

Comberton Village College 1979-99 and its impact on the village

A series of reminiscences by Terry Wall

I had taught maths in Ankara, Turkey then at a large new comprehensive school in Lincoln and was looking for a change of direction when I saw an advertisement for "A senior community tutor" at Comberton Village College near Cambridge. I knew something of the widely respected "Village College" system pioneered by Henry Morris. I applied for the post and was appointed. What I was not told was that previously there had been an adult tutor and a youth tutor and that "cuts" meant that these two were now combined in my role. The Warden (which was the title given to what are now school Principals) was Keith Foreman, one of the most charismatic characters I have ever met. Keith was tall, handsome, had a great sense of humour and most importantly saw Comberton Village College as the centre of the community.

My first role was to supervise the adult education programme. I needed to do little as the secretaries Barbara Wallace and Sue Daniels made sure that everything ran smoothly. Keith wanted me to put a youth club in all of the fourteen villages in the catchment area, run the youth centre, which was on site, five or six days a week. Write, direct and perform in a staff panto called "Christmas at Comberton" (this is worth an article of its own). There was also an adult disco on Saturday nights and a youth disco on Friday nights which I was expected to run.

The new swimming pool had opened the previous year with money raised from the community with "Mac" McEvoy who was Head of P.E. and later Principal of Meldreth Manor special school as lead fundraiser. Mac had just left as I arrived but we became great friends. The pool was a normal "pay to enter " facility and was making a considerable loss. Keith wanted me to solve the problem (more later as to how that happened!) Mac also organised a 24 hour trampoline Marathon. I would need to borrow 24 trampolines from somewhere.

The new head of P.E. Ian Rigg wanted me to open the sports facilities, sports hall, youth centre, gym etc. on Sunday morning to the community for a very tiny "contribution". "Sunday Sports" was formed with many families taking part in what developed into community sailing, skiing, hill walking and many other "off site" activities.

The new squash club used the one court which was given to the youth centre by a previous Chair of Governors. They wanted to build two more

The college had a brilliant dance team which entered, and usually won, many competitions. It was run by choreographers Theresa Kerr and husband Partrick who went on to found "Bodywork" which now runs degree level dance courses in Cambridge.

So began my seven day a week twelve hour days of fun at Comberton Village College with its amazing staff who I soon got to know. More of them and the pupils I got to know very well in the next article.

Big Beef in Bazas!

Recently, Jane and I drove down to South-West France just beyond Bordeaux to Bazas. Every year, since 1283, this city has held 'La Fête des Boeufs Gras de Bazas', just before Mardi Gras and the careful eating time of Lent, to celebrate their special beef breed. This year we were there in the Place de Cathedral. There were 18 bulls competing for the title of 'Le Roi Boeuf'.

The whole city had been closed by road barriers since first light. We walked down after breakfast. The bulls began to arrive from 10.00. Although castrated as a calf, each competing, fattened bull is very strong with a show-weight of about 900Kg. The bulls had completed a six-month training programme which included fattening-up, exposure to recorded 'crowd noise' and periodic close-tethered walking behand a slow-moving vehicle.

The bulls were transported in twos and threes from their farms to be held a stoutly railed area of carpark up-town. After two hours watching the bulls and trailers arriving we decided to go down-town to find some cooked beef for lunch. The program showed that the competition for the Le Roi Boeuf would happen in mid-afternoon; we had a rendez-vous with a shop en-route for a tasting of a red wine called Roi de Boeuf!

Bazas has a great gothic cathedral dedicated to Saint John the Baptist. The magnificent, heavily-carved West door entry was nearly destroyed in the uprising of French Protestants, the Hugenots, in 1566. They had already blown up parts of the cathedral with gunpowder and the West Door was set to blow. Thankfully, when the Bishop agreed to pay a ransom of 10,000 Gold Ecus the Hugenots removed the charges. Online, today's value of one gold Ecu of the time – King Charles IX of France - is £6,782. The ransom, in today's money, could be equivalent to about £6million! All this history stood as a backdrop to La Fête des Boeufs Gras.

Along the route and in the Cathedral Place there were large crowds. We found lunch in the Artisan market from a van with a wood fired oven. Their special beef 'pasties' were individually hand made on the spot and long queues had formed. Our moment arrived and we tucked in, washing the pasties down with local wine and beer!

Soon the procession into the Cathedral Place began with drum and fife bands, local herders on stilts and women in costumes red, white and blue. In one dance the women interwove through the stilt-legs of the herders – country fashion - like Morris dancers! The herders on stilts then took up their serious role, leading in the bulls.

It was nothing like the run of bulls in Pamplona! Each of the competition

bulls was closely roped to a trailer tail-board, walking at slow tractor pace. The trailers were decked with green willow wands and some carried the farm families. The final transfer happened as each bull was loosed from the trailer with three strong men on the ropes, quickly shortening the tethering ropes again onto stout rails in the Cathedral Place.

The final ceremonial was the arrival of the red-Robed members of the Confrérie Bazadaise du Boeuf and the blessing with holy water by the bishop! We greatly enjoyed this 'fête traditionelle' but it was a long day for everyone. The winning bull did get a fancy head-dress but our final thought as we walked back to our hotel was of sadness for the bulls – but that's Brits for you!

We had come to enjoy a spectacle and special food and we certainly did that. We enjoyed Tomme de Bazadaise cheese but most of all - the beef! During our stay, at different times, we ate beef terrine with mustard sauce 'a la ancien', pink succulent Beef Wellington and delicate beef Carpaccio. We had a little French caviar from a sturgeon farm in the Bassin d'Archachon, southwest of Bordeaux. Our hoped-for annual Diner-Dansant in the Salle Polyvalent had been cancelled. What a shame!

For our final meal-out in Bazas we chose 'El gato en la cocina' (the cat in the kitchen) for Sunday lunch in the Place de Cathedral. In full spring sunshine we ate a delicious spiced Columbian recipe of – you guessed it - Bazas beef. Yum!

On the day after the Fete, the regional paper was full of details. Public attendance may have exceeded 5000. One tourist had commented, 'Ce n'est pas la fête de végétariens ici!'

During our time in Bazas we kept finding scallop shells set into the pavements. These mark a pathway for pilgrims or Pelegrins walking on the 'Chemin', or 'Camino' de Santiago de Campostella in north west Spain. This is one of the great pilgrim destinations in Europe. We found

some useful information inside the West Door. In a following Contact article I will talk more of the Camino and of my fascination for roof gutters and 'spitters'!


