PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 14th November 2012

Vacancies on the Council

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council. For more information please see last months Contact or contact the Clerk. *Speed bumps in Hines Lane - What is your view on this*

proposal?

A resident has written asking for speed bumps in Hines Lane and a speed reduction to 10mph to slow down traffic. The Parish Council is broadly supportive of this suggestion and has written to the County Council to request that they install these. The following response has been received "It is not clear from the e-mail if the majority of residents of Hines Lane now support the idea of instaling speed cushions along this road. Whilst I appreciate that there is concern for the safety of children there is thankfully anexcellent safety record along this lane. The County Council would be unable to support the provision of a 10 mph speed limit as this is not presently permitted under national policy set by the Department for Transport. The lowest speed limit that could currently be considered is 20 mph.

Consideration needs to be given as to how the measures would potentially be funded. The majority of County Council funding for highway schemes is currently focused on highway maintenance and accident remedial schemes to reduce the number and severity of road traffic collisions at existing accident cluster sites. The proposal could be put forward as a bid for funding from the 2012/13 Minor Highway Improvement budget (MHI). Alternatively if the key speeding offenders are those misusing the recreation ground car park could the Parish Council not consider gating it at certain times, or installing speed cushions/humps. Cushions or humps on the lane would not directly affect the residents but may deter speeding along the lane towards the car park, this could be combined with a 20 mph limit along the adopted length of the Lane."

Comberton Parish Council would like to ask what residents think. Please take the time to write to the Parish Council with your views. Thank you.

Barton Road speed reduction

The speed reduction scheme has been approved by the County Council and the new signs indicating the speed limit should be installed on 20th November.

Local Minor Highway Improvements 2013/14

The County Council is keen to work with local communities to help deliver local improvements to their highways and streets. It has invited a bid from the Parish Council and the Council has tasked its Transport Working Group with drawing up a bid and bringing a recommendation to the December Parish Council meeting. If successful the Parish Council would need to contribute 10% of the costs.

District Council and County Council reports

Both Cllr Harangozo and Fiona Whelan were asked by the Parish Council to write regular articles for Contact.

CCC Consultation on Cambridgeshire's Flood Risk Management Strategy Cambridgeshire's Strategy for Flood Risk Management is an important new tool to help everyone understand and manage flood risk within the county. Under the Flood and Water Management Act (2010) Cambridgeshire County Council has a duty to produce the strategy in partnership with key stakeholders involved in flood risk management. The Parish Council will be submitting a detailed response on this highlighting all of the problems that the village has from time to time. The County Council has made the full strategy and online survey available on its website and the consultation ends on 14th December.

Recreation Ground proposed cycle racks

The Parish Council was successful in its application and is now the proud owner of two cycle racks that will be installed at the recreation ground shortly.

Winter Gritting Volunteers

Thank you to the two residents who have already put themselves forward for this scheme. In addition Cllr Richard Elleray has volunteered for training.

Connections Bus visits

The Trustees of the Connections Bus have written to indicate that the costs of the bus visits are likely to almost double from April 2013. This would mean that the costs would be £237 per visit instead of £117 paid now. The Connections Bus has attributed this increase to the reduction in the income that the bus receives from other sources which has continued to fall. The Parish Council has learnt that the cost could be reduced if some residents or parents would be willing to help out at the weekly sessions. The Council will consider at its January meeting if it will be able to meet the costs of the bus visits next year when it reviews its budget and sets the annual precept. If you would be willing to volunteer to assist please contact the Clerk for more information.

A SAVIOUR IS BORN – BUT PLEASE COULD HE REMAIN OUTSIDE?

The last time I went to Jerusalem I was enthralled. At the Museum of the Book, I spent an hour just staring at a replica of the Copper Scroll of Isaiah, one of the famous Dead Sea Scrolls. While you can open any Bible and read his book for yourself, this Copper Scroll had been inscribed, copied from some now long lost ancient manuscript, some time prior to the year 60 BC (before Christ).

In it the prophet predicts what the saviour of the world would be like, and what he would do (in chapter 53). In Isaiah's introduction to this passage, he asks, 'Who has believed our report?' a report that, remarkably, was written nearly 800 years BEFORE the events he is reporting. The Jewish Scriptures has many references to the figure who was yet to arrive, the Messiah. That man was described by the early believers as 'the visible image of the invisible God'. The historical elements of his life were recorded in the New Testament and maintained in the collective psyche of the church through the creed. This is from the old Roman creed, written in the second century:

"I believe in God the Father almighty; and in Christ Jesus His only Son, our Lord, who was born from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, who under Pontius Pilate was crucified and buried, on the third day rose again from the dead, ascended to heaven, sits at the right hand of the Father, whence He will come to judge the living and the dead. . ."

But we remember also that there was no room for that family in the Inn. Jesus had to be born in the stable. The Inn was full of more important guests: none could be disturbed to make room for the creator of the universe. Has much changed?

