

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 14 December 2011.

#### Recreation ground and pavilion

Callum Stewart has been employed as litter picker for the recreation ground. The pavilion now has new flooring in all areas except the large carpeted room

The pavilion now has new flooring in all areas except the large carpeted room and office.

Further to the last report the Comberton Crusaders have written to the Parish Council with a number of proposals including seeking agreement in principle to:-

- The Crusaders leasing the remainder of the land extension after the wood has been planted for sports pitches which when not in use by the Club for matches would be available for all other users,
- The idea of a sports pavilion trust
- Exploring the idea of a new pavilion with car parking for 50 to 55 vehicles.

The Council's Recreation Ground Working Group put forward a proposal for a Recreation Ground Trust to be set up with representatives from the Parish Council, Sports Clubs and other users.

#### Hillfield Road proposed bollards or other verge/open space protection measures and Proposed Barton Road speed reduction from the Long Road roundabout towards Barton

Thank you for everyone who has taken the time to write on these two consultations. If you have views on either of these consultations please take the time to write to the Council. For details of the consultations please see last month's Contact or contact the Clerk for the information. It was agreed that the Recreation Ground Working Group be tasked with investigating whether it would be possible to put the recreation ground and facilities into a trust and consult with the Sports Clubs and other users. This was carried forward to the next meeting for further consideration.

#### Proposed affordable housing development Long Road

No further information has been received however details of any public consultation will be advertised on the notice board in South Street when, and if, arranged.

#### Tree work in the village

One silver birch on the open space outside 35, 37 and 57 the Valley is to be removed as its roots are causing disturbance to the path and another is to be reduced in size. Another which has already been removed will be replaced with another tree of a more suitable size and type.

Work is being arranged to eight lime trees in Milner Road. This work is necessary to improve the current form and future growth of these trees. A silver birch and cherry between Milner Road and Barton Road will both be trimmed.

The County Council has invited bids of up to £10,000 for highway improvement schemes.

Possible schemes, including "20s Plenty" and raised platforms near the Meridian School, and in Barton Road will be considered at the next meeting. If successful in any bid that might be submitted the Parish Council would be required to pay 10% towards the cost. If you have any views on these suggestions please write to the Clerk.

#### Assets review

Each year in autumn the Vice Chairman and some members tour the village to inspect the condition of all the parish Council's assets. This enables repairs on any assets to be scheduled and assists the Parish council in deciding what else might be needed in way of bins, benches and the like.

Arrangements are being made for the hedge on the southern boundary of the recreation ground to be trimmed to encourage it to thicken, trimming of the hedge between the Bowls Club and tennis courts and removal of several self seeded ash saplings.

The Parish Council has a spare bench – suggestions are invited as to where this should be placed in the village.

I am writing in the hope of opening up a debate in the community regarding the Recreation Ground Extension and its potential development into playing fields.

Comberton Crusaders FC made an offer to the Parish Council in September to lease the RGE and try to take forward a project to develop the area both for football pitches for our children and for general recreation. We have the contacts, the knowledge, the access to grant funding and the support of Cambridgeshire FA that would allow us to proceed with a major development project.

At around the same time, the PC decided to approve a plan to plant a Jubilee Wood which we felt was incompatible with the intended use of the RGE when it was bought, and you may have read about this in the report of the November PC meeting in Contact. We followed up by presenting the Recreation Ground Working Group with some possible layouts for pitches and a further letter to the PC detailing 4 points that we were asking them to consider **in principal** at the PC meeting of 14<sup>th</sup> Dec.

These were :

- 1. To consider a lease to Comberton Crusaders, the terms of which would safeguard the public's access to the RGE and its use for activities other than football. We have no intention of restricting access to or the use of the RGE. We simply want to ensure that the ground is used for the purpose for which it was purchased, and that the club has the best possible facilities for our matches.
- 2. To **explore the possibility** of a new pavilion which would straddle the RGE and the existing Rec and serve both areas, the old pavilion, which has never been a successful facility, could be knocked down and the car park extended.

- 3. To agree to a Comberton Sports Pavilion Trust to run the new pavilion, which the sports clubs would sign up to.
- 4. To agree that the PC would continue to run the existing Recreation Ground and its multifarious facilities.

At that meeting we were disappointed that none of our points were considered seriously and that the Parish Council preferred to re-visit the model of a Recreation Ground Management Trust to run the entire Rec and pavilion as a self-financing entity. This is an idea which the sports clubs consider to be unworkable and that we have proposed a more viable alternative.

