- The planning condition relating to car parking provision was reviewed and a costed recommendation is to be brought to the next meeting by the Parish Council's Planning Committee.
- Vandalism to the storage garage on the recreation ground was discussed and repairs for the works have been put in hand.
- The two new bridges from the path near the spinney across to the recreation ground extension have been installed and can now be used.
- Some infilling of a hedge on the eastern boundary of the land extension will take place later in the year.
- The pavilion hallway has been painted and replacement flooring for the hallway is being arranged.

Other

- The S106 agreement for the affordable housing development was briefly discussed and agreed. The Parish Council will receive a sum towards the maintenance of the public open space and a separate amount to be used

- A litter pick is being arranged for the autumn. Everyone is encouraged to help out. More details when the date has been set.
- A site meeting is being arranged in Hillfields Road to look at the parking issues. Residents in Hillfields Road will be receiving a flyer with the details through their doors shortly.
- The Parish Council supported an application from the Comberton Surgery for their inclusion in the NHS Pharmaceutical list.
- The District Council has introduced a scheme for speed stickers on litter bins to raise awareness of speed limits in some roads in villages. The scheme trialled in some other village has resulted in cases of speeding being reduced. Comberton Parish Council is obtaining some of these stickers and you will see them appearing in the village soon.
- A project to consider planting trees to commemorate the Queen's Jubilee will be an agenda item at the next meeting.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Wednesday 13 July 2011 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All parishioners are invited to attend the meeting and the first ten minutes or so are open to residents to ask questions or make comments and observations on Comberton matters or on items on the agenda. His messages to the pupils were very clear, simple and fundamental. If you want to succeed, then practice hard. Good to hear from someone who was as naturally talented as anyone could be. Take pride in what you do and who you represent. That should be your motivation.

List, he was now 'Sir David' and his visit to Comberton was his first official function with his new title. It was really good to be able to tour these wonderful new facilities that will be available from now and enable our new Sixth Form



students to benefit from some of the best facilities in the country when they start their Sixth-form careers here in September. We also hope, in Village College tradition, that facilities can be available to the local community. SUMMER LAWN CARE

Patio/Driveway Weed Control

Weeds can look unsightly at this time of year in patios and driveways. We can spray a total weed killer to kill them and keep weed free for up to 6 months.

Sprinklers

We have sprinklers for sale at £30. Depending on water pressure they can cover an area the size of a tennis court. Water well, once per week to keep the lawn green.

Weeds

There are more troublesome weeds than ever this year. Weeds survive drought better and then respond quicker when it rains and recover to smother the lawn. We have the treatments to get rid of them.

Disease

Look out for bleached areas within the lawn. This could be red thread which may need treating with a fungicide.

Ants

An ever increasing nuisance. We can treat nests with an insecticide.

CLEMATIS

Versatile Clematis

Despite the bitterly cold December, most clematis plants survived and have produced very good flowers in spring and early summer. The clematis genus provides a superb variety of climbing plants thus giving us height for the garden on a spectacular scale. The *C. montana* species are the most prolific growers and a single plant can produce over a thousand flowers. I remember seeing a pink variety covering the roof of a large stone house in North Yorkshire; it was certainly the most stunning flower display from a single plant that I have ever seen. Let's go through the varieties that flower in different seasons.

Winter-flowering clematis

Yes there are some good hardy specimens. *C. cirrhosa* species flower in the depths of winter, are evergreen and have almost bell-shaped flowers. 'Freckles' is an early winter flowering clematis which flowers from October to January; it is cream with red splodges on the petals (more correctly tepals). Like many winter-flowering plants it has a good scent. A friend has one that covers the garage roof with winter flowers and the scent drifts onto the drive. 'Wisley cream' is similar but without the splodges; this variety flowers later: January – March.

Early spring-flowering clematis

The *C. armandii* species are evergreen with large shiny leaves and hardy. The beautifully scented flowers open flat with 5-6 tepals and are 5cm across; they climb well up a support and make a nice show round a bedroom window. The flowers, appearing March-April, are normally white with golden stamens, although 'Apple Blossom' is a pink form.

Spring-flowering clematis

The *C. alpina* species flower April to May and have small flowers that hang down. The best blue form is probably 'Francis Rivis' with flowers 6cm across. This variety also has attractive seed heads. The plant grows well through sparsely

branched shrubs. 'White columbine' is a very good white form but needs a dark background to set it off. *C. montana* species flower May to June. These are all stunning for the height that they can grow and the vast number of flowers. I have a variety 'Warwickshire Rose' that has deep pink flowers and unusual foliage: bronze on the exposed side and deep green on the back. Depending on the variety, the *C. montana* species grow 6-11m high. Colour ranges of the Montana group are restricted to white and pink flowers.

Summer-flowering clematis

These are the large flowering varieties with flowers 12-15cm across. They do very well if trained over a support such as an arch or in an obelisk. Colour ranges go from white, to pink, to red, to mauve and to deep blue. They reach heights of 2-3m. Most varieties give their best show in early summer; a second flowering, usually smaller flowers, can appear in August-September. 'William Kennet' is a lovely lavender blue variety with 15-18cm flowers. Double cultivars are available but sometimes I find that the flowers look a little scrappy. The best white double is 'Duchess of Edinburgh'.

Problems

Summer-flowering clematis need to have their roots cooled by shading. Clematis wilt is the main problem and is probably due to physical stem damage which opens up the stem to fungal infection. *C. Montana* seems resistant to wilt.
