

The Parish Council met on 10th March 2013

S137 donations

The following donations were approved - £40 to the County Council for the Summer Reading Challenge and £750 from St Mary's Church.

Comberton Housing Needs Survey

Mark Deas, from Cambridgeshire Action for Communities in Rural England (ACRE), attended the meeting and reported on the results of the recent survey undertaken in the village. He reported that the survey results identified a need for 47 new affordable homes in Comberton and he sought the Parish Council's support to identify a suitable site which would take between 8-10 homes. The Council indicated its support for affordable housing and its Affordable Housing Working Group will liaise with Mr Deas and report to a future meeting.

Recreation ground update

The Parish Council approved an awareness raising and fund raising event to be held by the Play Equipment Group and Comberton Bowls Club on the Recreation Ground

Tenders are being sought to extend the recreation ground car park by laying down hard core and gravel onto the grassed area to the east of the car park but on the car park side of the wooden barrier.

Agrostis have reported on the recreation ground sports pitch development project and the tenders received. These are to be considered by the Recreation Ground Working Group (RWG) which will make a recommendation to a future Council meeting. The District Council has awarded a grant of £2,500 towards the proposed works.

Coton - Comberton Cycle Path

It was agreed to write to the landowners along the eastern side of Long Road to ask for permission for a Permissive Path over their land

Children of all ages are very welcome at all our 9.30am services - when the service is not all-age, there are always children's activities in the Barn. As always the church building is open every weekend. It's a lovely Spring walk up the causeway or across the fields. Everybody is very welcome to find peace and to explore our ancient parish church building.

CAN WE TRUST IN LABELS?

'Don't judge a book by its cover,' he said, as he handed me a battered crumbling volume that seemed to have seen ancient service as a door stop or as a hastily improvised solution to the problem of a vertically-challenged table leg. Its black ripped hardback outer and its dog-eared and much thumbed pages were frankly uninviting, its text too small, its pages too numerous and its language too foreign to be worthy any attention. I reassured him I would indeed read it with interest, confident this was the last thing I should do.I took the book home and left it on the corner of my desk for a number of days. I ignored it and I was fairly sure it ignored me, but somehow I was not entirely sure. In those few weeks a number of questions formed and began to nag me, at the back of my mind. I became irritated by their persistence. As I am not known for being the fastest whippet around the track, I feel sure you will have thought of these curiosities yourself and in your own way. Mine came to me in the form of exam. questions like those I was set at school for a time (such a very long while ago now).

'If a value of something is what a person will pay for it, which most often is the price someone has put on it, what is actual value of a human being? Discuss.' Another was this: 'What is true goodness, and why?' In the small hours when sleep was just around the corner but clearly was not going to wander my way, another would gnaw at me: 'Where does the meaning of a life or a planet or a universe come from?' Try as I might to ignore these impertinent questions, I found that they deserved an answer. Who was to judge what price to place on a life, who was good and what is full of meaning. Who could tie on such labels, ones that were true and not patently false? Me? Hardly. You? (I will leave you to be the judge.) I then found myself idly thumbing this ancient, battered and much ignored book. As I read it slowly began to dawn on me that this book



to say we do have some concerns. Let's start with the positives: the curriculum was well overdue for a rewrite (the current one dates from the early 1990s); we are also pleased that it has remained a statement of <u>content</u>, the 'how' remains the school's domain, so each setting can deliver the curriculum in a way suited to its own context.

However, there are some aspects of the proposed curriculum which are disturbing. In general, it is very knowledge-based. In other words, it lists lots of facts which children need to know but there is precious little about the skills they need to acquire. The teaching of skills, including the skills of how to learn, are a vital part of our everyday work and it is worrying that the government does not seem to see the importance of this in a child's development.

But, in common with a large body of opinion in the country, it is the proposed History curriculum which disturbs us most of all – especially at KS2. Currently, children study a selection of themes in KS2. These include the Ancient Egyptians, World War 2, and the Victorians. I do take the Secretary of State's point that children should be taught a chronological view of History (young children can get very confused about what came after what). However, we were horrified to read that none of the three topics mentioned above will be part of the proposed History curriculum. Instead children will start in KS2 with the Stone Age and move relentlessly onwards until they reach Cromwell, and the Glorious Revolution, at the end of primary school.

The Egyptians, Victorians and WW2, as all primary teachers know, are themes which really interest and engage young children. I'm sure we can all remember the excitement of learning about pyramids, mummies and hieroglyphics – gruesome and fascinating at the same time! As for the Victorians and WW2, one of the major reasons why children are so engaged by these topics is that we have such a wealth of information of how children lived in those periods. Victorian schools, young servants, WW2 evacuation – all these bring History alive for children today. The opportunities for dressing-up, taking on roles and visiting centres which specialise in bringing the period to life (Duxford Museum and Wimpole Hall are just two local examples) are an integral part of our teaching these periods of history. I fear that childhood in the time of Cromwell will not have the same wealth of evidence – or the same resonance - for children today.

On behalf of the staff I have responded to the National Curriculum consultation and expressed our concerns about the future of History teaching. I'm afraid I don't hold out much hope...





PEOPLE who live in South Cambridgeshire can now get the latest news on policing issues in their area by following officers online. Officers already have the @SouthCambsCops account on Twitter to provide followers with news on a variety of police-related matters including crimes, crime prevention, court results and community issues. Now, they are engaging with communities online by encouraging residents to complete an online survey and launching a new blog. At a recent panel meeting in Histon, more than 70 people completed an online survey that helped shape local policing priorities set at the meeting. Throughout this, Sergeant Paul Rogerson tweeted live updates and a number of suggestions were raised on Twitter during the meeting resulting in a road safety priority being set. Inspector Chris Savage said: "The Twitter account is a quick way for people to dip in and out of the work we do. It also allows followers to share this information with friends, family or colleagues. "During the panel meeting it was an opportunity for us to reach an audience that might not have shown an interest, or expressed an opinion before. This worked well as people raised road safety concerns about the A14 junction with Bridge Road, motorists jumping red lights, using mobile phones and parking. "Sgt Rogerson will now meet the residents group to talk about what more can be done." Officers have also launched a new blog to provide regular updates on policing in the area. The blog includes updates on local panel meetings and current policing priorities. Insp Savage added: "The blog will be used to share crime prevention advice and consult with local residents online. The first twenty prime numbers are :- 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 11, 13, 17, 19, 23, 29, 31, 37, 41, 43, 47, 53, 59, 61 and 67. Using these A (the sum of the twenty cubes) is 1267055. B (the total of the twenty prime numbers SQUARED) is 323761 and C (the sum of the twenty individually squared numbers) is 24967.

Therefore 4B = 1295044 less 1267055 and 24967 gives you 3022, divided by two = 1511 = Year of the foundation of St. Johns. Cambridge.
