Comberton Players were thrilled to be back in Pantoland in December after a three year break. The cast of The Three Musketeers rose to the occasion of playing to and entertaining full houses of great audiences. Perhaps the icing on the [Christmas] cake was the review below that we received from one audience member, the regional rep for NODA (National Operatic and Dramatic Association) who sees and reviews many productions in and around Cambridge.

On a freezing cold and foggy Sunday afternoon it was nice to sit in a lovely warm venue to be transported to Paris for Comberton Players' latest pantomime *The Three Musketeers* written and directed by the talented Rachel Nielsen. The script was a funny and clever take on the famous tale but, of course, this is panto so it wasn't true to Alexandre Dumas' original story. Taxes are high, people are miserable and the Musketeers are out of work. Cardinal Richelieu is plotting to oust the (rather silly) King with the help of Milady de Winter. Enter the young, earnest, determined D'Artagnan intent on joining the Musketeers and help them foil the Cardinal & Milady's plot.

The well designed setting made the most of the space available and given there was no capacity for any moveable scenery, scenes flowed into each other smoothly with cast moving larger items and props on and off quickly and in the main unobtrusively. Costumes, sound and lighting were all good. MD Dan Blackburn and Choreographer Laurie-Lee McDowell made good use of the talent in the cast. Solos, duets and ensemble singing were excellent and the choreography well executed.

The fifteen young performers who were Sweeps, Guards, Jewellers and the Chorus performed with confidence and obvious ability. A special "well done" mention to Annie and Freya on the "Cups and Clapping" routine. This called for their complete concentration and they carried it out to perfection.

A strong and talented cast of principals ensured the show had good pace, lots of energy and some great singing. Village Pond Feeding Tips

It is wonderful to have our newly restored village pond full of water and beginning to attract wildlife.

Nine out of ten ducks agree that feeding ducks is a fun and wholesome activity. But before you head off to our local pond, here are a few things to keep in mind:

DON'T: Leave bread at the pond because it will attract rats.

DON'T: Feed ducks bread or junk food. Foods like bread and crackers have no nutritional value to ducks and can cause malnutrition and painful deformities if consumed too much.

DO: Feed ducks cracked corn, oats, rice, birdseed, frozen peas, chopped lettuce, or sliced grapes. These foods are similar to natural foods ducks will forage for on their own.

DON'T: Leave uneaten food lying around. Leftover food in the water can rot and cause deadly algae blooms that affect local wildlife.

At the moment the pond is rejuvenating so don't dump plants as they may conflict with the plan..

Don't leave food around the pond unless you see actively feeding ducks it will NOT encourage ducks !



New Chairman's Report February 2023

I have now resumed the Chairmanship of FOSM, having completed my term as President of the British Section of Ingenieurs et Scientifiques de France. I am grateful to Godfrey Curtis who stood in as Chairman in my absence from 2019 and brought fresh energy to our activities especially to our publicity and the carpark and Churchyard wall repair projects, all despite Covid.

At the beginning of 2022 FOSM stirred again after COVID. More restoration work was necessary for the fabric of St. Mary's Church. Funds to be raised and people to be gathered! Owing to continued postponement by the builders, repair of the wall has been delayed "until better weather". Grant application for the main car park progresses.

The upgrade of the car park will provide hard standing for disability parking. Fresh gravel will prevent the pooling rainwater which prevents parking. This car park is not simply for the Church's use.

It is also a gateway. Visitors come to care for graves, for quiet or to watch the seasonal changes happening in the Churchyard with the Re-wilding Project. They may come to walk the Causeway or to tramp the old ridgeways on the south side of Comberton. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is determined to keep the Church open for Visitors in the daytime. Only last October thieves broke in -the Church is a little remote from the village. Break-ins damage the security systems. Repairs, replacements and insurance all cost the PCC more money.

Throughout the year we have placed articles in Contact. Last year we organised a special Sunday afternoon of walking on Sunday 22nd May 2022. Our thanks to Paul Hardy, Revd. Chris Westgarth, and Jane Hughes, in particular. The Walks picked up on an old tradition of **Beating the Bounds on Rogation Sunday**. A merry band of walkers from Comberton and beyond took part. We tell the story on the notice board inside the Church which is open to visitors during daylight hours. **We hope to repeat this walking event 14th May 2023.** Look out for the posters.

Historically, FOSM was created after a detailed inspection of the Church (2014 Quinquennial) showed much decay. Then thieves stole lead from the north roof. Repair work started and to date we have been able to support this work financially to the value £25,300.

The next 5 yearly inspection will be in 2024. No doubt there will be more restoration work to be done. Covid and last summer's heat have greatly hindered the ongoing repair work. It rained hard before Christmas and as I sat singing Carols, I felt several drips of water on my head from the leaking roof! The floor and front benches are **stained from repeated water leaks**. We know that the **whole nave roof will need to be re-leaded quite soon**. This is a big, expensive undertaking although, once done, it will keep the building dry for another 100 years. Let us see what the Quinquennial 2024 has to say!

Our first Fundraise of 2023 is 18th February and will be a Recital of Harp and Organ music. Please look out for the flyers around the village and for details in this February issue of Contact. We hope you will be able to come. Even better, ask how you can help the Friends of St. Mary's. We hope you will join us.
