PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 12th June 2013

Recreation ground

The District Council has awarded a grant of £2,500 and Amey Cespa a grant of £20,000 towards the project to install drainage and prepare pitches on the recreation ground land extension. A revised application to Sport England for £50,000 is being prepared by the Parish Council's Recreation Ground Working Group (RWG) and this will be submitted in time for the next bidding round.

Tenders for the project were received and the RWG will be considering these further.

There has been an attempted break in at the storage garage on the recreation ground. Fortunately they did not manage to gain entry. The Police have been informed but this has still resulted in costs replacing the damage lock.

The grass on the recreation ground will be cut weekly instead of fortnightly for the next few weeks and the Council will review this at its July meeting.

Connections Bus

The Bus will visit during the School summer holidays.

Resident's request for removal of street light in West Street

Balfour Beatty on behalf of the principle authorities will be consulting between Jul and December 2013 their proposals for the upgrading and possible relocation or removal of some street lights in the village. At that time the Parish Council will consider all the lights in the village and make representation as appropriate.

Annual Parish Meeting (APM)

Thank you to everyone that took the time to attend the APM. The Meeting received a number of interesting and varied reports from groups and organisations in the village.

The APM is the meeting of the electors and not a Parish Council meeting so it is the electors that decide on the agenda and the matters which are most important to them. This year they decided that not only should a report be received from the Police but this should be an agenda item at future meetings and the Police should attend and be prepared to answer questions from the Meeting.

Concern was expressed by the Meeting that the District Councillor was not attending District Council meetings and representing the village as well as was expected. It was agreed by the Meeting that the Clerk would contact the District Council about procedure, the Chairman, Cllr Amanda Bacon would discuss these concerns with him and the Parish Council would consider this further at its next meeting. This the Parish Council did in part but it has carried it forward to the next meeting as the Chairman was not present to report in person.

If anyone has suggestions for next year's APM or would like to suggest a presentation or speaker please contact the Clerk.

Comberton Village College

It was on the agenda that Mr Sean Sycamore, Associate Assistant Headteacher at Comberton Village College, would attend the meeting to discuss the possibility of engaging the school community into the Parish Council initiatives such as fundraising, litter picks, and other voluntary opportunities.

Residents' present expressed concern at the conduct of some students around the village during the school day causing nuisance to residents in West Street and Kentings. These matters will be taken up with Mr Sycamore along with a request that the Village College arranges a clearance of the ditch between Kentings and West Street where to students have thrown lots of litter.

JOAN JAMES

A tribute from her younger son, given at her funeral.

Firstly, I need to provide assurance to my mother on today's events.

as many of you will know my mother was a stickler for organising people, things, events and her own funeral certainly wasn't going to escape her attention to detail

• it was the penultimate time I saw her and just as I was going out of the room she called me back and with a waggle of her finger said "and you do know I expect ALL my children to be PROPERLY dressed for MY funeral"

But Joan did like to do things properly, in the right way and with no nonsense. She was very much a product of the war years. Aged just 7 at the outbreak of war and 13 at its conclusion; yet in many ways the war never really left her!!

Growing up as children in the consumer boom of the 1970s and when Manor Farm was probably one of the very last houses in Comberton to have a colour TV; if as children we ever had the temerity to complain about the black & white TV we would swiftly be admonished with "in the war we had no such luxuries, we had to entertain ourselves"

