Comberton Village College 1979-99 and its impact on the village

A series of reminiscences by Terry Wall

It is worth remembering that Village Colleges were planned during the Great Depression when Cambridgeshire was the second poorest county in England. I feel that they have effectively been destroyed in the name of "economy". Anything outside the school has to be a "commercial" venture. Look at the college facilities. How many are run by and for the community?

Youth clubs and youth workers are seen as a luxury and community education can come from the internet. Personally I feel that there has never been a greater need for a "community" in this village. Most people do not even realise that the building by the squash courts is, or was, The Youth Centre. It was open seven days a week.

In 1979 Keith Foreman wanted me to put a youth club once a week in every village in our catchment area. "Choose different days so that kids can see their friends at different clubs." He suggested, but did not say how I should do it. I had a small budget but I was astonished that when I put an advertisement in magazines like Contact people came forward to volunteer. Haslingfield, Barton, Eversden, Bourn, Caldicote, Hardwick, and lots of others, even Dry Drayton, soon had thriving youth clubs run mostly by volunteers.

In Comberton Ken Gifford, my next door neighbour said, "If you're desperate I'll do a few weeks until you find someone." Ken was an outstanding youth leader for more than twenty years as well as being involved in many other things in our village including the cricket club. Suzanne Brunning and Barbara Deal are other terrific youth leaders whose names come to mind.

The houses by the college were "staff houses" to rent before many staff bought or rented houses in the neighbouring villages. I lived on the corner of West street. Keith lived close to the school and Barbara Dennis the deputy had the house on the corner of the college grounds. Many staff were youth leaders in the evening. Kelvin Simmonds actually did three evenings a week. "You look like you need a bit of help young Wall!"

Discos raised money which I used to pay "expenses" for those few who would accept them. Matt Wheeler, another teacher, ran the discos with me. I wandered from place to place during the week saying hello.

It was being run as a public pool but was losing a lot of money. A paid lifeguard and heating bills were the main eaters of cash. In the school term the heating could be paid by the school but not in the school holidays. It was not well attended. I did the maths. It had to close unless something radical were to happen. I called a meeting and tried to explain the problem. It did not go well at first. "We raised the money for the pool. It's your job to run it." seemed to be the chosen line from the community. Finally I said, "If we don't think of something quickly, it will be a rose garden by next Summer!" not my best bit of diplomacy.

Fortunately a cooler head than mine told us of another village college pool which was run by the community. He came up with a plan. Family membership paid in advance. A parent had to be with primary age children. You had to either do a " duty" on the door or even serve as a life-guard. Ian Rigg the head of P.E. agreed to train people and Harry Brown was our first chairman, quickly followed by others who I regret to say I've forgotten their names.

That Summer the pool was very busy every day of the holidays. It became a social meeting place for parents too. I did very little other than to go for a swim. Perhaps someone will write in an article about how the swimming pool continues to thrive as a community pool.

My next article will be about "Sunday Sports" and how it developed from a bit of badminton to skiing, windsurfing, hiking in England and Wales and lots of away weekends for families from Comberton. I'm sure there are families still around the village who can tell a story about Sunday Sports.


