

Proposed affordable housing development Long Road

Hundred Housing the housing association is still interested in providing housing in the village and to be involved in any public consultations. I stress that the Parish Council has not reached any decision or view on this proposal. The purpose of the public consultation is to seek the views of residents, take into account the housing need in the village and make an informed decision.

Emergency Parish Planning

Lawrence Green from South Cambridgeshire District Council attended the September meeting to outline how the Parish Council and Local Authority can work together to improve our response should a major incident occur that effects the village. At the October meeting the Parish Council agreed to complete an emergency plan with appropriate contact details and to send this to the District Council Officer.

Queen Elizabeth II challenge

The Parish Council will be making an application to permanently protect the recreation ground and land extension and also Watts Wood as part of a national challenge. The programme is to create permanent, tangible and relevant legacy from the two major events scheduled to occur in the UK in 2012; Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee and the London 2012 Olympics.

The Challenge will permanently protect a network of 2012 outdoor recreational spaces by 2012 – the Queen Elizabeth II Fields.

Comberton Pond

As you may be aware the pond has been cordoned off for most of the summer due to a blue/green algae outbreak. All residents are urged to observe the warning signs. There is also very little water in the pond at the moment and litter and other debris can now been seen in the pond. The Council is making arrangements for this to be cleared and is also considering having the silt taken out of the pond.

SCDC - Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment - Publication of List of Sites

The review and update of the District Council's planning policies is now underway. One of the first actions is to identify potential housing sites for inclusion in the new plan which will be the subject of a public consultation on Issues & Options next summer. This has taken the form of a Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment Call for Sites whereby in June and July a general invitation was issued for landowners, developers, agents, organisation or the public to put to the District Council sites that they would like to be considered for inclusion in the new plan.

The District Council has received a large number of sites suggested for housing development, many more than will be needed to add to our existing plans in order to provide for the growth of the local economy and to meet housing needs.

The sites to be registered and assessed are available to view on the District Council's website: <u>www.scambs.gov.uk/ldf/shlaa</u>, either as a list or using an interactive map.



NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All

You may recall that, at around this time last year, we had an official opening of the Habitats Garden in school. This project had taken about two years to bring to fruition and was partly funded by the National Lottery. The space had previously been a walled area housing a freestanding small swimming pool and changing rooms. These had not been used for several years, however, and the area was turning into something of a dumping ground. After a lot of consultation with children, parents and staff, we decided to turn it an educational garden. Although it was opened last year, work has continued and we now have added seating and a small stage area. There is a pergola with vines beginning to create shade, a raised dry garden, a little meadow and lots of bird and insect boxes.

As always with something new, it takes a while for people to remember it's there and to utilise it to the full. However, I have been delighted recently to see its use extending. Our younger children (in Foundation and Key Stage 1) have a very tricky problem to solve at the moment. Their teachers have introduced them to three garden gnomes who are homeless (they are brothers who have fallen out, apparently!) The work coming from this scenario is wonderfully cross-curricular. The children receive letters from the gnomes and have to consider how to help; they write back to the gnomes; come up with solutions (how do you get gnomes to make friends again?); and are now designing and making 'gnome homes'. And where better for gnomes to live than in our lovely Habitats Garden? But first, of course, you have to find out who else lives there. A great excuse for finding, drawing and researching 'minibeasts'. As you can see, the possibilities are endless...and are being fully exploited by the teaching staff.

Meanwhile, older children have discovered the joy of being read to whilst sitting outside in a beautiful environment. And plans are afoot to use the little stage I mentioned for outdoor drama work, in particular for becoming immersed in some of Shakespeare's plots and language.

So, a big 'thank you' to the governors for their support of this project, to the PTA for funds and ongoing maintenance, to our Site Manager for lots of additional building work, and to the staff for embracing its use. Now it's over to you! We have always wanted the Garden to be a community space. Perhaps you are involved with a group who would like to come and visit – young or more senior, all are very welcome. Just get in touch with the office. We look forward to seeing you!

COMBERTON VILLAGE COLLEGE: A Note from the Principal

One of the 'Big New Ideas' from the Coalition Government regarding education relates to 'Teaching Schools'. This is the suggestion that some schools nationally should be designated with this title. The notion and the terminology are based on the model of 'Teaching Hospitals'. Some schools are to be seen as beacons of good practice and should take the lead in the training and the professional development of the teaching profession.

