in a clump of a dozen or so. But don't forget the little snakeshead lily *F. meleagris;* this grows nicely through a grassy area that does not need cutting until the plants have died back.

**Local gardens to see in April:** 1<sup>st</sup> April, eight gardens in Barton are open; one of them is an attractive 6-garden site known as the Six Houses which were built for retired gardeners. Trinity Hall Wychfield site (off Storeys Way) is a mixed site of a large beautifully structured Edwardian garden adjacent to the modern gardens of their new buildings. This garden is also open 1<sup>st</sup> April. R.T. Choke
