

TREES ON THE RECREATION GROUND EXTENSION

Six trees were planted in February. These were well grown specimens purchased by the council and private donations from residents. Owing to the dry weather, the trees have been showing drought stress and the tree warden has been taking water to them to prevent them from dying. SHUTTING THE DOOR ON BOGUS PRIZE DRAWS: ADVICE FROM TRADING STANDARDS

Many of us receive junk mail through the post, with the vast majority going straight in the recycling bin. However for some it can be tempting to try your luck on a 'prize draw' letter that comes through the letterbox.

The cost of this temptation can be seen in figures released from the Office of Fair Trading which shows that last year, 1 in 25 people lost money to a scam, be it bogus prize draws, foreign lotteries, miracle health cures or money transfer scams. Seven per cent of those lost £4000 or more and those are only the ones that were reported.

The organisers of these scams are smart – the letters look professional, they are often personalised so they have your name throughout (sometimes appearing to be handwritten), and there is often a short deadline to respond so that you



By replying to just one of these letters, your information will be shared by other scammers who will then write to you, inundating you with letters.

The message from Trading Standards is simple: if it looks too good to be true it probably is and if it asks for money upfront, even in the form of an admin charge for processing your winnings, it is almost certainly a scam.

If you are in any doubt or think you may have responded to a scam, speak to friends, family or Consumer Direct for advice. Consumer Direct provides advice on behalf of Trading Standards and can be contacted on 0845 4040506. Most of the scams we come across have affected older residents, many of whom experience loneliness. If you are over 60 and could do with having someone visit you for a chat on a regular basis, or perhaps you know someone who would benefit from this, then Age UK (Age Concern and Help the Aged combined) may be able to help you. They offer a voluntary visiting scheme for residents across the County, and you can ring to find out more on 0845 5213481. You can register with the Mailing Preference Service which is free. It won't cut out all scams but it should significantly reduce the amount of marketing mail you receive. Comberton Panel

1. Emerging Issues

Comberton Area Neighbourhood trends

Total crime across the Neighbourhood has increased to 139 offences from 124 in the previous period. Increases were seen in Burglary, other offences and Pedal Cycle theft.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) incident levels have increased from 111 in the previous period to 143 in the latest 3 month period.

Comberton Ward (Comberton)

Crime

- Total crime in Comberton has increased to 13 offences reported during the last three month period. This is still comparably low and is consistent with the same period last year.
- Two pedal cycles were reported stolen in April on South Street and Green End.
- Also in April, 2 shed burglaries were reported in which a number of power tools and other equipment were stolen from a property on Church Lane and 2 off-road motorcycles were stolen from a property on Bush Close.
- In addition to this, there was a burglary offence in March targeting a storage shed on the recreation ground, whereby offender(s) have knocked out a number of bricks to gain entry. Nothing was believed to be stolen. A similar offence was reported in Hardwick which targeted metal. It is likely this is l inked to the Hardwick offences.
- A further 2 offences reported in April relate to vehicles found with a window smashed. These offences appear to have occurred on the same

GARDEN CHALLENGES

What do you do when you move into a new house with a garden that has been utterly neglected and become woodland at the end? The questions put to me were: should the uncontrolled woodland be retained? Should it be slimmed down? Or should it be removed altogether? How can woodland be incorporated in a small garden?

Planning and planting

For me, trees make a garden, so I would be reluctant to take a slash and burn approach. Trees add vertical structure and so provide a backdrop, in this case, at the end of the garden. Thinning out weak specimens seems sensible to provide space for small woodland planting schemes. The question then is how to plan the planting? Woodland areas invite you to walk through and appreciate the habitat. Careful mapping of trees onto squared paper for a scale plan is very useful for considering alternative plans. Woodland paths need to meander and to have patches of light coming through the canopy to enable a variety of plants to thrive. Spring flowering plants are most likely to be successful owing to their flowering season coinciding with deciduous trees being bare of leaves. Areas adjacent to the wooded area can also be drawn into the woodland planting scheme, so that the planting looks to be a natural part of the garden. Small drifts of snowdrops can provide effective early colour; these can be fol-



lowed by primroses and later bluebells. Cyclamen at the boundary entrance from the garden can provide late summer and autumn colour.

Management

Woodland areas within a garden have to be managed. This work needs to be appreciated and factored in at the start of planning the garden. Each tree should be identified and its expected height estimated from handbooks of trees. Potential giants are not good for a small garden, so should be considered for elimination. If soil conditions permit, shrubs such as azaleas and rhododendrons are a useful idea for late spring or early summer colour.

Margins of woodland

This strip between the woodland area and the garden proper, is vital for merging the boundary and making it look natural. With natural woodland, there is often an area of shrubby material that softens the transition from flat land to wood. A similar effect can be achieved in the garden by using larger shrubs at the edge and tapering away towards the centre of the boundary like a shallow V-shape. This entices the onlooker to move into the woodland. In front of the shrubs it is useful to have large perennials that diminish in size down to the lawn or hard surface. This softening with different planting makes the rest of the garden an integral part of the woodland. R.T. Choke



SUMMER LAWN CARE

Mowing

Mow regularly at the summer height this month. To remove stems that develop this time of year, rake lawn prior to mowing to present them for cutting, otherwise they can remain prostrate in the lawn.

Patio/Driveway Weed Control
