WIMPOLE: SILENT VOICES AND DESERTED HOMES CAMBRIDGE ARCHAEOLOGY FIELD GROUP

An exhibition will be held on Saturday and Sunday, 25th and 26th January 2014 in the Marshall Room of the Old Rectory restaurant at Wimpole Hall on the "silent voices and deserted homes" of the former hamlets in Wimpole. You are warmly invited to join us to find out more about this curious parish.

All this year Cambridge Archaeology Field Group has been researching the hamlets that used to exist in the parish of Wimpole before the Park was extended to its present size. Our aim has been to find evidence of when they began and when they disappeared and what we could about the people who lived there. This year-long project has been grant-aided by the "All our Stories" Heritage Lottery Fund.

We have been fieldwalking, excavating, test pit digging, metal detecting and scouring old documents and maps, with the help of local people and other volunteers. The exhibition sees the culmination of the year's work. We will be sharing what we have discovered and displaying some of the finds.

The exhibition will be open from 12 noon on Saturday and 11 am on Sunday, closing at 3.30pm both days. Normal car park charges apply, but there is no entry fee.



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 13th November 2013

Recreation ground

Sport England has awarded the Parish Council £50,000 towards the project to install drainage and prepare pitches on the recreation ground land extension. The Parish Council hope it will be able to appoint a contractor shortly so that work can start.

The recreation ground car park will be extended by digging up the grassed area to the right of the entrance and gravelling this area.

Parish Council Government Loan towards the new pitches on the recreation ground

A final decision on the loan has not as yet been made.

S106 Agreements

The Council signed two S106 Agreement Indemnities which trigger the payment of approximately £7,000 to the Parish Council to be spent on the recreation ground within 10 years.

Transport Working Group

At the meeting it was decided not to pursue the zebra crossing any further.

The only scheme the Parish Council still wants to investigate is a 20mph limit in this Harbour Avenue/Barton Road area. The TWG has been asked by the Council to liaise with the County Council to see if this can be provided.

As a bid for the next round of Highways improvements the TWG will be submitting a bid for speed reduction measures at the entrances to the village if funding allows.

The Council will be purchasing four grit bins. These will be sited in Green End, Swaynes Lane, Harbour Avenue and at the junction of Kentings and West Street.

The school system and framework was known, and within that it was the job of us involved in schools to ensure the best possible education for all pupils within the known framework. Of course, it was probably never quite like that. Given that the framework was always ultimately determined at a political level, being mindful of and reacting to changes that are political has always been part of the job.

Just at the moment, it feels especially the case that 'just running a school' is not the be-all and end-all. Reacting appropriately to political change is part and parcel of

regular school oversight. For example, for anyone working in a secondary school and learning of a change to policy regarding GCSE re-takes by reading a Sunday newspaper was an interesting recent experience. Given that it required secondary schools to make a significant decision about its Year 11 students (those in their final GCSE year) within a very short period of time, it was one of the starkest examples of needing to react to political change to the framework in order to 'run a school'.

Out of interest, after some quick and intense consideration, Comberton Village College, decided to react by doing the same as already planned. We reflected that what was right for pupils in their achievement before the change in Government policy was still right after that change. Whatever best supports pupil's achievement should always guide us.

Another on-going matter of deep challenge facing all schools in Cambridgeshire is the funding system for schools. This part of the framework within which decisions must be made, makes life unreasonably challenging for Cambridgeshire schools. The system, for both schools and academies, provides lower funding in Cambridgeshire than anywhere else in the country. Everyone knows and acknowledges that it is unfair and unreasonable. There is talk of a new national funding formula for 2015-16. This would be very welcome, however, it remains a very major issue for all of us in Cambridgeshire concerned for our schools and everything anyone can do to bring appropriate change in this area will be appreciated.

So how should we 'run a school' in shifting and, at times, challenging frameworks? The answer must clearly be to know our fundamental values and allow these properly to guide all that we do. Truly excellent education for all, serving our community while working in partnership and ensuring an international outlook will guide all decision-making at Comberton and Cambourne Village Colleges. It has served us and communities well and can continue to do so.

