

Comberton Twinning Association

The twinning of Comberton with Le Vaudreuil in Normandy is still active after more than twenty years. Although group visits to and from France have been postponed due to Covid, we English met for a successful BBQ at Manor Farm (thanks to Godfrey and Pauline Curtis) on the nearest Saturday to Bastille Day to celebrate continued friendships. We still plan that the French will come to Comberton in May 2022, and that we will go to France, either in September 2022 or the following spring. Comberton Paths

Covid lockdowns have highlighted the importance to us all of walking in the countryside for exercise and particularly for mental health. It has also highlighted that Comberton is woefully lacking in local paths and circular walking routes. Compared with local villages like Toft, Eversden or Bourn, we have about a third of the rights of way that they do. We do have a few very useful permissive paths (and many thanks to the landowners for providing them), but they could be withdrawn at any time. We have a deadline of January 2026 to reclaim missing Lost Highways based on historical evidence – see http://dontloseyourway.ramblers.org.uk/.

As one Covid lockdown project, I have researched a particular route which was historically available for centuries and walked regularly by villagers until it was ploughed up in the 1980s as it had never been added to the county's definitive rights of way map in the 1960s. This is the Lot Way running East from the church. We currently have a permissive path parallel (thanks again to the landowner), but we owe it to our children to try to re-establish a permanent route – which could be along the route of the current permissive path.

As a second project, I have put together a set of blue sky ideas of what a good path network for Comberton might look like. Not to be walked now, but as something perhaps to aim for over the next few decades. You can read more about both these at <u>www.pghardy.net/comberton/</u> <u>paths/.</u> I'd like to hear from anyone who has ideas about how either of these projects could be moved forward. Hello neighbours, parents and friends! We are writing this in early July, having nearly completed another very successful term at Playgroup. Our activities have included working together on a giant Elmer elephant artwork, creating Father's Day cards, learning about empathy, parachute games, lava lamps, observing shadows, making fizzing volcanoes, and listening to different genres of music from classical to jazz, country to rap, then making up our own tunes and beats in a band! You may also have noticed our celebrations of World Bee Day in May, we all had great fun dressing up and learning how important bees are.

Although we have not been able to round off the year with our usual summer BBQ, we have been enjoying planning a party for children on the last day of term, to say goodbye to those leaving us and moving up to "big school". We are also hoping to offer a few coffee mornings for parents and children during the summer holidays as restrictions ease.

Our covid precautions have continued to develop and operate in line with government guidance. Although some adults and individual children have had to isolate, we have been grateful that we have managed (so far!) to avoid closure of our "bubble". Thank you to all our families for continuing to keep everyone at playgroup safe by following the government guidelines for testing and isolation.

Our plans for next term remain flexible, but we know we can operate safely to meet the challenges of any future lockdowns. We were so proud of all the children with how well they have adjusted and coped with the changes throughout the last 18 months, now a significant proportion of their young lives.

If restrictions allow, we are hoping to start new Messy Play groups and a coffee morning every week from September. 

The Good Liar is a 2019 crime thriller film directed and produced by Bill Condon and written by Jeffrey Hatcher, based on the 2015 novel of the same name by Nicholas Searle. It stars Ian McKellen as a career con artist who meets a wealthy widow (Helen Mirren) online, and then discovers that his plan to steal her fortune has unexpected roadblocks.

The film premiered at the BFI Southbank in London on October 28, 2019. It was released by Warner Bros.

In 2009 London, Roy Courtnay is an aging British con artist who, along with his business partner Vincent, uses false identities to deceive people into giving him access to their finances. His latest target is Betty McLeish, a former history professor at Oxford University who lost her husband a year ago and has savings in excess of £2 million. Feigning a bad knee, Roy manipulates Betty into allowing him to stay at her house.

If you like a film with superb acting that gets you absorbed in it right from the beginning, this is an excellent choice. The Good Liar is a suspenseful thriller that moves along nicely and is full of twists and turns. Right from the start we know that Ian McKellen's character is bad news, a con man up to no good in every aspect of his life.



Community Warden Service - Cambridge South West Villages (supporting Papworth, Hardwick, Wimpole, Comberton, Caldecote, Toft and Bourn)

As well as making daily contact (Monday to Friday) to check on well-being and generally have a chat to reduce loneliness and isolation, the warden can also help with practical things such as:

- Make a light lunch, or hot drink
- Put the bins out (and bring back in)
- Help with Blue Badge applications and other paperwork
- · Assist with post opening and management
- Make phone calls on your behalf (e.g. if hard of hearing, or memory impaired)
- · Feed animals/pets/pond fish and refill wild bird feeders
- · Provide company and reassurance on a short walk
- Collect and deliver small amounts of shopping
- Collect and deliver Prescriptions
- Arrange transport and accompanied visits to medical/health appointments
- Signpost and connect to other useful services, such as benefit checks or handyman service.

Not only do service users value the support of our community wardens, but so do carers. We can help support family, friends and carers by taking on some of their roles and giving them back some time.

<u>Eligibility</u> The only criteria is that you must be aged over 60years (if a couple only one of you needs to be over 60, to become a service user).

<u>Cost of Service</u> There is a **TWO WEEKS FREE TRIAL** and thereafter, if you wish to continue there is a small fee of only £9 a week (single person) or £11 per week (for a couple).


