A working group to prepare a recommendation to the next Parish Council meeting on the budget for 2011. The working group is asked to take the baseline budget which will be prepared by the Clerk and consider this against the agreed principles and add any special projects etc to it before making recommendation to the Council.

In 2006/7 the Parish Council adopted the following basic principles to be applied to its budgets.

- The Council will continue to look for other sources of funding apart from the Precept to fund its budget
- There should be strategic benefit
- The Council should endeavour to make the pavilion run at as near to, if not at nil cost
- Support should be given to other village groups and organisations which benefit the village







The new football season for us started on the first weekend in September, with just under 200 children making up 12 teams. After some pre-season training the children and coaches were all looking forward to getting back to playing football, and this positivity has been reflected in the strong start that our teams have made. TRIBUTE TO BRIAN COOK

Brian Cook died very suddenly on Friday October 16th just seven weeks after his wife Margaret sadly passed away. Brian had lived in the village for over 48 years, having moved here as the village policeman with his new wife Margaret. He was extremely conscientious in his job promoting numerous community activities which he rightly saw as a powerful means of reducing crime. He dealt with any misdemeanours swiftly and effectively. For example in the sixties when he caught youngsters doing graffiti in a bus shelter he would frog march them to their parents home. They would later report to him at the bus shelter armed with paint and brushes (supplied by the parents) where they redecorated the bus shelter. For good measure he got them to redecorate the other bus shelter as well!

Brian's community activities were almost too numerous to mention. They were mainly focussed around the Village Halls and the Recreation Ground. In the old village hall (the wooden building in Green End now used as offices) he established a Table Tennis club for young people. The floor of the old hall needed replacing and with skills gained as an apprentice carpenter when he left school Brian did the work. His skill at carpentry was frequently put to good use in the village hall which replaced the old one and more recently in the new village hall.

In the late 60's and early 70's Brian was the inspiration behind three hugely successful carnivals on the Recreation Ground . He invited the well known comedian Leslie Crowther to open the first of these in 1966 . Such was his appeal that the organisers were totally overwhelmed by the attendance from far and wide. The carnivals were always followed by a ball at the Village College in the evening when the celebrity who opened the carnival performed a cabaret and top class bands provided the music for dancing. For many years Brian organised balls on New Year's Eve at the Village College which were always oversubscribed .

Apart from the obvious enjoyment and creation of community spirit which all of these events provided, they also generated substantial funds which were used to improve the

More recently Brian played a large part in helping to create the New Village Hall which has been such an outstanding success. His carpentry skills were again in use fitting out the kitchen with the help of John Collins. He was familiar with all the technical workings of the hall and those of us left to run it in his absence are having to work hard to come to terms with these. Brian applied his practical skills in helping to build his own house in West Street in 1972. Needless to say he did all the wood work. In addition all the electrical wiring and much more besides.

In 1983, after 27 years in the police force, Brian decided to retire and set up his own security business aptly named Briar Security. As one would expect this has been very successful and is now being run by his son Stephen. His daughter Rachel is an accomplished violinist. One might have thought with his wood working skills that he might have made her violin. He realised he wasn't quite up to this and commissioned a violin maker to make it for her.

Brian had many attributes but one thing stood out. He didn't believe in red tape. If there was a job to be done he got on with it almost immediately. Reliability was his second name. As will be apparent from what has been said above Brian was a great asset to Comberton. He will be sadly missed.

ABOUT MARGARET AND BRIAN COOK.

In the spring of 1990 my wife Els and I, Wim Rensink, came to live in Comberton, 61 West Street, just opposite the house of Margaret and Brian. The reason we went to Comberton had nothing to do with our knowing anything about the village or its inhabitants. Early retirement and feeling at home in England had given us the stimulus to try to find a place to live in that country, and a bungalow in a proper rural environment, at an acceptable price, about one hour travelling distance from London happened to be for sale in Comberton, a place until then unknown to us.

The day that I arrived, without Els who had to give her music lessons still for another month, Brian Cook invited me to join a sort of party that was going to take place that evening at the Village College. I remember that I felt quite embarrassed, knowing nobody at all, and said so to this kind new neighbour. — Oh, no problem, and he asked me to come to his house afterwards, to eat something there, and to meet his wife and other people. I do not remember that evening at all now, but that was the day our friendship started.

