

Memorial Bench

In response to the clarification on the design and stability of the proposed bench and a petition supporting its installation the Parish Council approved the design and installation of the bench. Graffiti in the village

There has been a spate of graffiti in the village. Thanks are expressed to the District Council for arranging the removal of some of this. The Police are to be asked to patrol the areas.

Buses

Despite representations the county Council is going to stop its subsidy for the late night Friday bus.

Primary School Bus

The Parish Council shares the Meridian Primary School's concerns about the County Council's proposed loss of the Toft to Meridian School transport route. The Parish Council does not consider it safe for young children to walk. There are many reasons for these concerns one of which is the anticipated increase in traffic that will result from the Village College Sixth Form opening shortly. It will be writing to the county Council to urge it to reconsider its proposals. *Tree works*

The Parish Council is responsible for a lot of trees throughout the village and it is very grateful to its Tree Warden and other volunteers who assist the Parish Council monitor and maintain the trees throughout the year. All trees from time to time need routine maintenance and on occasion a tree will need to be removed. The Parish Council regrets that it is not always possible to give advance notice of works or tree removals in the Comberton Contact.

The Parish Council is very grateful to the five residents and Comberton Contact who have all sponsored new or replacement trees either on the Recreation Ground land extension or in Green End. Thank you.

If anyone else would like to sponsor a tree on the land extension, please contact the Clerk.

Hu'ta' QISt! Hu'bejta'!

Before I translate the mysterious title, I ought to apologise to you all for being rather late. My excuse is the formula for the dating of Easter which, due to the intricacies of the lunar calendar on which it is based - a throwback to the Sumerian calendar system, I'm afraid – this year placed Easter nearer this issue of Contact than the previous.

Easter is such an unpromising title for this premier event in the Church's calendar. According to St Bede, the medieval monk and first historian of England, *Eostre* was the Saxon name of the month of April. Somewhat unfortunately, *Eostre* was a Germanic name of the pagan goddess of the Dawn, whom we also know as *Eos* (Latin), *Aurora* (Greek) and *Ishtar* (Babylonian and Assyrian). 

OUTCOME OF THE CONSULTATION REGARDING BUS Service Changes for 17 April 2011

May I take the opportunity to inform you of the outcome of the recent consultation conducted with regard to changes and reductions being made to some bus



services which are supported by financial contributions from Cambridgeshire County Council funds. The consultation period closed on Friday 11 March 2011 and we would like to thank everyone who responded and encouraged others to do so.

Why the consultation came about

The majority of bus services in Cambridgeshire (about 80%) are provided by commercial operators without any subsidy from the Council. However, the Council subsidises some bus services where bus operators are currently unable to operate commercially. There is no statutory duty for the Council to provide this, nor do we receive specific funding from Government to do so.

Due to reduced overall grants to councils from Government coupled with increased costs of, and for, services it will not be possible to continue the subsidy. The County Council needs to make savings of around £160 million over the next five years and some of these savings have to come from the transport budget. Consequently, Full Council agreed to phase out funding for subsidised bus services over the next four years and agreed to a reduction of £654,000 in subsidised services in 2011 / 2012. We therefore sought views on the proposed changes and wanted to hear proposals from local communities, voluntary groups and bus operators.

How we went about the consultation

Cambridgeshire County Council sent a consultation request to every County Councillor, District Councillor, Parish Chair and Parish Clerk across the county. Some 806 requests were sent out on 22 February 2011; 654 by email and 152 by post. The consultation request outlined the proposed services under threat of cut from 17 April 2011 and invited a response.

The Council also informed the county's media (print and broadcast) and placed the consultation request on the Cambridgeshire County Council website. Again, the council invited a response and published contact details for doing so and the responses were duly logged.

Responses received to the consultation request

A total of 97 responses were received; 8 from county or district councillors, 19 from parish councils and 70 from residents. In addition, a petition was submitted with around 200 signatures about the removal of the evening service 9 journeys to Milton and was received by the County Council's cabinet on 15 March.

The largest number of individual responses (22) were for service 33, although these were commenting on a change that has not actually been proposed and had been reported incorrectly in local media. Eight services received no comments.

The comments received were largely around limiting independence; in particular



CONTAINER GARDENING

Structure can be added to a garden by using various devices. Many of these are architectural, for example adding a wall, or scooping out a hollow. Both can be very expensive and time consuming to make. A simple, cheap way is to buy interesting plant containers. These can vary from pots to large planters. Large



pots, raised above the ground on small appropriately coloured brick platforms, can become a focal point. Tall Cretan style pots are useful for creating a slightly Mediterranean look. Make sure that you have frost-resistant pots, otherwise a very cold winter like the past one may lead to frost cracking. An alternative would be to have plastic imitation terracotta pots. These come in a wide range of sizes and styles; good quality ones have a surface texture that avoids the plastic look.

Siting containers

A raised large pot draws attention to itself. If the surface of the pot is a pale colour, it will look good against a dark surface such as a hedge. The classic arrangement for a group of pots is for the largest container to be at the back, and the others arranged to create a triangle with a slightly smaller container to the side and a smaller one still to form the point of the triangle at the front. A formal arrangement of two pots placed either side of a doorway adds symmetry to the entrance.

Good planting in containers

Formal planting is in vogue for containers by a doorway. Plants grown as a standard, that is with a woody stem stripped of side branches to give a tiny tree-shaped effect, are popular. The plant might be a standard rose, a standard fuchsia, or simply a standard bay tree. They look neat, but to my mind lack the artistry that can be achieved by varied planting. I prefer an informal planting with a tall-growing plant at the centre, such as a dark leaved cordyline. A mixed planting of pink and cream flowers around the cordyline could look good, with perhaps blue flowers mixed in to break the strawberry and cream effect. A trailing leaf plant, such as helichrysum, grown round the edge of the container adds to the pot.

Keeping pots at their best


Firstly, ensure the growing medium has good quality compost mixed in the soil. This will ensure that the pots retain their water content for as long as possible. Secondly, make sure that the pots contain plenty of plant food to provide good growth and a long flowering season. Above all water the pots in the early morning so that the plants do not wilt in the noonday sun. R.T. Choke

LAWN CARE IN MAY

In most seasons this is the best month for weed killing with either a selective weed killer or a weed and feed fertiliser. Selective means that the weed killer will only affect the weeds and leave the grass unharmed. As the weed recedes and dies back so the grass that it was previously strangling can branch (tiller) out to take the place of the weed.

When choosing fertiliser ensure that you are putting on what the grass needs which is predominately Nitrogen, but it may also need Phosphate, Potassium, Magnesium and other trace elements.

Continue mowing, and increase the frequency. The grass will look and grow



better if cut little and often, rather than one big cut. This month cut no lower than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch (2 cm).

Whilst there is usually plenty of moisture around in the soil, the grass will grow vigorously. However following a very dry winter and early spring, and with hot sunshine in Summer this can cause drought conditions in our lawns. If you do plan to water your lawn then make sure it is watered properly. By this I mean let the water soak in at least 7-10 cm (3-4"), other wise you can do more harm than good by literally only wetting the surface. It is better to water once a week and to do it properly than 2 or 3 times poorly.

Actions required in May

- Feed lawn with a balanced fertiliser
- Treat weeds with herbicide once actively growing.
- Mow lawn lightly. Don't cut shorter than ³/₄ inches (2 cm) this month. Grass will respond better if cut little and often.
- Neaten edges of lawn with half moon edging tool.
- Possible irrigation requirement