In truth, this big new idea is a further move along a direction of travel that has been taking place for some time. This is not entirely uncommon in educational policy: Academies were, of course, a Labour Party policy (even if many in the Labour Party did not like the policy). The philosophy behind Teaching Schools is that of 'Schools leading Schools'. It is rooted in the belief that the expertise and the capacity to help all schools to improve lies within schools themselves. External experts and policy directives from on high are not the most powerful means by which to drive forward educational standards in our schools. The most powerful thing to do is to engage this school-based capacity and expertise and ensure that it is used for the benefit of all schools and for the effective training and development of all staff.

Comberton Village College has been asked to become one of the first Teaching Schools in the country. We are happy to do this. It fits with our belief in the philosophy of 'by Schools, for Schools'. It also strongly fits with much of the work that we have been doing in recent years to work with other schools to secure mutual improvement and with work in the areas of training and professional development. The application was not difficult to complete: it was largely a matter of confirming how we already significantly work in the ways suggested.

One important part about our approach is that we do not want to take on this role in isolation. In some ways, it would be a contradiction in terms to try to do so. We have thus sought from the outset to form a partnership with other secondary and primary schools in the area that are in a position to take on this work and meet the required criteria laid down by the Government. By doing this, we hope to be able to create a great deal of capacity to make a real difference in this role.

In one sense, this can be seen as part of the enduring remit of the Village College. If one community that we seek to serve is the educational community, then playing a role as a 'Teaching School' is seeking to be at the heart of that community. Henry Morris might have liked it.

Our October speaker was Stephen Poyser who gave an excellent into beekeeping. Stephen has been keeping bees for 25 years and now runs courses for people who wish to take up the hobby. It is incredibly popular with a long waiting list. Members were amazed to learn about the sophistication and organisation of bee colonies from the dances to communicate location of pollen to the methods to keep the hive at a constant temperature all year. It is also guite a ruthless society where the males all die out in autumn and the workers only live for six weeks. Each bee will only go to one type of flower and beekeepers have a colour guide to identify the pollen from each flower. Bees are very efficient and will travel further if the nectar is high in sugar content. To produce a pound of honey the bees will fly 43,000 miles and make 56.000 visits to flowers. It certainly makes one more appreciative of honey. Many thanks to all who supported the table top sale. This was a new venture and every table was taken with a range of goodies on sale. 



RELIEVING WINTER GLOOM

November is a difficult time for appreciating garden beauty; autumn is nearly over and winter has not yet set in. For those who want an all-year garden, then

now is the time to take stock and see what is available to brighten up gloomy areas. Shrub and berry colours are most valuable and can make a magnificent contribution to early winter shades. For a fail-safe shrub try Viburnum tinus; this is an evergreen very leafy shrub with large clusters of tiny white flowers with a light scent of honey. It grows well in our area and has a long flowering season right through the winter and into late spring. The other useful viburnum is V. *farreri* with pale pink clusters of very fragrant flowers. Twigs of these can be brought into a cool room and provide an enchanting perfume. The old standby for growing against a wall or fence is the winter jasmine, Jasminum nudiflorum; this climber will produce yellow flowers until March. It is best to prune it after the flowers have finished since it flowers on new wood. Powerful yellow flowers come from the Mahonias. These form quite large shrubs, up to 2 meters in height, and are at their best in late November. To stop them from growing leggy, the shrubs can be pruned after flowering. M. media 'Charity' has multiple long spikes of golden yellow flowers, whereas M. media 'Lionel Fortescue' has lemon-coloured flowers. Place Mahonias where they can reflect the low-angled winter sun.

Conifers

Some of the golden conifers can brighten up the garden. The slow and small growing *Pinus mugo* 'Wintergold' is good value and often found in small front gardens. *Pinus Sylvestris* 'Gold coin' is excellent for gilding a late November afternoon. If you are a keen bird watcher and want to remain inside, get two or three conifers with longish needles to attract spiders and then the birds that feed on them. *Picea pungens* 'Moerheim' has glaucus needles and attracts many species of tits; with luck you might spot goldcrests that associate with flocks of bluetits.

Berries

In the wayside, there has been a good crop of berries with many ripening in the late summer sun. The Yew berries disappeared early on, and by mid-October they had all been eaten. Nevertheless, the hedgerows are laden with hawthorn berries just waiting for the fieldfares and redwings to arrive from Scandinavia. Ivy berries are beginning to turn dark blue and will provide food for the birds in December and January. R.T.Choke
