The Parish Council met on 9 May 2012.

Annual business

The first business at the Annual meeting was the election of the Chairman and appointment of members to committees and working groups.

There followed the annual review of the committee, working groups and member responsibilities. All members were appointed to either a committee or a working group or have an area of responsibility. Many serve on one or more working groups.

All the Council's policies were reviewed and the standing orders updated to reflect current practice.

The Valley affordable housing development

The Parish Council has been notified that the first residents, all with Comberton connections, should move into the new homes in late May. The public open space together with a sum of £10,000+ will be transferred to the Parish Council by the end of May. The money is for the future maintenance of the land.

Herringland Charity Jubilee Bench

The Council considered an offer from the Charity who wanted to provide a bench for the village to mark the Queen's Jubilee. The Parish Council has accepted this kind offer and will take over responsibility for the bench's maintenance once installed.

Parish Council Annual Audit

The Parish Council received and considered the internal auditors report and following this it approved its annual accounts. The accounts will be sent to Moore Stephens the external auditor by 6 June.

Recreation ground

At the request of the Council the Clerk briefly summarised the history of the recreation ground land extension. Over the years the Parish Council had attempted to purchase the field to the north of the recreation ground (the land extension). As the years went by each time an approach was made to the owners the price had risen.

Once the Parish Council had had a valuation undertaken by the District

Valuation Services it made an offer to the land owners based on that valuation which was turned down. They stated their price which was £10,000+ higher. The release into the public domain of the Council's confidential minutes from that period would clearly demonstrate that the Council acted in good faith and in the interests of the village and its residents as a whole striving to obtain the land for both sports pitches and also for recreation and public open space. The Parish Council's aim and desire was to have the additional land for the use and benefit of the village as an additional recreational area.

When the restrictions on the land use as "sports pitches" as a condition of the sale were raised the Council resolutely negotiated to have these removed and ensure that the land could be used not only for sport but also for other recreational uses.

These negotiations lasted several years and finally despite the restrictive covenants below the Council went ahead with the purchase firmly believing this was in the interest of the village as a whole; its intention remaining that it would be available for the maximum number of residents, i.e. all user groups to use and benefit from. The Parish Council is very aware of the risk associated with the tree planting and has been exploring ways to mitigate this. As reported in the last Contact the Council has written to Messrs Topham and Banks about the trees and at the time of writing await their reply.

The Parish Council will be reviewing its confidential minutes from that period and will make a decision shortly on how much can be released into the public domain. Residents are assured that the Council will release as much as possible. It may be however, until the matter of the covenants have been resolved that some of the information has to remain unpublished. Advice is being sought on this.

CCC Surface Dressing Programme

The County Council is about to begin a £2 million project to ensure hundreds of kilometers of Cambridgeshire roads are maintained and improved. The surface dressing programme, using a thin film of bitumen and stone chippings, keeps the road surface in good condition and improves safety for all road users. The technique costs around 20% of conventional asphalt resurfacing, enabling a far greater length of road to be treated from within the available financial resources. Starting from May 8 work will be carried out in all areas of Cambridgeshire (full list available from the County Council).

be tempting to borrow money from illegal money lenders, known as 'loan sharks', who lend cash without asking questions about your financial situation. Trading Standards urge you to avoid such lenders and assure you that there are safe, reliable lenders that you can use.

Loan sharks may call at your door or you might hear about them from other people. At first they seem friendly and helpful and it might seem like a quick and easy way to borrow money. The trouble is that these people usually charge huge interest on their loan, meaning you have to pay back much more than you borrowed and far more than you can afford. With no paperwork to record what you are expected to repay, a loan of a few hundred pounds can soon lead to a demand to repay thousands of pounds - and the debt can quickly become too much to ever repay. If you struggle to keep up the repayments, loan sharks may use intimidation, threats and even violence to ensure you find the money somehow. It is believed that around 310,000 households in the UK currently owe money to loan sharks.

Luckily there are safe places you can borrow money from, even if you have financial difficulties. These lenders stick to the law, make it clear from the start the total amount you will need to repay and collect your repayments in a lawful way. Your local Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) can advise you which lenders are most suitable for you. You can find your nearest Bureau by visiting www.citizensadvice.org.uk or by calling 08444 111 444.

The England Illegal Money Lending Team was set up because of the misery and fear that loan sharks cause. Cambridgeshire County Council are working with this team and local District Councils, to tackle loan sharks in the county, raise awareness of them and to support their victims.
