Comberton Jubilee Walk





PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 11 April 2012.

S137 Donations

The Parish Council agreed the following donations St Mary's Church £750 (churchyard upkeep) and Comberton Scouts £600 (to support their work with the youth of the village) and Cambs. County Council Summer Reading Challenge £40.

Friday night late night bus service

Cllr. Haranzgo was unable to attend the meeting so his report was carried forward to a future meeting when more information will be available. *Bus Subsidies - What You May Like to Know*

The County Council subsidise 20% of public transport in Cambridgeshire at a cost of around £2.7 million per year. Work is already underway with operators to see if changes to routes and timetables could make some marginal subsidised journeys commercially viable and therefore reduce this financial commitment. Before any subsidy is removed it is planned to carry out consultation to find out people's public transport needs. For more information contact Dan Clarke on 01223 729079.

Comberton Playground Project

A group of residents are setting up a charity in the village with the aim to fund raise for new children's play equipment. At its meeting the Parish Council agreed it was willing in principle to recognise, and accept donations from this charity, when formed and it identified £4656.30 that the CPP could use as seed funding towards any grant applications that it makes for children's play equipment in Comberton. Simon Moffat was appointed the Parish Council's Trustee on the new Charity.

Recreation ground

The Parish Council received a report from its Recreation Ground Working Group (RWG). The RWG had received confirmation that works to the car park would not prejudice an application to the Football Foundation in the future.

Tim Lodge of Agrostis is to be appointed at the next meeting to assist with the land extension project

The following sequence of events were agreed

- Meet the football clubs and Cambridgeshire FA to agree the pitch layout
- Obtain quotes to carry out the proposed work on the recreation ground extension and extension and refurbishment of the pavilion.
- Invite quotes from architects to draw up plans for the refurbishment and extension of the pavilion
- Submit applications for grant funding.

A letter has been sent to Messrs Topham and Banks who sold the land extension to the Parish Council regarding the covenants on the land. A reply is awaited.







birthday, he was too old to go out in public and the rumour in the market towns beyond the walls of his estate was that the king was no longer alive. Indeed, many wondered if he had ever been.

The law of the monarch's lands had long been entrusted to the mayors and sheriffs in the towns and over time had been so rewritten that most of the Old Law had long been forgotten. Every so often adventurers and curious treasure seekers would attempt to gain entry of the King's estate. Many thought they had to climb the high walls, but the walls were too high and they could not get over, even with their longest ladders. The estate was so vast and the walls for such a distance that no-one seemed to know where the gates were, and many a powerful and proud knight would try to find the gates but after a long time searching in forests and pressing through deep undergrowth would return discouraged and confidently pronounce to all who would listen that there was no estate, for no gate could be found.

On the other hand, many knew folk who confidently told of their entering through the gate, explaining that the gate was small, a mere wicket gate, easily missed and which for certain no grand knight would be able to ride through. The gate could admit only those on foot, taking nothing but what they stood up in. The gate, they said, had an old sign which said, in the ancient tongue, 'Trespassers Will Not Be Prosecuted.'

Many said that was a misprint, for surely it meant, 'Trespassers Will Be Prosecuted', but those who claimed to come and go in and out through the gate insisted that the sign meant what it said. Far from being prosecuted themselves, they claimed they had discovered all their criminal records erased, outstanding county court judgements discharged or unpaid fines paid in full. (The Gate Folk, as they were known, had generally once had quite a lot of these for they were, if the truth be known, rather a disreputable bunch, although they were by and large quite well-behaved now, most of the time.)

Many of the townsfolk shook their heads at such silliness, but the Gate Folk exchanged knowing smiles with each other and quietly enjoyed their freedom to enter the King's Estate, and share their story with any poor enough to be willing to listen to their tales.

NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All

At the same time as writing this (well, not simultaneously, obviously!) I am planning the Professional Development Day with which we start the Summer Term. I often think that these Professional Development Days are probably a bit of a mystery to those who do not work in schools. We are required to have five of them each year – and the Headteacher decides their content together with the staff and governors. They cover a wide range of activities.

For example, the one I am currently thinking about will start with a 'business meeting' where we plan the events of the term in some detail, making sure that things don't clash and that staff have notice of what is happening. The Summer Term is always astonishingly busy with national tests taking place, lots of sporting events, trips and visits, and transition arrangements for those leaving us to go to secondary school and, at the other end, the very young children joining us. Once we have sorted all that, we will be reviewing an important school policy, which the governors have asked us to look at. Then, in the afternoon, a group of staff (including some Teaching Assistants) will be undertaking some training delivered by an outside provider on writing Risk Assessments, while others will be meeting, planning, setting up their classrooms for the new term etc.