LONGEVITY was a strong theme in her life

- She went to the same school, from the age of 7-18, the Perse Girls in Cambridge
- She was happily married for 48 years
- She lived in the same house, Manor Farm, for the last 44 years of her life
- She lived in Comberton for 57 years
- But eclipsing all of these was the 70 years in which she played tennis; she first picked up a racquet when she was just 5 in the gardens of the Gunston home, Gilmerton, in Cambridge in 1937, by 1947 she was sweeping all before her as she won the Cambridgeshire County Under 15 Girls Singles championship, and finally in 2007 at the age of 75 even she realised the 'game was up' after a severe bout of shingles
 Joan moved to Comberton in 1956 on her marriage to Robert
- To a house built by a certain firm of reputable Cambridge builders.
- She quickly threw herself into many aspects of village life.
- ◎ In fact, the 60s/70s could very much be termed her 'Comberton Years'.
- Philip was born in 1959, Fiona arrived shortly thereafter in 1961 and I was born in 1965.
- Maving 3 children was never going to hold my mother back.
- She quickly became a leading light in the WI, she was involved as a volunteer in the WRVS, but undoubtedly her 2 greatest passions were DRAMA and TENNIS.
- She was a leading lady in many of the Comberton Drama Group productions
 - o I have to say she was also known at times to be able to 'make a drama out of a crisis'
- As she continued with her other great passion, TENNIS, after winning the Comberton Ladies Singles Championships event for the 9th time and as the engraver struggled to find enough room to put her name on the cup once again, she realised with her somewhat thick skin that perhaps she was becoming 'persona non grata' and it was time to move to the Cocks & Hens club in Cambridge.
- At times the drama and tennis were by no means mutually exclusive events for my mother, many a time Fiona and I would play doubles against our parents at Manor Farm. On paper we should have won hands down every time and yet time and again we get to the deciding game or the tiebreaker and our services would turn to jelly, our volleys would go into the net, and our smashes end up half-way down Green End towards the Duck Pond ... as we fell victim to my mother's ultra-competitiveness and downright devious gamesmanship and 'win at all costs mentality'.

Towards the end of the 70s my mother took up one of her more successful vocations,

- One which perhaps her schooling, her training, her background would not immediately have indicated it was something for her.
- She became a "2nd Hand Car Sales Woman" and she relished it!
- For a period of 10 years or so she became an agent and sold all of Coulsons Company Cars
- As with any occupation there were of course highs and lows but without doubt her greatest triumph was the time a prospective buyer and budding rally-driver took one of the cars out for a test drive ... and crashed it!
- Even as the car was still in the ditch in Branch Road and steam was rising from under the
 bonnet my mother was on the scene and 'secured the sale'!

LATE 70s/80s

Also in the late 70s/80s as the family was growing up my mother's horizons expanded and she increasingly directed her energy back towards Cambridge.

- She was appointed a MAGISTRATE and very quickly thereafter became Chairman of the Bench
- Around this time she also studied for and became a GUIDE FOR THE CAMBRIDGE COLLEGES.
- Which once again became an outlet for her thespian skills, as standing on one of the bridges over the Backs, or in a college quad she would regale a gaggle of Japanese,, French or Italian tourists with anecdotes and stories of the more obscure aspects of University life.
- She finally gave up guiding just last summer at the fresh young age of 79 2004-13

The last decade of her life wasn't her happiest. With Robert the great rock of her life dying in 2004.

- Nevertheless .. in her own inimitable way she never lost her drive and energy.
- My father's death spurred her into driving through a fresh wave of landscaping and building works in Manor Farm.
- Needless to say the name of the reputable firm of Cambridge builders ..
- And indeed many a morning the shout would go up in the Coulson's office
 - o "it's Joan on the line"
 - o "where's Philip?"
 - o They would look in his office, they would look in the yard, they would call his mobile ... for some reason they could never get hold of him as the latest bout of ORDERS, .. sorry .. 'instructions' came through!

BRIDGE

It was also in these later years after my father had died that Joan threw herself back into Bridge and once again her competitive fires never dimmed!

- By now she was playing for money, high stakes, 1p per game won!
- And the look of delight in her eyes when she came home 3p, 4p, maybe even 5p up was something to behold.

BRITISH LEGION

And in her later years the formative impact of the war never left her and Joan always had great respect for the military.

- My father was President of the Local Branch of the Royal British Legion and on his death my mother had the incredible honour of taking on the role of Presidency as it was passed to her.
- Admittedly after her 1st stroke in October last year when confusion could reign, on several occasions she referred to herself as the PRIME MINISTER of the British Legion BUT you know what .. there always was a streak of Maggie in her!