I believe that the Recreation Ground Working group see the planting of a large part of the field with a wood as an easy option for them. They are, once again, holding up any prospect of creating playing fields on the RGE by their insistence on the management trust. This is what happened two years ago. I do not believe that the PC has the capability to carry forward the major project that is required, since any significant development of this land will require a huge amount of funding, which is not available in Parish funds. The RGE will therefore continue to be a weed-covered dog-walk and wilL not be developed for the purpose for which it was purchased. Is this what you want? Let us have an exercise in local democracy, 21<sup>st</sup> century style, and find out what people really think.

I took a telephone call early one Thursday morning and was told that the inspectors would be in the following Monday and Tuesday! A much fairer process in my opinion, as the inspectors then see the school as it is, without any long preparation.

I challenge any Headteacher or staff member not to be a least a little apprehensive when your school is subject to such close scrutiny. At one point there were five inspectors squashed into the only spare office we could offer! However, the majority of the work was carried out by three inspectors who observed every classteacher teaching twice; talked to children at length; looked at books; analysed questionnaires from parents and staff; scrutinised our data; judged our own self-evaluation; talked with me, other senior staff and governors -- and generally gave us a very thorough going-over!

I have to say I was impressed by this particular team. They were professional, approachable – but very sharp. It was quite astonishing what they were able to deduce about the school in the space of two days. We were, of course, open and honest with them but I have no doubt that, had we not been, they would have found us out.

You may recall that our last inspection was in March 2009. At that time the school was judged to be 'satisfactory'. There are four categories into which a school can be placed – 'inadequate', 'satisfactory', 'good' and 'outstanding'. I am delighted to tell you that this time the school was given a resounding 'good'. Senior leaders were described in the Ofsted report as having 'an ambitious vision for the future and high expectations'. It also states that 'the



quality of the teaching and the curriculum have improved since the last inspection and are now good'. Our governing body' provides robust challenge and support'. These are just some of the positive comments in the report. If you would like to read it in full, it is available on our website at <u>www.meridian-school.com</u>

I would like to express my thanks to all those who have made this possible – committed staff, hard-working governors and supportive parents. That bit about an ambitious vision for the future is important. Next time, of course, we want to be 'outstanding'. It is something which is achieved by only 6% of primary schools in the country – but that is where our sights are firmly set. Happy New Year from all at Meridian!

#### GOING STRAIGHT TO A FAMILY LAW BARRISTER FOR ADVICE AND REPRESENTATION IN COURT

The New Year can be a hard time when your relationship has broken down. You may be struggling to agree how much time your children will spend with each of you. You may be concerned about having enough money to live on or about selling the family home. Worries about getting the right legal help and about escalating legal bills can make it all feel even worse. Specialist family law barristers can help. Until recently, people had to involve a solicitor if they wanted a family law barrister to advise them or represent them in Court. But now, depending on your personal circumstances, you may be able to go straight to a barrister. This is called "Public Access" and it is likely to save you money, because you will be paying for one lawyer not two.

#### What could a barrister do for me under the Public Access Scheme?

- Advise whether Public Access is a suitable option for you.
- Give pragmatic cost-effective legal advice tailored to your situation.
- Appear on your behalf to argue your case in Court.
- Assist you in drafting legal documents, court application forms and letters for you to use.
- Help you decide if expert evidence is required, identify a suitable expert and draft a letter of instruction for you to use.

#### Is there work a solicitor would do but a barrister would not?

• Yes. Barristers are not allowed to "conduct litigation". This means you need to be willing and able to undertake some steps yourself with the guidance of your barrister.

#### How can I find out if my case is suitable for Public Access?

- If you are eligible for Legal Aid, a barrister is not allowed to accept you as a Public Access client. However, a barrister could still work with a solicitor to help you. You can check your eligibility for Legal Aid at <a href="http://www.communitylegaladvice.org.uk/calculators">http://www.communitylegaladvice.org.uk/calculators</a>.



will look good for the second half of the month.

The real winners for January are the Witch Hazels. These small shrubby trees flower on bare stems with strand-like petals sprouting from the centre of the flower to create the appearance of straggly mops. They grow to a maximum height of 8 ft. Most flowers are in various shades of yellow; some of the newer varieties have shades of red on the petals. These small trees are great for a garden that needs a little winter cheer. They look best when set off against the dark foliage of a Yew hedge or Ivy. Don't forget the hardy January-flowering *Clematis cirrhosa balerica* with its evergreen leaves and cream bell-shaped hanging flowers. It looks good growing up a trellis or against a sunny wall.

If the ground is wet, gardening will have to be confined to a little light weeding and tidying up after a storm. Take a long hard look at the trees and shrubs and decide which will be ready for pruning before the weather warms up in February. The second half of January is a good time to prune. Look carefully at the structure of your garden, are there features that provide height and light shade? These always add interest.

Make a New-Year's resolution to visit the Cambridge Botanic Winter Garden on a sunny morning in January; it is always stunning. - Look out for disease




