PARISH COUNCIL REPORT from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 13th February 2013

LDF Local Green Spaces

The Government's National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) has created a new designation called a 'Local Green Space', which allows local communities to identify important sites and rule out new development other than in very special circumstances, rather like the Green Belt. These sites could be identified in Local Plans. Comberton Parish Council has submitted for this designation the green lung through the village (south of the recreation ground running north and south of Barton Road) and also the allotments site in South Street, the allotment site in Long Road and Watts Wood.

Comberton Playground Project request for formal agreement with the Parish Council In consideration for receiving funds from the Comberton Playground Project, Comberton Parish Council agreed to use any funds received solely for the purchase and installation of playground equipment of a nature agreed with Comberton Playground Project. *Connection Bus*

The Bus' visits from 1st April will be on a Wednesday at 7pm.

It was noted that the recent questionnaires completed by village residents had not as yet been analysed by the County Council and further meetings will take place in the forthcoming months. *Vacancy on the Council*

The Parish Council still has one vacancy. If you are interesting in joining the Council please contact the Clerk or speak to any of the Council's members.

Annual Parish Meeting

Every English Parish must have a Parish Meeting. All Parish and Town Councils throughout England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting between the dates of 1st March and 1st June(inclusive). This is not a Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors. The meeting will be held this vear at 7.30pm on Weds 22nd May. Come to the meeting and join in the discussions. Everyone welcome. Is a Parish Meeting the same as a Council meeting? No. Although a Parish meeting is convened, chaired and minuted by the Parish Council, it is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting of registered electors (including councillors who are registered electors). What is the purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting? - The purpose is to enable the registered electors to discuss parish affairs and to pass resolutions thereon. This meeting is also an opportunity for the Parish Council (and higher tiers of local government) and community group leaders to explain their activities over year. the last Who can attend the meeting? - Anyone may attend but only registered electors in the parish may speak and vote.

Will I be able to ask questions and make resolutions? - Yes, there will be an opportunity to ask questions of any of the speakers and also any registered elector may ask questions of the Council. Where ever possible and if the information is to hand then the questions to the Council usually be answered by the Chairman or by the Parish Clerk or a designated Councillor. Sometimes it is necessary to make enquiries after the meeting or refer the question to the Parish Council or someone else for an answer. If you have a question please send it to the Clerk as far in advance of the meeting if at all possible. An elector may also make suggestions and comment on parish issues and propose resolutions at the meeting. Resolutions relating to allotments are legally binding but all others are persuasive only, but will be considered by the Parish Council at their meetings. Who will chair the meeting? - The Chairman of the Parish Council must chair the meeting, if present. In his absence the vice chairman must preside if present. If neither is able to attend, then the meeting will elect a chairman from those electors present. Will Parish Councillors be there? - Although there is no compulsion, Councillors normally attend. They will speak if required, but the purpose of the meeting is to enable the ordinary electors to have their say. Councillors will listen with interest and as electors themselves, also have the opportunity thev to raise questions and make comments if wish. Will notes be taken of the meeting? - Yes, a written record of the meeting will be taken by the

WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT IT WAS BECAUSE OF THE FOUNDATIONS?

The property near ours started to develop cracks in the walls. At first they did not seems so bad. But as the years went on, they become wider and more numerous. First one wall developed a crack and then another. The cracks appeared at the top of the wall, and ran down as far as first floor, and then down to the bottom floor door or window. Thinking it was only a problem with the walls, workman filled with cracks on the outside with mortar. On the inside, the cracks were filled with the finest Polyfilla and duly papered over. Only the cracks kept on coming and kept getting worse. Eventually, the engineer was called in. "It's your foundations," he announced. "They need underpinning and the ground needs to be stopped from moving away from under the walls." Well, this sounded rather too radical for the neighbours, who were not accustomed to making such a large commitment. They worried about the implications. "It will cause a lot of disturbance," the lady of the house said. "I have other things to do that are more important. I don't think the engineer is right. He doesn't live here." the man of the house said. "The problem is just in walls, not the foundations." So, they went back to filling in the cracks on the outside and papering them over on the inside. Only now they have to do this more and more frequently, and the results are more and more unsatisfactory. Recently the insurers downgraded the house from AAA to AA1, because the risks were rising that the house could collapse. The couple realised that just mortar, paper and finest Polyfilla were not enough. Unfortunately, it was so long ago that the engineer gave them his report, they have since lost it. They still don't want to fix the foundations, so now every night they go to bed and worry

NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge

Excellence for All

Under the previous government there was a requirement placed on schools to help develop ' community cohesion'. The idea was that schools could play a major part in creating harmony and preventing discord in their communities by reaching out beyond the school gates. `Community cohesion' was even part of the previous Of sted in spection arrangements. Under the presentgovernment this focus appears to have lost its high profile and is certainly no longer part of the inspection schedule. However, I must say that I rather mourn its passing. It certainly made me think hard about how we engage with the local community and gave birth to a few initiatives which we still continue. My regular monthly piece in this magazine, and those of Toft and the Eversdens, is just one of those initiatives! I thought you might like to hear about some of the other ways in which we engage with the local community. For example, we have a small choir at school who meet on a Monday lunchtime and a piece of news which always makes them very excited is that they are going to sing at Home Meadow. We generally take them down in a minibus (loaned by Comberton Village College - another great link!) and they sing to the residents there and have a chat. Both the children and the residents love it. We are also currently strengthening our links with Comberton Playgroup. We are planning more visits (in both directions) and some joint events too. I personally like to represent the school whenever possible. For example, I have had the rather difficult task, for several years now, of helping to judge the Christmas tree competition at the church in Toft. Not easy, I assure you! Also at Christmas, I always like to do a reading at the carol service at St Mary's, Comberton. Just last month, I enjoyed talking to the Friendship Club about Meridian and what special things it has to offer. We are fortunate in having a relatively large school hall for a primary school, and this is let out every evening for at least one (sometimes two) evening classes. We also let out some classrooms every Saturday for 'Dutch school' which is an organisation run from the Netherlands to support children who are bilingual in Dutch and English to keep their Dutch at a good level. Community cohesion goes further than thinking just about our own villages, however. Our children will be global citizens and we need to prepare them for that. As I write we are getting ready for Red Nose Day and I have just shown the children a film about a little boy who lives in a shanty town in Nairobi. They were visibly shocked by the conditions under which he lived. The fun of Red Nose Day will, I hope, have a greater significance for them now they have seen the face of real poverty.
