



Something to Celebrate

As I write this, Radio 4 are doing a little series (the 1.45pm slot) on early environmental activists. One of them was on Wangari Maathai, who won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2004. She was a Kenyan, who won a scholarship to the States and then came back as a lecturer in Veterinary medicine.

In the 70s she began a tree planting movement, simply to help those from where she came from who were beginning to be short of fire wood, building material and food – largely due to the massive increase in cash crops (tea and coffee).

She spent much of her life campaigning for tree planting – which of course has now become all the rage. Apparently, Pakistan planted 1 billion last year!

Poignantly and perhaps depressingly she said the 'death of our environment is also our death'. She was all about re-connecting our place in the natural world. We cannot think of ourselves apart from the good earth.

And so more positively, she also suggested something celebratory. What if every person on the planet planted a tree to 'celebrate' our life and our interdependence on the life around us, she said. And in Kenya millions of trees were planted.

If as individuals, communities, nations and a global village, we have any hope of meeting the demands of global warming, we are going to have to learn to celebrate our environment. Just thinking about the environment under threat is going to wear us out pretty thin, pretty fast.

But if instead we begin to celebrate the world we inhabit, then maybe (just maybe) we'll begin to foster the kind of attitudes and habits which might make us able to meet the long term challenges to come.

And planting trees is a pretty good way to start. Trees have always been a symbol of life. The tree of life in the myth of the Garden of Eden. The tree that's for the healing of the leaves of the nations at the very end of the Bible. And the tree in the middle of the story, a sign of death being overcome by new life. 'Plant a tree' – celebrate life.



Parish Council Report from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 8 January 2020.

Asset Repairs

The Parish Council has conducted the assets review and is arranging repairs for assets. Some works will be conducted by the Community Payback team.

Housing Needs Survey

Mark Deas from Cambridgeshire ACRE attended the meeting to suggest that the Parish Council consider a Housing Needs Survey. The Council did not agree to support this.

Budget 2020/21

The PC approved its budget for FY2021. The level of precept has been kept the same at £59,400. A copy of the budget is available on the website.

The following have been included in the budget for next year: Hillfield Road bollards £500, Operation London Bridge £100, Comberton swimming pool £2000, and safety surfacing £2500 (seed funding for a project estimated to cost £15k-£20k). It is hoped the balance will be covered by an external grant.

Levelling of pitches

At its next meeting, the Council will be considering a request from Comberton United for a grant of £3790 towards levelling of the football pitch.





Comberton Speed Reduction Update

The Parish Council have supported an application to Cambridgeshire County Council's Local Highways Initiative. This fund offers up to £15,000 towards local projects – which is a £5,000 increase from previous years. Here we provide a brief update of the plans, which have been modified in line with recommendations from a highway engineer.

The current proposal is for the speed limit on most of the roads in Comberton to drop to 20 mph, including all side streets, and the B1049 West of Hines Lane. To encourage lower speeds, the smallest design of speed bumps would be installed on parts of the B1049. Long Road and the B1049 to the East of Hines Lane are not included in this proposal, so remain at 30 mph (the advisory 20 mph Meridian school flashing signs will remain in position). We have explored several options for including all roads in this plan, but at present the costs of implementing this are too high.



Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

I look upon December to February as the 'doldrums' of the year activity-wise – but that cannot be said where CFRS are concerned. All times of the year present challenges to The Service, and winter brings with it heightened risks to our community and to those passing through. Prevention is better than cure, a maxim more appreciated within the emergency services than most, where road traffic accidents are concerned.

Whatever steps the Department of Transport and our local authorities initiate RTA's continue to challenge CFRS. It's no picnic turning out on a cold wet winter's night to deal with situations where life is at risk. So, what might we do to help?

One idea is to install onto your mobile phone the 'what3words' app. Should you be involved in or witness an RTA this ultra accurate positioning will route all emergency services directly to the scene.

Also, ensure that vehicles are regularly and fully maintained and serviced, tyre condition is good and pressures are correct – check these weekly. Try not to undertake unnecessary journeys and let others know your plans.

Home safety, so often taken for granted, should be constantly thought about. Not just security day and night but safety, particularly in the kitchen where most domestic fires originate. It's not 'rocket science' ensuring that clothes, tea towels etc are kept well away from naked flames, or even searingly hot electric cooking surfaces.

Keep testing all smoke and CO monitors!

Caring for our Church Yard

Our church yard remains a very important part of our village, where we can come and remember our loved ones. The beginning of a New Year seemed to be a good time to gently remind everyone of what is and isn't permitted on or around a grave, so that the whole church yard continues to be a sacred and safe space for everyone. These rules and regulations are not made by the vicar or the Parochial Church Council but by the diocese and reflect national guidelines.

What's permitted around graves

No trees or shrubs may be planted without 'a faculty' (a special license from the diocese) however, bulbs are very welcome. We recognise that in the past many things have been planted on graves and that such plants may be greatly treasured. We are therefore not asking these to be removed, but we ask that no new shrubs or trees be planted.

No artificial flowers are allowed, except Remembrance Day poppies and Christmas Wreaths, and these are to be removed within 2 months. Cut flowers are welcome but should be removed when withered. There are currently a number of wreaths and withered flowers on graves and if these are not removed in a timely manner then they will be taken away at the beginning of April by the PCC.

No lighting is permitted on or around a grave, however toys or similar objects are permitted where appropriate, for up to 12 months following a burial, with the permission of the vicar.

Please also note that nothing should be fixed to the churchyard wall, to ensure its ongoing integrity.

A word on glass

For the sake of those who mow, please do not put anything in glass. The worry is that if a glass vase is broken, there will be shards of glass amongst the grass, posing a risk to anyone tending the grave of a loved one, or those who look after the churchyard. Please replace all glass vases with sturdy plastic ones (elegant transparent vases are available from retailers).

Sunken graves

We have noticed that a number of graves have sunk over time. The PCC will be working with the grave diggers to prevent the same problem happening in the future. If you tend a grave that has sunk, you are welcome to add earth to it from the large pile at the far end of the graveyard.

Beautiful Burial Grounds

Finally, we are hoping to connect with a national project called 'beautiful burial grounds' run by *Caring for God's Acre*. The project aims to make burial grounds as beautiful, accessible and biodiverse as possible... if you would be interested in getting involved please do get in touch (davidnewton@lordsbridge.org).

Many thanks to everyone for their care of this special place and we hope that by working together the graveyard will continue to be a much-loved space for generations to come.
