

Andrew Hollick has recently left the Parish Council. We are extremely thankful for his many years of contribution, his extended knowledge of Comberton and, more recently, his work on improving the village pond.

The Parish Council has submitted its response to the Endurance planning application. You can read it on the Greater Cambridge Planning Portal (application 23/01448/OUT). Many thanks to all those that have contributed!

The Parish Council wants sewage issues to be resolved in Comberton. Recently, in the context of the Endurance Estate planning application, we have made an Environmental Information

Request with Anglian Water. The results of that request show that over 230 reports of sewage issues were made to Anglian Water in the past five years in Comberton. Please continue to report all such incidents to the water company to ensure there is a record of these issues.



The Parish Council has decided to have a Christmas tree with lights at the village pond this year. Together with Comberton Playgroup, we are making plans for a switch-on event. Please pencil in the 30th November at 5pm and check our website for updates.





Parish Council Bulletin (continued)



Cambridgeshire County Council funds several Local Highway Improvement projects each year. The fund covers 90% of the costs of projects up to £25,000. Each Parish Council

can make one application per year. We would like the opinion of Comberton residents to prioritise a project for an application in 2024.

The four proposed projects are

- two Mobile Vehicle-Activated Signs to encourage decreased driving speeds,
- the reduction of the speed limit on Royston Lane from 60 mph to 40 mph,
- the installation of parking spaces on South Street to decrease on-road parking,
- the installation of white gateways at two entrances to the village.








Colin R Lattimore (1934-2024)

Colin never lived in Comberton, but his membership of the Comberton Antiquarian Society which he supported and promoted for several decades, ensured him many close friends in the village, which might have led some to believe otherwise. For many of those years he was the diligent and kindly President of the Society, retiring only relatively recently. Sadly, after a short deterioration in health, he died on the 1st October in Needingworth in the house to which he had lately moved to share with his son and family. The Society will miss him and in expressing their condolences, remind us here of some of his many achievements.

Dr. Colin Lattimore OBE JP BSc(Lond) MB MFPHM FSA DARCS, retired in 2017 as Director of Public Health in Huntingdon. He continued to work as a magistrate and Deputy Coroner for South and West Cambridgeshire until the last few years when ill health overtook him. He had been awarded his OBE in 2004 for services to English Decorative and Applied Fine Arts and for community services in Cambridge. Over the course of this varied and successful life he had been Master (1999) of the Worshipful Company of Clockmakers and Keeper of the Company Silver. Other appointments included President (1999) of the British Horological Institute and Keeper of Clocks and Watches at the Fitzwilliam Museum, University of Cambridge, and he valued very much his election to Fellow of the Society of Antiguaries in 2017. His major interest lay in clocks which led to his well-received lecture "The History of the Long Case Clock" which he gave on numerous occasions. He wrote several books on subjects relating to antiques, including a definitive reference study "English Nineteenth Century Press-moulded Glass" (1979). He was an active member of the Bookplate Society who published his "Erotic Bookplates" (1990) as well as two further titles "The Bookplates of Miss C Helard and Other Related Matters" (2012). and a history of Ducal bookplates "Strawberry Leaves: an Account of Some Ducal Families and their Bookplates" (2017). He was struggling at the time of his death to complete a definitive reference work on antique tie pins of which he had a collection of well over 1000 examples. His collections in fact reflected his ubiquitous interests. From pop-up books to fine 18th century porcelain, from early 19th century bone rulers to carefully selected watercolours: a huge collection of watches and much more. A lot of his antique *miscellanea* were housed in two impressive vitrines which invited hands-on investigation.

He was an engaging and interesting speaker who over the years was a regular lecturer for a variety of societies. He was listed by the Arts Society, until recently known as NADFAS (National Association of Decorative and Fine Arts Societies), for whom he travelled across UK over many years visiting various of the many societies in the association. Never a member of NADFAS, the Comberton Antiquarian Society was founded independently just over 50 years ago. From soon after Its inauguration Colin became involved, giving many lectures from his wide knowledge of antiques and eventually becoming, as noted above, President of the Society. Despite his many other activities he continued to give unfailing support to the Society's activities well into his last decade until his refirement two years ago. His wife Isobel predeceased him on Christmas Eve 2020. She had been an equally staunch supporter of this Society and equally qualified in her own right in fields similar to Colin's, being a Liveryman of not only the Clockmakers Company but also of the Worshipful Company of Broderers. Together they had been deeply involved in the preservation of these ancient Companies and the associated skills within the City of London. They leave two children Ian and Angela, their eldest daughter Fiona having died tragically some forty or so years ago.

Walking to our Twin Village in France!

To mark the 25th anniversary of the twinning of Comberton and Le Vaudreuil in Normandy, Comberton resident Daniel Clark walked from England to France. An experienced long distance walker Daniel said "there is no organised walking route between our two villages, so it took a bit of time to create something, but it was a good walk and hopefully it added a little something to the event in Le Vaudreuil".



From the 1950s, twinning aimed to help relations between European nations. After initial exploration by two Comberton families in 1998, Le Vaudreuil was chosen to be the twin village for Comberton as it is also near a university city, is of similar size and was near enough to enable long weekend visits. The first twinning ceremony took place in Comberton in September 1999 when the twinning Charter was signed. Since then, there have been annual visits from each village to the other, continuing despite Brexit! Our 2024 visit was 20-22nd September, close to when we signed the charter 25 years ago.

Whilst 29 members of Comberton Twinning Association arrived by coach, Daniel arrived by foot: "I quite enjoy A to B treks, but this one was a little different. Most long-distance walks have guidebooks or route apps that lay out the route for you and provide a lot of information supporting your walk. I had to piece together a route to take me from Comberton, south through London, across on a ferry and then onward into France. The walk took 12 days, including a half day of sightseeing in Rouen. My nights were a mixture of single night B&B type accommodations and a few wild camping nights."



"I've walked in the company of bears and snakes on the Appalachian Trail, watched daily sunrises on sea cliffs on the South West Coast Path and walked across sands at low tide to Lindisfarne; but this was a little different. There was much more walking on concrete than I was used to. Once in France my route included part of the medieval Chasse Marée fish trail. The route had fixed dates for the sea crossing and my arrival in Le Vaudreuil. Fixed dates are not something long distance hikers are used to!"

Does it have to light up?

Because we are entering the season of dark evenings, it's really nice if your window can be seen when it's dark. This can be achieved by adding some light or fairy lights to the display or leaving a light on in the room – it's really effective to combine tissue paper with sugar paper with a room light behind.

How long do I have to leave it up for?

Your window should be ready from 7pm on your day until December 27th (for those who want to do the whole trail in one go).


