

St Mary's Churchyard and Nature Recovery

Can you Help?

Recent articles in Contact have updated the village community on progress to improve the habitat and increase the biodiversity in the churchyard. It can be seen as part of a network of paths and hedgerows radiating as corridors down to Bourn Brook, to the south, Tit Brook then along hedges to the fields in the centre and north of the village and along footpaths east and west towards Watts Wood and the Meridian Golf course. This network is an example of how natural corridors can provide wildlife habitat. It demonstrates the biodiversity resource in and around Comberton as an essential part of the Green Belt and a buffer against inappropriate development. A key part of the plan is to retain the integrity of the valuable farmland surrounding the village.

The Parish Council has set up a Nature Recovery Group to build on the work in the churchyard. It will explore how to assist nature recovery in and around Comberton to support local and national government initiatives which follow from the government's 2018 policy paper 'A Green Future: Our 25-year Plan to Improve the Environment', This has led directly to the establishment of plans for a Nature Recovery Network (NRN) which is being rolled out by DEFRA and Natural England. Locally the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority is responsible for the scheme. The County Council has established the Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) in collaboration with Natural Cambridgeshire and the local District Council. The aim is to develop an evidence-based, locally led collaborative approach.

We will hold an open meeting in the Village Hall at 7:30pm on 22nd February to discuss the proposals. Please do come along if you are able to help, are interested in supporting the project, or if you would simply like to know what we are doing. We would be delighted to share our proposal with you and discuss any interests or concerns you may have

We look forward to hearing from you, at <u>combertonnaturenetwork@outlook.com</u> and seeing you at our meeting on 22nd February.



In addition, the Parish Council would like to collect information to strengthen their discussions with relevant stakeholders. Please visit our website to report flooding in the village.

We have received a number of complaints from residents about hedges encroaching on pavements. It is crucial that pavements are safe for all pedestrians, including those using pushchairs, mobility scooters, wheelchairs and those with mobility or visual impairments. Thus, we are reminding residents of their responsibility to trim hedges to the property boundary and hoping all will take the opportunity of the winter months to prune their shrubs and trees.



We would like to update you regarding the retirement village planning application under consideration. The applicant is allowed to submit one round of amended documents for their application. When this is received, all consultees, including the Parish Council and the public, will be invited to look at these documents and submit further comments. Following this process, the South Cambridgeshire Planning Committee will review the application.

A group of residents, which has carried out significant work to increase biodiversity in the Saint Mary's churchyard, has proposed the creation of a Comberton Nature Recovery Network to improve our natural environment and bring more wildlife into the village. The group will establish a network of potential wildlife corridors within and around the village to link significant sites of biodiversity importance, including Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The Parish Council is delighted to support this proposal. The Tree and Environment and the Pond working groups will be reorganised to form the Comberton Nature Recovery Working Group which will be convened by Cllr Chris Westgarth. There will be an open meeting at the Village Hall at 7:30 pm on 22nd February to discuss ideas. Special thanks are given to Robert Cook, Mark Collins, Francine Hughes and Paul Hardy for the work they have already carried out and their new proposal.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership has approved the proposed road works on West Street, Barton Road and adjacent streets to improve road safety. Roadworks have restarted in early January. Letters regarding disruptions will be distributed to those in close proximity to the works. We will attempt to post these letters on our website as well to inform all residents.