When Els arrived one month later Margaret took care of her in many ways, from introducing her to the Women's Institute to teaching her about English ways of propagating certain plants and showing her how to make English pastries.

In the almost four years that followed we learned from Brian and Margaret ways of doing and ways of thinking that often appeared to be slightly different from ours. I often asked Brian about, in my eyes, quaint English habits or customs. He being the practical man who could do and make almost everything with his hands (as was mentioned at his funeral on October 26 by his brother David and his son Stephen). When for instance

Why do English showers never spout crafty enough? About these and many other menial things we discussed quite a lot, as well as about politics, or euthanasia, about things that our respective governments did value differently. Or about languages, and whether it was an asset or a liability to have English as ones mother tongue. About the in my eye,s anti-cultural habit of the BBC and other English media never to let the public experience a speech in a foreign language. British people never hear a politician or an artist deliver a speech in Russian, or in Italian, or in Dutch. They never can appreciate the beauty of other languages. Brian tried to explain why the British do as they do, I did the same for European or Dutch things. We liked to do that, and learned from each other.

When Els had to go to Addenbrookes with sudden thrombosis Margaret was an angel of help and advice. She also stimulated Els to join the village competition that was held in the Village Collage, where one could show off, exhibiting his or her largest cucumber or reddest tomato, and was very proud of her when Els won some prizes (there were many categories to compete in). She was present when we needed help.

We -Els more that I- got to know quite a lot of people in Comberton in those years, but Margaret and Brian remained special. In the fifteen years after we moved back to Holland we saw each other quite regularly, they staying with us, we visiting Comberton. Now that they passed away so suddenly for us the heart has been taken out of the village. We shall remember with great pleasure Margaret's 70th birthday party at the Village Hall, September 2008. Nobody except she herself and Brian then knew she had cancer, and nobody at all knew Brian's heart being on the brink of total failure. We will remember them as the living and caring persons they were. We have still friends in Comberton, and for us it will remain a very special place. But it has irretrievably changed. It feels different now.

After coming back from a torn ligament in my wrist in June I was hoping for a successful summer, having finished my A-levels. I played for Cambridgeshire in division 4 held in Oxford. WINTER GLORY

The big challenge for gardens in the winter months of December and January is to create colour and interest. This is not easy since there are few hardy plants to be found in flower; nevertheless, shrubs offer capabilities for blocks of colour. Mahonias, with large sprays of yellow flowers, can be the mainstay of colour against a dark evergreen hedge. Euonymous japonica has orange-coloured seed heads that break out of their husks at the end of the first week in January and make an interesting garden and indoor display. Golden-leaved Cupressus trees offer a splendid eye-catching focus that can be matched by a blue spruce (Picea pungens glauca). These two trees give height to the garden as well as providing insects for goldcrests; these tiny birds are often found within a flock of blue tits grazing through the trees in cold weather. Clusters of Cornus shrubs with their strongly coloured bark provide good stands of red, yellow, or salmontinted upright stalks.

Spick n' span

The long autumn with little frost made the leaves stay on the trees in early November. If you have some still on the lawns, rake and compost them. If leaves lie there over the winter, the grass underneath them will die back and look unsightly. Tidy round the shoots of bulbs but be careful not to disturb them. In the week before Christmas, look round the garden and see if any shrubs have flowers left so that you can bring sprigs of them into the house. If you are fortunate, there may be a rose or two that could still have a flower. By mid-January it should be time to think about pruning if the weather forecasts are favourable. Similarly, overgrown hedges may profit from thinning during

Indoor plants

Indoor varieties of cyclamen are rightly a very popular source of enjoyment. The trick is to keep the plants in flower for a long time. In my experience, this is possible with the smaller flowering varieties on stalks less than 12 cm long. I have a pot containing 3 corms of a small pink variety that was given to me in October 2008. It has flowered continuously without a break for over a year now; the smallest number of flowers (7) occurred in August. The plant has been watered sparingly but without the compost drying out. It has been fed about once a month with liquid tomato food and each time this stimulated a profusion of blooms. Scale insects can be a problem and affect some leaves, the insects look like small swellings close to leaf veins. The infected leaves can be pulled off and burnt. An alternative treatment is to spray the undersides of the leaves with a proprietary spray for the insect. Larger flowering cyclamen finish flowering in early summer and can be left to dry out; they can be re-potted and watered to start them off in September.