Sometimes, we have to undertake some very specific training – in Child Protection, for example, which all staff must renew every three years. Or we may join up with other schools to share expertise. In January this year



BUS SUBSIDIES - WHAT YOU MAY LIKE TO KNOW

Around 80 per cent of public transport in Cambridgeshire is run commercially with the remaining 20 per cent being subsidised by the County Council, at a cost of around £2.7 million per year. Work is already underway with operators to see if changes to routes and timetables could make some marginal subsidised journeys commercially viable and therefore reduce this financial commitment. The Council has also reviewed the way subsidies are currently paid and has started a phased three year change programme. Over the next three years the Council will be transforming how these subsidised services are delivered, resulting in an annual investment of £1.5 million. Before any subsidy is removed it is planned to carry out consultation to find out people's public transport needs. Everyone will be invited to contribute and work together to find the best and most cost effective way of meeting that need. The results will vary across the County and one size will not fit all. Solutions may include local operators, smaller vehicles, links to commercial hubs, such as the Busway or Park and Ride as well as direct routes to certain destinations and flexible dial a ride type services. If there is enough demand it could lead to more travel opportunities, not less. If the best solution to deliver an essential service is to retain the current form of subsidy, then that will still be an option. The new initiatives will be rolled out under the banner of Cambridgeshire Future Transport starting from April 2012. Subsidised services have been grouped into 13 geographical areas which have transport links within them and these areas will be reviewed in three tranches over the next three years. This is so that these rvices can be looked at as a whole and alternative sexplored.More information will be released and public engagement will be carried out as each phase of reducing the subsidy starts.



DEAR CONTACT/COMBERTON RESIDENTS

I have been reading, with some interest, the comments made about the purchase of the land to the North of the existing Recreation Ground (Rec). As a resident of Comberton for nearly 30 years I am fully aware of the saga of this acquisition. I thought the original argument was that more sports pitches were required for the ever expanding village community! I also believe the purchase was a "sweetener" for the fact that Messes Banks and Topham wanted to sell the field, to the east of Olde Farm, Green End, for housing. Going back to 1987 they wanted to build at least 240 houses on this site. Something that will now happen in the future, due to the fact that the original (now bankrupt) developers managed to "panic" the Parish Council (PC) into giving permission for 11 "affordable" homes (as opposed to the original, rejected, application for 24, then 19). Soon Comberton will become another Cambourne. Having obtained, what has, in effect, become a "wasteland", arguments now appear to be breaking out in various parts of the community as to what exactly the land was purchased for!! I fully sympathise with parents needing football pitches closer to home and can see why Comberton Crusaders would want to work with the PC on this project. That is now a non starter, due to the amount of tree planting! It would make more sense now for the Community College (CVC) to offer their facilities to the younger children, when the original football pitches (on the Rec) are unavailable. I'm sure they are not in use full time and arrangements could be made, instead of the expense of using surrounding villages' pitches! I can also appreciate, as someone who walks dogs (and cleans up after them!!), why the tree planting would be beneficial to our environment. BUT, as has been pointed out, this won't be in our lifetime and we do have Watts Wood, (which the PC purchased for the princely sum of £1 and appears to do little to manage, apart from employing the odd contractor to go and hack a way through the paths). It would be nice to see it (Watts Wood) a bit more tidy, with wood piles for the wildlife, rather than just left where it fell, and trees

given some attention, which would prolong their lives. I strongly suspect, in time, the trees on the new Rec. will receive the same fate, if they last that long, as I see some have already been knocked down! We now appear to have some new blood on the PC. Let's see some action by them getting their act together and working for and with the community they are suppose to represent. I suggest they start by clearing all the Ragwort and other weeds from the Rec. extension and burning them. At least it would look a bit more tidy.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR OF CONTACT

