PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 9 November 2011.

Recreation Ground Land extension request to lease and Jubilee Wood

It was a lively start to the meeting. 25 members of the public attended; many from the Comberton Crusaders to express their views on the Parish Council's recent decision to plant a Jubilee Wood on the recreation ground extension and the impact that this would have on their request to lease the whole of the land extension and the number of pitches that they would wish to see developed on the land.

Some other residents expressed alternative views about how the land should be used such as for other forms of recreation and not just sport pitches and also the cost implications of running the recreation ground, pavilion and facilities. The Parish Council has asked its Recreation ground Working Group and Tree Group to meet with representatives from the Comberton Crusaders to see if there is a compromise.

Hillfield Road proposed bollards and meeting with Cambs County Council (CCC) A report on a site meeting with the County Council was considered. It has been agreed to undertake further consultation with the residents of Hillfield Road as follows –

asking them if they wish to get together to pursue any of the options detailed in the report at their own cost;

pointing out that they will not own any spaces even if they pay for it or contribute towards them;

pointing out that if they fail to choose any of these and continue parking on and thereby damaging the verges, then the CPC will have no choice but to install bollards as previously agreed;

enclosing a copy of CCC's Highway's specification for construction of highways which contains a list of approved contractors who can be contacted for quotations for the works;

The deadline for responses and or proposals from the residents will be end of January 2012. If any other resident in the village wishes to comment on this matter please contact the Clerk.

Proposed Barton Road speed reduction from the Long Road roundabout towards Barton –

The Parish Council is looking to implement a 40 mph buffer zone for about 650 meters as the County Council's policy is now permitting parish councils to do this if they pay for it. The estimated cost for the provision of new signs and posts as well as the Parish Council's contribution to advertising in the

Cambridge News the public notices associated with the change in speed limit is estimated at £1800. The process for implementing speed limit changes that takes approximately 3 to 4 months to complete. The first stage of this is for the Parish Council to carry out local consultation to establish the level of support

He is happy to be involved in a Consultation. The purpose of the public consultation is to seek the views of residents, take into account the housing need in the village and make an informed decision. If you are interested or want to know what is being proposed then please take time to look the notice board where, when arranged the consultation information will be published and attend Council meetings.

Flower beds at the Crossroads

The contract for maintenance of the flower beds has been extended as the beds are looking really nice and well tended.

Routing of services for The Valley Development across/under Parish Council land and impact on the trees on the green adjacent to 21-59 The Valley

Services are to be laid under this land and as a result one tree, a silver birch, will have to be removed. The developer will replace this with a tree of the Parish Council's choice. The advice of a tree surgeon is being obtained on one other tree in this area.

Millner Road trees

The advice of a tree surgeon is being obtained on the condition of a silver birch and some lime trees and depending on the outcome work on these trees may be undertaken.

Proposals Plan - Inspector's Report now published

Cambridgeshire County Council and Peterborough City Council have confirmed they have received the final Inspector's Report on the joint Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Minerals and Waste Site Specific Proposals (SSP) Development Plan Document. The independent Inspector has found the SSP sound and has confirmed "the Plan provides an appropriate basis for the planning of mineral and waste over the next 15 years". http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/environment/planning/mineralswastefram Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) is launching a pilot scheme in South Cambridgeshire to encourage residents to carry out safety checks on their homes.

The scheme is innovative in that it will rely on local volunteers to liase with the community on its behalf. CFRS is now looking for people who live in the South Cambridgeshire area to volunteer to become 'Community Champions'. Community Champions will be trained to speak to local community groups about home fire safety and escape plans, and to refer those people who are unable to carryoutacheckoftheirownhometoCFRSforadditional support. Champions will also attend community events and take part in CFRS's public consultation activity. Cambridgeshire ACRE is running this pilot scheme on behalf of CFRS. We believe that our strong links with South Cambridgeshire parishes means we are well placed to generate a good level of support for the scheme and we would encourage anyone looking for an opportunity to take on a more active role in their community to consider becoming a Community Champion. More information on the scheme can be obtained by contacting the Clerk or calling Cambridgeshire ACRE on 01353 865037.