COMBERTON WI REPORT FOR NOVEMBER

Our Speaker in November was Ray Richardson who gave a very interesting talk on the 'pharmacy that is your garden'. Ray had worked as a chemist in the pharmaceuticals industry and gave us a history of how humans have always used plants for healing. Initially man would have observed animals and learnt from their practice. The ancient Greeks and Romans developed many remedies and recorded their findings, these were translated later by the Arabs and taken around the world on their trading routes. Chemistry as a subject emerged in the nineteenth century and nowadays scientists are able to extract chemicals from plants and then produce the active ingredients chemically. With modern drugs the dosage can be more accurate and there are fewer side effects. It takes sixteen years to develop a new drug and only one in ten thousand is successful. Ray told us about many common garden plants and herbs and which active ingredients they produced. Herbs and spices which we assume are used for flavouring would originally have been used for their anti-fungal, anti-biotic, anti-cholesterol or anti-septic properties.

PLAGUED BY NUISANCE CALLS? TRADING STANDARDS OFFERS ADVICE

Recent figures released by the Communications Regulator, OFCOM, show that around 10,000 unsolicited marketing calls and 3,000 silent calls are received by UK consumers every month. The majority of these calls are made between 8am and 6pm Monday to Friday.

As well as interrupting whatever you are doing at the time, many such callers use pressure selling to persuade you to agree to something without giving you the chance to consider it properly.

What can you do to reduce the number of nuisance calls you receive?

Firstly, register with the Telephone Preference Service. The service is free and can reduce the number of unsolicited marketing calls you receive from UK companies. You can register by calling 08450 700707 or by visiting www.tpsonline.org.uk.

Secondly, speak to your telephone service provider to ask what call blocking technology they would recommend. Three Scottish Trading Standards authorities have recently tested some of the latest call blocking devices and found them to be very effective in reducing such nuisance calls. Some telephone providers also offer their own call blocking facilities. There may be a charge involved for such a device.

Thirdly, if you need to give your phone number to a business, make sure you opt out of receiving promotional information from them and third parties by ticking the relevant box on their website or clearly stating this if you are dealing with them on the telephone.

Fourthly, become ex-directory as some businesses use phone directories to compile marketing call lists.

Finally, many nuisance calls originate from overseas so ask your telephone provider to block international calls to your number (although be aware there may be a charge for this service).

Never divulge personal details such as your bank details to a cold caller, regardless of who they claim to be (Police, your bank etc) and never agree to any loans or credit over the phone.

Dealing with cold callers

When it comes to dealing with pressure selling on the telephone, remember that it is likely they are using this technique because their prices are uncompetitive – they don't want you to have time to compare their prices with other companies. False claims that this is a 'one day only' offer or that the price is hugely discounted are common tactics.

Tell the caller you are not interested and ask them not to contact you again. If they ignore your request, report them to the Information Commissioner (ICO) online at www.ico.org.uk or by phone 0303 1231113. You can also report automated prerecorded calls to ICO. If possible make a note of the business name, the number they called from, the date and time they called and what they were trying to 'sell' eg. PPI, accident claim, credit. You should also make the ICO aware of any distress, damage or loss you suffered as a result of these calls.

If you need advice on anything you have bought or agreed to as a result of such a cold call, contact our advice partner, the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline, on 0845 4040506.



BUYING A SECONDHAND CAR?

Advice from Trading Standards

At Trading Standards, the most frequent type of consumer complaint we receive relates to the purchase of secondhand cars. They are one of the most expensive purchases we make and many of us are dependent on them for going about our daily lives. As a result it can be a daunting process to buy a secondhand car. Below we provide some advice to help you.

Check before you buy

• Check the validity of the MOT on VOSA's website (www.gov.uk/check-motstatus) and check the car's details are correct on the MOT certificate. If it states there were advisory points, make sure you see the details so that you know what work is likely to be needed before the next MOT.

- Check the VOSA website to check the vehicle has not been recalled.
- Check it's service history. How often has it been serviced, and has it been serviced in line with the manufacturer's recommendations?
- Carry out an HPI (www.hpi.co.uk) check to make sure there is no outstanding finance on the car that could lead to it being repossessed by the finance company. An HPI check will also tell you if the car has been written off or if it is stolen.
- In terms of physically checking the car, carry out a walk around check and test drive the car. If you are not mechanically minded we would also strongly recommend you have the car checked by an engineer.

Your rights against the seller

If you buy from a private seller, your rights are limited if you find a fault with the car after buying it. The seller must have the right to sell the car and the car must be 'as described', but other than that you have no recourse if things go wrong with it.

