PARISH COUNCIL REPORT from the Clerk The Parish Council met on 8th January 2014

Transport Working Group

The Parish Council is in negotiations with St John's College to enter into a Permissive Path Agreement to facilitate the creation of a permissive path along the edge of the fields of Northfield Farm adjacent to Long Road. The proposal will be for a grass track approximately 3 meters wide. At its meeting the Parish Council agreed to sign the agreement and provide the necessary public liability insurance subject to legal costs being acceptable to the Council. Coton Parish Council is to be asked to contribute to the legal costs as their children will also use the path from Coton to the Village College.

Cycling on pavements

Comberton Parish Council has received numerous complaints about people cycling on the pavements with no consideration for pedestrians. This includes both primary and secondary school age children. While understanding the difficulties of cycling through the village at peak traffic times, the Parish Council requests that pedestrians have priority at all times.

Real time bus information

The Parish Council has heard that it was successful in its bid for funding to install Real Time Information Displays at the bus stops in the village. Budget and Precept for financial year 1st April 2014 to 31 March 2015 At its meeting the Council approved its budget for the forthcoming financial year and set its precept at £57,000. For a copy of the Council's budget or information on the Council's proposed spending please contact the Clerk. *Recreation ground*

The Parish Council continues to liaise with Sport England about the project to install drainage and prepare pitches on the recreation ground land extension. The Parish Council hopes it will be able to appoint a contractor shortly so that work can start.

Parish Council Government Loan towards the new pitches on the recreation ground A final decision on the loan has still not been made.

Potholes

Potholes were reported to County Cllr Frost to follow up with the County Council.

The Council has had a comprehensive tree survey undertaken and at its meeting it considered the report and recommendation of its Tree Group. seems to me, however, that it is just as applicable to our own situation at Meridian. As parents, when we send a child to school we are, in effect, enlisting a wide range of other adults to support us in our child's upbringing. The teachers come to mind immediately as the people with whom children have most contact and their influence is very strong. In any primary school, however, there are many other adults who have a commitment to each child's welfare, learning and happiness. Please note that these follow in no particular order – there is no hierarchy of importance!

Our Mid-day Supervisors come to mind as a group whose purpose is to ensure that children engage in safe and happy play at lunchtime, enjoy their meal in a sociable setting, and return to lessons in the afternoon relaxed and ready to learn again. Meanwhile, our lunch providers ensure that the food the children enjoy is appealing, tasty and nutritious. Brain food is vital!

Our Teaching Assistants do just what their title says – they assist the teacher to ensure that every child can access the learning which is going on. They may have responsibility for an individual child with a special need or have a broader remit involving groups or whole classes, but they too are focused on the children's educational and social development.

Our Governors oversee the whole thing. Their role is a strategic one to keep the school moving forward and to offer support and challenge to the adults to make sure it does!

The Office Staff are always the 'public face' of a school and their friendly, welcoming manner to children, parents and visitors alike says a great deal about the values we embrace. Our Site Manager and Cleaners work hard to ensure that the site is safe, clean and pleasant for the children so they can learn to the best of their ability. The PTA too play a vital role in raising funds to give the children extra learning experiences - and in putting on events which are just lots of fun! Not forgetting the volunteers who help with clubs and trips.

In addition to all these regular contributors to our children's learning, we often make visits and have visitors; some are very local (it's that 'village' theme again) and others are based much further afield.

Most of the people I've mentioned probably won't read this – but I would still like to thank them all for their contribution to the upbringing of our next generation. It is no small thing. Glennis Virgo Headteacher

CAMBRIDGESHIRE HEARING HELP?

CHANGING IT'S NAME From 1st January 2014 Cambridge CAMTAD (Campaign for Tackling Acquired Deafness) is changing its name to Cambridgeshire Hearing Help. There will be no change to our services. We now run hearing help sessions in 42 venues in Cambridgeshire. At these drop-in sessions volunteers offer advice on any aspects of hearing loss and maintain NHS hearing aids by distributing batteries, cleaning and "retubing" aids. There is also a service to housebound people and those living in residential care. It is not generally recognised that hearing aids need maintenance every 3 - 6 months when the small plastic tube that links the mould with the mechanical part needs to be replaced to maintain the quality of sound. By keeping hearing aids in good condition with routine maintenance available locally, hearing loss becomes a minor inconvenience not a major barrier to communication. This helps to keep people sociable and makes a significant contribution to their quality of life. We also offer a telephone advice service, talks, training and information on hearing help assistive technology. The alerts are intended for crisis, disaster and emergency communications. Events that could require an alert include:

- Natural disasters or severe weather
- Chemical or biological incidents
- Terrorist incident or threat
- Criminal activity that places the public in life-threatening harm

Alerts could warn of imminent danger, give evacuation directions, issue preventative instructions or give urgent safety alerts.

To subscribe, Twitter users simply need to visit the force's account homepage and click on the link beside the orange bell symbol.

Peter Rham, head of force resilience, said: "In a major incident where people are at risk, one of our key objectives is to get fast and accurate information to the public, as it could save lives.

"Twitter alerts provide us with another way of communicating directly with people in an emergency. The alerts will stand out as being of exceptional importance and the notifications to people's mobile devices mean we can get messages to people as they go about their daily business.

"I would urge people to follow our Twitter account and sign up to the alerts as one day they could prove extremely valuable."