Bonfires

A bonfire can be a convenient way of getting rid of a large amount of waste. If a bonfire is the most practicable way to dispose of dry garden waste (for example, diseased plant material that cannot be composted) please warn your neighbours - so that there are no complaints.

Avoid lighting the fire in unsuitable weather conditions, smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the evening. If it is windy smoke may be blown into neighbours' gardens and across roads.

Avoid burning at weekends and on bank holidays when people want to enjoy their gardens.

Avoid burning when air pollution is high.

NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All

This term Year 6 are studying the Second World War – in particular, from the point of view of children at the time. This is a joint piece of writing by the whole class describing their 'evacuation day' at Denny Abbey:

On the 14th of October 1943, we received a one-way ticket to the desolate countryside. Everyone was shocked when our Prime Minister, Chamberlain, announced the first evacuation on our wireless. We were informed the week before that our country was involved in the most deadly war of our time.

The evacuation for was our own safety and well being. We were required to take our gas masks and labels for a safe journey to Denny Abbey. Once the packing was finished, we were ready to leave. Two hours later, we were on the country bound carriage. Flapping white handkerchiefs filled the air like seagulls at the beach. Tearful parents were trying not to show their emotions. Suddenly, we were spirited away to what would soon be called home.

Our new home was the smallest cottage we had ever seen! There was no central heating and no hot water on tap! In the house, there was no television but they did have a wireless radio, a chess set, some magazines and books for entertainment. The toilet was outside in a little shed, with no separate bathroom in the house. If you wanted a bath, you had to use a tub in front of the kitchen stove where you would not have any privacy! The garden was also quite small but crammed with home-grown vegetables, which needed to be watered and cared for everyday.

During our stay, we also had a cookery lesson and made cottage cheese. You mix warm milk with lemon juice and stir it until it curdles. When curdled, you





put in a muslin cloth and squeeze out the liquid. Serve it with chives and biscuits – enjoyment for all!

We also visited the local shop with our ration books. It was quite small but had everything you would need for a weekly shop, although because of rationing, that wasn't a lot! Sweets, sugar, meat, eggs and milk were all rationed and people were encouraged to 'Dig for Victory' and grow their own food. We planted cress seeds as cress is quick and easy to grow.

As well at digging for victory, we were also encouraged to 'Make, Do and Mend'. During the war, clothes were also rationed so you had to be very

inventive and recycle old material. We made rag rugs with leftover strips of fabric, which were easy to make and looked very colourful.

Whilst at Denny Abbey, we had a near-death experience! The air raid siren sounded and we had to run for safety. The abbey itself was our bomb shelter and was packed with first aid kits, helmets, gas masks and playing cards. We were taught what to do in an emergency and we sang songs to keep our spirits up!

We soon got used to life at Denny Abbey as our host family was very welcoming. It was a great learning experience for everyone and made us appreciate what life was really like for an evacuee during World War 2. Class 15, Meridian Primary School



UPDATE ON LIBRARY CAMPAIGN

On 24^{th} October David Harty, County Councillor responsible for Learning and Libraries, Christine May, Head of Library and Information Services and Marjorie Smith District Library manager attended a FOCAL meeting in Comberton Public Library. 

CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE COMMUNITY CHAMPION SCHEME

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) is launching a pilot scheme in South Cambridgeshire to encourage residents to carry out safety checks on their homes. The scheme is innovative in that it will rely on local volunteers to liase with the community on its behalf.

CFRS is now looking for people who live in the South Cambridgeshire area to volunteer to become 'Community Champions'.

Community Champions will be trained to speak to local community groups about home fire safety and escape plans, and to refer those people who are unable to carry out a check of their own home to CFRS for additional support. Champions will also attend community events and take part in CFRS's public consultation activity.

Cambridgeshire ACRE is running this pilot scheme on behalf of CFRS. WHY PAY WHEN YOU DON'T HAVE TO

Each month at Trading Standards we receive enquiries about things people have paid for that they could have got for free. In this article, we give advice on where you may be able to save unnecessary expense.