By comparison, if you purchase the car from a trader, again they must have title to the car and it must be 'as described' but in addition it must be of satisfactory quality, taking into account its age, mileage, condition etc. For instance, it would be reasonable to expect a brand new car to be free from wear and tear issues when you buy it.

However if you were to buy a ten year old car with a mileage of over 100,000 then naturally there will be wear and tear on the vehicle. If faults arise due to wear and tear, it is unlikely you will have any recourse against the trader. Where a fault occurs which is not due to wear and tear, you may be able to seek a repair by the trader in the first instance.

The rights explained above are in addition to any rights you may have under a warranty.

LOCAL RESIDENTS REMINDED TO CHOOSE WELL THIS WINTER

Residents in Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire are being reminded to find the right health service for their illness or injury this winter.

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) who commission health services in the area are asking local residents to familiarise themselves with the range of local health services and which illnesses and injuries they can treat. Last year local people using A&E when they didn't need to cost the local NHS £2million, this could have treated 500 heart attack patients or bought 250 hip replacements.

Here's a reminder of what local NHS services can treat.

- Pharmacies can help with bugs and viruses, skin conditions, allergies, pregnancy testing and help with stopping smoking.
- GPs can help with back ache, ear aches, painful coughs, mental health conditions and any illness or injury that won't go away. Make sure that you have your doctor's number to hand. There's also an out of hours GP service which can be accessed by calling your normal doctor's number you will be put straight through or hear a message with the out of hours service number.
- Walk-in centre or minor illness or injury unit these can help with minor burns and scalds, bites and stings, strains and sprains and minor eye or ear problems.
- Or you can look after colds, coughs, sore throats, hangovers, tummy upsets, grazes can all be treated at home with a well-stocked medicine cabinet.

Dr Arnold Fertig GP in Cambridge and from CamHealth Local Commissioning Group said, "Winter brings more coughs, colds and flu so it is a good idea to be prepared and to make sure you have a supply of remedies at home to help care for you and your family over the holiday period. Burglary targeted by force crime-prevention campaign

POLICE are urging residents to take crime prevention measures this winter as part of a campaign against burglary. Cambridgeshire Constabulary is focusing on burglary throughout November as part of its award-winning Get Close campaign. Using crime analysis the campaign seeks to raise awareness of different offences, at the most effective time, throughout the year.

Burglary is a priority for the force and officers across the county are working hard to catch offenders.

However, with the clocks having gone back at the weekend and the days getting shorter, officers are concerned that burglars will target homes mid-to-late afternoon and will look for properties that are unoccupied. Yesterday and last night, seven domestic burglaries were reported in the Cambridge area – in Green End Road, Stourbridge Green, Windsor Road, Thoday Street, Trumpington Road, Topliffe Way and Beche Road.

In the South Cambs area, there were four domestic burglaries, in Papworth

Everard, Hardwick, Melbourn and High Street, Foxton. A 21-year-old man from Foxton was arrested in connection with this break-in. Community reduction officer Carol Aston said: "Burglars target homes they think are empty so it's important that people try to make their homes look occupied. Properties are generally broken into from the rear because the burglar doesn't want to be seen so people should make it as difficult as possible to access their back garden. Tall fencing, noisy gravel, spiky hedges and an alarm system are all worth the investment. And of course, windows and doors should always be locked when there is no one at home."

Last winter, there were 961 burglaries in the county during the four months, from November to February, with 224 in November, 227 in December, 296 in January and 214 in February.

Other crime prevention measures include:

*Remove keys from window and door locks, but keep them in a familiar and safe place where all members of the family know where to find them in the event of an emergency.

*Never leave items such as keys, bags and money on show through a window, as these can prove a real temptation for an opportunist burglar.

*Consider the position of key racks or shelves next to doors and ensure that they cannot be reached through the letter box.

*Use timer switches to turn on lights and radios when you are going to be away from your house at dusk.

*Consider the use of lights at the front and rear of your property that are activated when someone approaches.

*Consider the use of bolts and padlocks on side gates. Place the bolts at the top, middle and bottom of the gate, as just a top bolt might be easy to reach and open.

*Consider chaining together all high value items stored in outbuildings, as this will make it harder for them to be removed. Also consider the use of a wireless alarm or link your shed or garage into an existing home intruder alarm system.

* Homeowners are urged to check their home insurance policies to ensure their property meets the security standards required. Insurance companies often refuse to pay out if properties do not meet these standards or are left unsecured.
