

Parish Council Report

The Parish Council met on 12 February 2020.

East-West Rail route

Following the announcement by the Government of the preferred route option for the Bedford-Cambridge route, public information events are to be held across the area, including one at Comberton Village Hall on Saturday 29 March from 3.30 pm to 7.00 pm.

Footpaths

The Parish Council is asking the County Council for assistance in improving the surface of the footpath between Green End and the Recreation Ground, so that it is passable all year round.

The poor condition of the footpath from Foxs Way to Bakers Close is also being reported to the County Council.

Missing Hi-vis jackets

A number of hi-vis jackets have gone missing from the Pavilion. The Parish Council asks that they be returned as soon as possible.

Installation of air-source heat pump at the Comberton Commercial Centre

The Parish Council as landlord has given its consent to the installation of an air-source heat pump in the car park of the new Village Hall, to supply air conditioning units in the Commercial Centre. This will be situated inside the right hand side of the entrance to the car park on the north side of the Commercial Centre and no parking space will be lost.

Parking in Hillfield Road

Following complaints from residents, the Parish Council will be installing an additional bollard to prevent people from driving over and parking on the grass and churning it up.

Greater Cambridge Local Plan Issues and Options consultation
The Parish Council is responding that it would be opposed to
development on the edge of Cambridge within the Green Belt but might
possibly be amenable to development on the edge of Cambridge
outside the Green Belt. The Parish Council is also opposed to dispersal
of development between the villages.

Recreation Ground - repairs to the Dome

The Council has decided to proceed with repairs to the Dome on the grounds of Health and Safety, and quotations are awaited for the necessary work.

Football pitch

The Council will be liaising with contractors with a view to carrying out moss treatment and aeration of the pitch.

Village maps

Arrangements are to be made to update the village maps to reflect new development in the village.

Requests for funding

It was agreed to continue to support the work of the EDGE Community Youth Club with a grant. A donation of £100.00 to MAGPAS Air Ambulance was also approved.

Trees

A quotation is being obtained for pruning back a very large maple in Hillfield Road which is close to houses and obscuring street lights.

The Parish Council is gratefully accepting an offer from the District Council for three free trees to be planted in the village.

Hello neighbours, parents and friends! We had a very busy end to 2019, with our Nativity play, carols with the Friendship Club, and our Christmas Fayre which raised over £1000. We put all our fundraising moneys towards improving the facilities at Playgroup, and we hope you have noticed our fantastic new Pirate Ship, designed and built by Duncan at Artisan Structures to celebrate our 50th anniversary last year. In the future, we are looking to replace the wooden fencing and gate entering the playground, and upgrade the main doors into the building to reduce draughts. We'd be delighted to hear from anyone who could help advise us on these projects. Our next fundraising event will be our Easter Eggstravaganza morning, which will be held on Saturday 28th March, with Easter themed crafts, an Easter trail, cakes, raffle and more, we hope to see you there!

Anthony Browne MP

As I write, it has been just over nine weeks since the general election, although it feels like a lifetime ago. So much has happened in the early days of this Parliament both nationally and locally.

The UK has officially left the European Union and must now focus on negotiating a new trading relationship with our European partners. For South Cambridgeshire, a crucial aspect of this new arrangement will be the provisions on agriculture. I was therefore delighted to make farming issues the focus of my maiden speech to Parliament during the debate on the government's new Agriculture Bill. In the coming weeks and months I want to engage closely with local farmers to better understand their needs, so that I can best represent their views in Parliament as it shapes the country's future agriculture policy. If you would like to be involved in these discussions, please get in touch.

Last week I enjoyed a fascinating visit to the new Royal Papworth. It is the first UK hospital to be rated outstanding across every CQC category. which is a testament to the talent and commitment of its staff and management team. I saw the site where the Cambridge Heart & Lung Research Institute (HLRI) will be built, a brilliant example of the how the Biomedical Campus brings together the world's best clinicians and researchers to develop new treatments for the most challenging conditions. We are so fortunate that this local expertise will improve healthcare not only here in South Cambs, but across the world. I know there are concerns about the UK's ability to collaborate with EU research partners post-Brexit and I therefore raised this matter in Parliament with the Science Minister in January. He offered assurances that the UK would remain committed to the Horizon 2020 programme and would seek as full an association as possible with its successor scheme, but I will continue to meet with local stakeholders and push the government on this issue.

One of my key pledges as your MP is to help to fix our creaking transport system. We had some extremely welcome news this month when the Transport Secretary announced that East West Rail will take a northern route through Cambourne, where local commuter demand is highest. This is not only great news for Cambourne, but also for residents in Bassingbourn, who were overwhelmingly opposed to EWR taking a southern route.

The new Cambridge South Station will form a critical new transport hub for the Biomedical Campus. I have already met with Network Rail to find out more about this project and to discuss parking problems at local stations and the notoriously problematic level crossing at Foxton.

I have had a number of approaches from constituents who are worried about the rate of development in South Cambridgeshire. I share many of their concerns and will be lobbying national government to ensure that we do not become victims of our own success. Whilst growth is welcome, it must be carefully managed and local people's voices must be heard. Infrastructure should always be put in place before expansion - 'I before E' as the saying goes. You can make your views known by taking part in the initial consultation on the Greater Cambridge Local Plan - which contemplates a significant increase in housebuilding - at www.cambridge.oc2.uk.