Warranties and Guarantees

When you buy goods, whether on their own (like a washing machine) or as part of a larger piece of work (such as a new bathroom installation), by law those goods must be of "satisfactory quality" and be "fit for their purpose". They must be of a standard that a person would expect, bearing in mind the price paid, and be free from minor defects, be as described, and last a reasonable length of time for a product of that type. So if, for instance, the normal life of a washing machine is 5 years and yours stops working after two years due to a defect, you may be able to claim for a repair or replacement from the business you bought it from. This is the case regardless of whether you bought a warranty or guarantee. So consider carefully whether a warranty gives you anything extra.

Claiming from your debit card or credit card

If you are in dispute with a trader, instead of taking them to court, find out whether your bank may be able to help you. If you paid for something on a **debit card** and there turns out to be problems with the purchase, many banks offer a 'charge back' scheme where they refund you. Furthermore, if you pay for something worth over £100 and pay for at least some of it on your **credit card**, the credit card company is equally as responsible as the business that breaks its contract with you. So, if your holiday isn't as it was described, if your new dining table arrives damaged, or if your new TV breaks down soon after purchase, you can insist that your credit card provider helps you if the shop won't. This is even the case if you have paid off the amount you put on your credit card.

Personal Protection Insurance

We have received a number of reports about companies offering to claim compensation for the mis-selling of personal protection insurance on residents' behalf, whether in relation to a loan, mortgage or credit card. This is actually something you can do yourself. The Financial Ombudsman has produced a leaflet which is available on www.financial-ombudsman.org.uk on how to make the complaint yourself. If you don't have access to the internet, you can contact the Financial Ombudsman for advice over the telephone on 0800 0234567.

European Health Insurance cards

Even though some companies sell them, you can actually obtain a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) free of charge which entitles you to medical treatment that becomes necessary, at a reduced cost or sometimes free, when visiting a country in the European Union, Norway, Switzerland, Iceland and Liechtenstein. This is limited to treatment provided under the state scheme and you will need to produce your EHIC card. Visit www.ehic.org.uk to find out more and apply.

Legal advice

GIFTS OF GOLD, FRANKINCENSE, AND MYRRH

In Matthew's gospel, these were the first Christmas gifts offered to Jesus by strangers - the Magi from the East. The magnificent altarpiece by Rubens in King's College Chapel tries to imagine the event. Of the three gifts, two were from plants. Frankincense is a resin derived from *Boswellia sacra*, a woody shrub with feather-like leaves and small white flowers; it grows in Arabia. The resin exudes from cut stems; it is heavily perfumed with a clean aromatic scent but it is bitter to taste. This material is the common incense used in some churches where it is burned to create an aromatic smoke. Myrrh is another resin, this time derived from the small tree *Commiphora abyssinica* found in north Africa and Arabia. Myrrh had a wide range of uses in the ancient world; it was used to make perfumed ointments for anointing, particularly the dead. After the crucifixion, Jesus' body was wrapped in linen with a mixture of aloes and myrrh; these spices were provided by Nicodemus as the final gift to Christ.

Plants for Christmas

We are spoilt for choice for plants that flower indoors. Cyclamen are very good value as Christmas gifts. There are many superb examples of the larger flowering varieties; especially interesting are specimens with fine silver patterns on their leaves. Small flowering types look good when clustered in a shallow bowl. The big advantage of cyclamen is their long flowering period and they can be kept in flower continuously for 3 months. They do well in a cool position and with light watering. Feed once per week with a very small amount of liquid feed. Carefully remove flower stalks that have finished in order to keep the flowering constant. Very occasionally the plants might be infested with scale insect; an appropriate insecticide will get rid of the pests.

Orchids always sound as though they are an exotic luxury. However there are some like the *Phalaenopsis* varieties that are easy and long lived. These plants flourish under a regime of benign neglect, but read the instructions on the label to get the maximum flowering from your plants (http://www.plant-care.com/

phalaenopsis-orchid-care.html). Very little watering and feeding is required. I like to group 3 or 5 pots into the same container to give a more flamboyant show. Sometimes the plants look better if the stick to which they are tied is cut back a little. Flower colour is within the range white to deep pink but there is a large number of variations. Be careful on making your choice of plants, some have many more flower buds on their stems, so make a point of checking for this potential growth.

Have a good Christmas and if the weather is agreeable, try to get out and about and keep your eye on the garden.
