

CONSULTATION ON REVIEW OF THE DECISION TO REMOVE ALL SUBSIDISED BUS SERVICE FUNDING

Cambridgeshire County Council wants to hear your views on changes and reductions being proposed to bus services which are supported by financial contributions from Council funds.

Why we are contacting you

The majority of bus services in Cambridgeshire (about 80%) are provided by commercial operators without subsidy. However, the County Council subsidises some bus services which bus operators are unable to operate on a commercial basis. In the future, this may not be possible due to reduced overall grants to councils from Government and increased costs of services. The County Council needs to make savings of around £540 million over the next five years and some of these savings have to come from the transport budget.

The County Council's Cabinet has agreed that a review of last year's budget decision to cut the £2.7 million that is currently spent on subsidising bus journeys in Cambridgeshire over the next four years should take place. This review is being carried out as part of this year's budget planning process, ensuring that we consult widely, seek views on not only the principle of making the cuts but also on the impact of specific route changes. We are also looking back at the routes that have already been cut, gathering feedback on how this has impacted communities in these areas.

Alongside this work, we are working hard with operators, community transport providers, local councils and businesses to see if we can find alternative and viable ways of meeting the transport needs of communities as much as possible and looking for other alternative solutions to help reduce the impact of these changes. This is through a project called Cambridgeshire Future Transport. This aims to look at innovative ways of providing transport and to focus this more on community and local needs. This could be through the expansion of community transport or developing completely new forms of demand-led transport.

Your views are an important part of this process to help us decide on how we implement the financial savings and where possible find local solutions.

PRESSURE RELIEF Comberton Baptist Church

A local charity, the Relationships Foundation, publish what they call the Family Pressure Gauge. They compare how family friendly the UK is compared to the rest of Europe. It seems only Romania and Bulgaria are harder on families than the UK. The main pressures are economic and unhealthy influences on children, made worse through the high levels of family breakdown. In other words, the pressure we experience begets more pressure.

In 2007, the United Nations Children's Fund ranked the UK bottom of list of 21 industrialised countries in terms of children's wellbeing. But what caught my eye was that the scores had little to do with how wealthy a country was. Spain scored much better than the USA, Ireland much better than the UK.

What the UNICEF report did show very clearly was that if a country is or recently has been a world power, or part of one, it was a poor place for kids. The Relationships Foundation report suggests a similar pattern. It seems power has a price. If empire building is about competition, then its flip-side is cooperation.







<Prioritu> Misuse of oven svaces

- Patrols have been conducted at public green spaces and recreation areas, in support of this priority, including the following locations; Bourn Rec; Greenhaze Park, Monkfield Ln Rec and the Cambourne Lakes Nature Reserve; Comberton Rec; Byron's Pool and Grantchester Meadows; Millers Rd Toft and Caldecote Rec.
- Generally few issues encountered during these patrols, including those undertaken in an unmarked car.
- Youths drinking alcohol Comberton Rec, Grantchester Meadows and Monkfield Ln Rec - have been dealt robustly by confiscation and Guardian Awareness Programme letters.
- Comberton Village College surgeries have proved to be increasingly popular and have been used to promote awareness of the impact of ASB on the Community

Comberton Ward (Comberton)

Crime

- Total crime in Comberton has increased to 14 offences reported during the last three month period. This is still comparably low and is consistent with the previous period.
- Two of the 3 violent offences reported were related to the same domestic dispute.
- No further trends noted due to low level of offences reported. ASB
- Only 7 ASB incidents reported were reported over the three month period.
- Two incidents reported on the same day in May, were youth-related, including 1 report of a rave occurring on Hines Lane and another incidents where a group of youths were throwing stones at passing vehicles on Barton Road. A further incident was reported on Hines Lane in July, referring to youths starting a fire underneath the skate ramp.

PLANT OKTOBERFEST

In his Ode to Autumn, Keats sums up his observations of this wonderful month:

Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness!

Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun.

No wonder that we have the phrase 'golden October' to describe the month as the hedgerows and gardens transform from green to rich colours at the yellow-red end of the spectrum. The mellow fruitfulness provides wildlife with nourishment. Don't tidy away yet; leave fruit that has dropped on the ground as a natural food supply. The strong winds of September shook down an almost complete drop of apples and pears for the blackbirds, thrushes and pheasants to feed on throughout the month. Look out for butterflies, particularly Small Tortoiseshells that feed on ivy flowers that produce considerable amounts of nectar. On an evening stroll alongside arable fields, you might still see the Night-flowering Catchfly. This plant has flowers that look a little like White Campion (it also belongs to the same genus). At night its flowers are white with a hint of pink, but during the day the petals close in to reveal their pale yellow undersides. The fragrance of the flowers attracts many moths.

October is the best time to decide on new trees for the garden. If you are



wanting trees that fire up in autumn, visit gardens that have good shows. The Cambridge Botanic Garden and Anglesey Abbey are a great resource for ideas. Make sure that you write down the precise names so that there will be no mistake when buying. It is also good to have a few specimen grasses that flower well in October; the dwarf variety of pampas grass, *Cortaderia selloana* 'Pumila' is good for small gardens with its upright plumes of flowers. *Miscanthus sinensis* 'Zebrinus' bears silver flowers that can grow on long stems to 6 feet; it has the great advantage that its deep green leaves are cross-banded with cream stripes.

I have lost three trees this year due to honey fungus. Specialist advice will be sought for fungus-resistant trees to replace them. If you need to replace trees that have died, look out for alternative replacements. Make sure that the planting hole is of sufficient size, break up the sub soil in the bottom of the hole, add well rotted compost and fix a strong stake to which the tree can be tied. If the tree is pot bound, loosen the roots and spread them out in the planting hole and then add good quality soil. Firm in the tree and then water well.