Comberton Recreation Ground Extension

I would like to preface my comments about the above project having been a resident of Comberton for almost 48 years. In 1967 I was co-opted onto the Parish Council and subsequently served on the Council for 32 years having been "elected" on several occasions. Throughout my membership of the Council, and since, there has been an almost continuous dialogue with the sports clubs about how the Recreation Ground should be managed but without any agreement. To be fair the Bowls Club has always expressed a wish to remain an independent club being responsible for their area of the Rec. The Tennis Club also expressed the same wish until they decided to abandon their facilities on the Rec. in favour of those offered by Combert on Village College. This resulted in the Cricket and Football clubs not being the control of the contprepared to accept responsibility for the management of the remainder of the Rec. I am also concerned with some of the proposals made by the Comberton Crusaders Football Club which, in the present economic climate, seem too ambitious and committed to the total use of the Recreation Ground extension for football to the exclusion of other interests. I must say that I was never in favour of the Parish Council purchasing so much land in order to extend the Rec. which cost in the region of £60,000 for the land and an excessive amount in legal costs of around £20,000. The cost per acre of this poorly drained and low grade arable land was quite excessive. However, the Parish Council in their wisdom acquired the land and frankly since then they have had little or no idea what to do with it. To be planting a wood on a substantial area of this expensive extension is unacceptable. This brings me to the reason for my letter which is about the information given in the April edition of Contact by a "Comberton Resident". I am very surprised to read that the Recreation Ground Extension conveyance document may include a Restrictive Covenant which prohibits the planting of trees on this land and that a substantial tree planting project is being carried out by the Parish Council possibly in breach of the covenant. If the facts quoted in the Contact letter are correct or otherwise it is essential that the Parish Council publicly clarifies the position without delay. During the negotiations for the purchase of this land, which continued for at least 2 years, members of the public were frequently excluded from the monthly Parish Council meetings when the Council discussed the purchase. I attended almost all of the monthly Parish Council meetings during the purchase

negotiations, as I have done for many years, and yet it was never possible for local residents to know how the negotiations were proceeding on their behalf. I was never happy with the exclusion of the public from these discussions. It would seem that the Parish Council were continually advised by their legal representatives to maintain onfidentiality regarding the negotiations which I feel should have been challenged. The public have a right to know how their Council Tax is being spent and that transparency in all levels of Government is essential whenever possible. In view of the possible existence of a Restrictive Covenant regarding tree planting, it seems to me that failure to keep the local residents informed during the protracted purchase negotiations is the reason why the matter has only just come to light. The residents of the village should be informed of what is or is not permitted in the Purchase Conveyance as far as the development of the Rec. Extension is concerned without further delay. In fact there can be no reason why this document should not be made available in the public domain immediately. Comberton April 2012 Keith Banyard

MAGNIFICENT MAY

This transition month between spring and summer provides a little stability in temperature. The cyclonic weather of April should have dissipated and we are not yet into the heat of summer. May is a superb time for blossom trees and shrubs. I particularly like the special hawthorns in the hedgerow and the brilliant crimson weeping garden varieties; Crataegus laevigata 'Punicea' is well worth having and has an informal habit, consequently it is good at the edge of the garden. For a spectacular leafed tree, try *Acer pseudoplatanus 'Brilliantissimum'*; this is a maple with salmon pink leaves when they first unfurl which later turn to pale green in summer. They are very good against a dark background foliage, for example a yew tree. Towards the end of the month, the mock orange shrub, *Philadelphus cononaria*, does well in our village; their white flowers have a lovely orange scent. Don't forget the lilacs; there are many varieties to choose from with fine flower spikes ranging from white, through many shades of pink to purple and on to blue. Most lilacs also have a great scent. There is a wonderful specimen on the road between Comberton and Toft at the turn to Toft Church. May bulbs I recently saw that Prince Charles' home at Highgrove has a semiwild meadow planted with exquisite blue camassias and purple-flowered drum-stick alliums. This is a lovely plant combination. The last flowering narcissus of the season is the lovely white Pheasant's eye, N. poeticus; it does well when naturalised in clusters under a tree on the lawn. Tulips are versatile plants with varieties flowering in March with others coming into flower in May. I like 'Inferno' which is a multi-headed variety with deep pink flowers. A fine yellow tulip is 'Georgette' with an orange edge to each petal. Take time out to visit a bluebell wood; Waresley Wood usually has a superb show.

To do When the frosts appear to have finished in late May, think about planting out your tomato plants and runner beans. There are many local gardens to visit: on 6th May many gardens are open in Chaucer Road, Cambridge; on 20th May visit the Barton gardens; the Ely gardens are open on 27th May. R.T. Choke
