The Parish Council met on 9th October 2013

South Cambs District Council's Local Plan 2011-2031: Publication of Proposed Submission Local Plan

The Parish Council's approved its response and this has been submitted to the District Council. This is available on the website www.comberton.org.uk

Bennell Farm proposed development

In response to an offer from Mr Arnold for money towards a Comberton facility in lieu of the football pitch on the site the Parish Council agreed that the vice-Chairman should meet and discuss the proposed development and offer with the Chairman of Toft Parish Council before discussing the matter with the District Council Planners.

Birdlines Manor Farm proposed development

In response to a question from the Parish Council about the Birdlines Manor Farm proposal being submitted at this stage in the LDF Consultation the District Council has replied as follows "new sites can be proposed to us at this time, but before they could be included in the Local Plan there would have to be public consultation."

Recreation ground

The Parish Council still awaits the outcome of its grant application with Sport England for £50,000 towards the project to install drainage and prepare pitches on the recreation ground land extension.

Assets Walk

In November the Council's Vice Chairman and some members will walk the village and review the condition of the Council's assets so that any maintenance work can be put in hand.

Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge

Excellence for All

I am sure many of you are aware of Operation Christmas Child, run by the charity Samaritan's Purse. In case you haven't come across it, the purpose is to give children in other countries who will not receive Christmas presents (because of poverty, war or natural disaster) a small box of presents from people in Britain.

The idea is to decorate a shoebox with Christmas paper and then fill it with items a child in such circumstances would love. The items have to be new and age-appropriate (you choose whether to give to a girl or a boy and which age group you would like to give for). The charity gives lots of good ideas about what is suitable – a toothbrush and toothpaste, for example, can be extremely welcome – and also what is not. Clearly, toy guns are not an appropriate gift for children who see far too many of the real thing.

Each year around the middle of October I hold an assembly for our children about this very good cause. Sometimes, we watch a short video provided by the charity. This year I showed the children the items I had already bought for my shoebox and they gave me some good ideas for more things I could buy for a girl aged 10-14 (my chosen recipient this year). At the end of the assembly I always tell the children that this is a special Christmas present they will be sending. They won't receive a 'thank you', they won't see a smile on someone's face, they won't even know who receives it – but they will know that it will be very much appreciated.

However, this year the children have had a greater insight into the power of their gifts. We recently had a supply teacher in for a day when a member of staff was off sick. In passing, we discovered that she came from Romania and had received two of these shoeboxes as a child, one when aged 7 (when she received her very first teddy bear) and one when aged 12. She was able to explain to the children her emotions on receiving the shoeboxes and what a huge difference they made to her life.

I know that several organisations locally also take part in Operation Christmas Child and we are delighted to be part of this. The children become very excited as they see the pile of colourful boxes grow in the entrance foyer. If you don't already take part may I commend this act of charity to you? I always think of it as adding another child to my Christmas list – and it is really good fun stuffing the box with as many items as will fit!

COMBERTON ACADEMY TRUST: A BRIEF HISTORY TO DATE

Background

The Comberton Academy Trust (C.A.T.) was officially formed at the beginning of 2011. In the first instance, it came to exist in order to allow Comberton Village College to convert to Academy status. This move was judged by governors at Comberton Village College to be the best thing to serve the needs the school and, after consultation, it was pursued. Comberton Village College thus converted to academy status in February 2011.

Developments in 2011

Soon after its formation, the C.A.T. was asked to take on significant further developments. Comberton Village College had already had approval to open a new Sixth Form due its high-performing status as an 11-16 school. This major development was thus taken on by the C.A.T. and the new Comberton Sixth Form was opened in new premises at Comberton in September 2011.

Soon after its formation, the C.A.T. was also asked to sponsor an Academy development for a school that was in challenging circumstances. This reflected a strong theme of recent Government education policy, seeking to link schools as Academies through trusts to secure improvements in education. After careful reflection, trustees decided that the C.A.T. should be prepared to do this. This led to the sponsorship of the Voyager secondary Academy in Peterborough. The Voyager is now firmly established as an Academy within the C.A.T.

Further developments in 2013

Comberton Village College governors had long been in discussions with Cambridgeshire Local Authority regarding the need for a long-term solution to ensure secondary places were available to all with the on-going development at Cambourne. Comberton Village College could not forever accommodate the growing numbers of pupils form Cambourne. Under new Government legislation, an opportunity arose for the C.A.T. to take forward this agenda by proposing to set up a new 'Free School' (i.e. a new Academy) at Cambourne. This proposal was backed by the Local Authority as providing an appropriate solution to the issue. The proposal was approved by the Department for Education in summer 2012. After a rapid building programme, Cambourne Village College opened in September 2013 as part of the C.A.T.

During 2013, another local Cambridgeshire Village College approached the C.A.T. to request the possibility of joining. Melbourn Village College had for a number of years worked in some partnership with Comberton Village College. A move to join the Trust would greatly strengthen the partnership and ensure fuller and further benefits could be gained. After a careful review, trustees decided that it was in the interests of all to pursue this development. Melbourn Village College thus joined the C.A.T. in September 2013

- Comberton Sixth Form (part of Comberton Village College)
- The Voyager Academy
- Cambourne Village College
- Melbourne Village College

COMBERTON W.I. REPORT

There were concerns that the current American shutdown might have implications for our meeting as the speaker was Arthur Brookes from the American War Cemetery at Madingley. Indeed the cemetery had been closed to visitors but Arthur was continuing with his speaking engagements. He told us about the history of the cemetery and about its upkeep. Apparently every headstone is washed weekly and the grass is irrigated and fertilised nightly as needed. The cemetery is beautifully landscaped with 3812 burials and over 5000 names on the wall of those who were lost in action. A decision was taken not to record the ages on the stones, just the name, state and unit. Madingley is the American cemetery for the Second World War; Brookwood in Surrey was used for victims of the First World War.

Staggeringly, 80% of those commemorated at Madingley died in accidents or through illness but not directly in combat. There were over a hundred American hospitals and air bases in the UK. Arthur meets with the visiting families of American veterans and he shared some of the stories of the names on the graves. It was a real privilege to see the photos and hear about the backgrounds of the people and consider the impact of their loss on their families.

There is a new visitor's centre being built at Madingley and this will introduce more people

Blue Bin

Most packaging can be placed in the blue bin, including;

- Glass bottles and jars
- · Tins and cans
- Cardboard

(large pieces can be flattened and placed next to your blue bin for collection)

- · Greeting cards
- Gift wrap (all types)
- Plastic pots, tubs, trays
- Plastic packaging
- Plastic film (all types as long as clean)

If your blue bin is full, extra recycling can be placed out for collection in a cardboard box or returnable container.

Paper Caddy

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Leaflets
- Greeting card envelopes

Green Bin

- All food waste (cooked or raw)
- Real Christmas trees (only when cut up and placed inside the bin)

NOVEMBER BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

FIREWORKS and bonfires can be plenty of fun for all the family to enjoy. CFRS recommends going to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home, however, if you do use fireworks or light a bonfire at home, we would ask residents to take on board our safety advice to ensure it is just their fireworks that go off with a bang:

- Keep fireworks in a closed box and always follow the instructions.
- Light them at arms length using a taper and stand well back.
- Never go back to a lit firework.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Don't light bonfires in unsuitable weather, particularly in windy conditions.
- Don't leave bonfires unattended.
- Build bonfires well clear of buildings, fences and hedge.
- Never use flammable liquids to start the fire, and never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, batteries.
- Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away.