His youngest disciple, St John, wrote this: 'He came to his own, and his own received him not. But whoever did receive him he gave them the right to become children of God.' This right is the one I treasure most this Christmas. A Note from the Executive Principal

Education, it seems, is what needs changing as much or more than anything else in our society. Apparently, our qualifications are not fit for purpose and perhaps have not been for some time. Modern teaching methods have perhaps not done pupils any good. The curriculum might mean that our pupils do not know the things they need to know. In light of these suggestions, change, and ever more of it, is apparently what we need: new qualifications, new (or perhaps old?) ways of teaching, new (or perhaps 'traditional') curriculum. It is quite hard to know what it is right to say and not to say from a school's perspective on all this. It does, however, seem reasonable to offer the following observations:

- It really matters a lot that the qualifications for which young people today are working hard and will receive grades are seen as highly valuable. Anything other than that would be unfair and even dangerous. We might look to reform as we always need to check that qualifications are what are needed for contemporary society. However, we need to value what our current young people are doing.
- It seems highly likely that teaching methods will have changed a great deal in recent years. In our ICT and internet rich age with ever-greater understanding about how we think and learn, it would be strange if ways





- of teaching and learning had not changed. In truth, it would be strange if they had not improved a lot. We just accept that this is the case with things such as sports' coaching and that standards thus rise a lot. It is hard to see why there is not a direct parallel with teaching.
- Whatever we do, we need to be sure that our schools really do strongly
 meet the needs of all of our young people, whatever 'type', outlook or
 ability they may be or possess. It is not good enough to have a system that
 works well for some but not for others. We need to allow every young
 person to make progress, to develop and to excel.
- In practice, the new world of schools will mean that it will be up to schools what they do. There might be many suggestions made centrally (and elsewhere) about what should or should not happen in our schools. There might even be considerable pressure brought to bear on these things. However, the essence of being an Academy (as most secondary schools in England now are, and virtually every Cambridgeshire secondary school is) is that it is up to schools what to do. The national curriculum can be ignored. Qualifications can be chosen by the school. Teaching methods are up to schools. In this, perhaps there is true opportunity as well as clear responsibility. Our approach will be simple: we will make decisions for all our young people and our communities that we believe are best for them. We will be guided by core values based on excellence and equity. We will try to be brave enough to do what is right rather than what might be easy and simply in line with the latest central direction.

- In recent times there has been an increase in the amount of counterfeit and fake alcohol found in the county. Counterfeit alcohol, just like any other counterfeit product, mimics a genuine branded article and tries to pass itself off as the genuine product. Usually the counterfeit product is very convincing and most consumers wouldn't notice any difference in the packaging.
- As well as counterfeit alcohol there are drinks designed to look like new and appealing brands. Often these products

Fines for Longbow pub duo

TWO men who ran a pub that was closed down by police have been fined for continuing to offer alcohol for sale after the venue's licence had been suspended. Graeme Forster, 48, and his business partner Christopher Smith, 53, admitted offences under the Licensing Act 2003 relating to The Longbow pub in Stapleford. The pair, both of Church Street, Stapleford, appeared at Cambridge Magistrates' Court yesterday (October 23) where Forster was fined £500 and Smith £400. The bench also ordered the forfeiture of their personal licences: under the Licensing Act, anyone who plans to sell or supply alcohol or authorise the sale or supply of alcohol must have a personal licence. The court heard police had executed a drugs warrant at the premises on May 25, when drugs were seized including cannabis and cocaine from those at the pub.

Officers were responding to complaints by members of the public and a series of incidents of violence, disorder and anti-social behaviour. Four arrests were made and the pub was closed under Section 161 of the Licensing Act. The closure was extended by magistrates before an application to review the pub's licence by South Cambs District Council resulted in it being suspended for three months, expiring at the end of last month. Forster was the leaseholder and personal licence holder, however, after the closure Smith put himself forward as an alternative licensee. After the closure, both men continued to run a pizza delivery business from the premises and distributed leaflets offering not only food but also alcoholic drinks for sale. Smith admitted exposing and advertising alcohol for sale after the licence was suspended, for which he was fined £250. He also pleaded guilty to being the holder of a personal licence and failing to declare to the council he had been convicted of a relevant offence (drink driving) and that he had changed addresses. He was fined £75 for both

offences. Graeme Forster admitted selling alcohol without a licence by selling a barrel of beer (to another pub) after the premises licence was suspended and also exposing and advertising alcohol for sale after the premises licence was suspended. He was fined £250 for both offences. Both men were ordered to pay £15 victim surcharge and £85 costs. Inspector Chris Savage said: "Our action over the Longbow pub was a last resort and in response to numerous complaints about anti-social behaviour, violence, and drug use and dealing over a period of time. "The enforced closure of the pub, the suspension of the licence by the district council, the prosecutions and the decision by the court to forfeit the defendants' personal licences are all firsts for South Cambs, and the latter for the whole of Cambridgeshire. We were not against the pub in principle, just the way it was run, which was not in keeping with the objectives of the Licensing Act." Councillor Sue Ellington, South Cambridgeshire District Council's cabinet member for Environmental Health Services, said: "This is an excellent result for us and I'd like to thanks the court and Cambridgeshire police for their support in bringing these men to book. Holding a licence to sell alcohol is a serious matter and where licensees do not run their premises lawfully and professionally, or meet their responsibilities towards their customers, neighbours and communities, we can, and will, take action."
