



Comberton Village College parking





NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All



As I write it is the last day of the Spring Term (not that we've seen much Spring yet) and children and staff are very ready for a break. We are having a non-uniform day today and, it being April Fool's Day, the theme is 'wear something silly', followed by the important caveat 'with sensible shoes'! We don't want anyone falling over unnecessarily...

In the last couple of weeks children have been learning about the important messages of this time of year. A Christian organisation called GenR8 presented a lively assembly reminding children of the real message of Easter, and I delivered an assembly on Passover, its history and background, and the importance of the seder meal to Jewish people.

As I mentioned previously, we also celebrated Earth Hour by following the advice to 'wear something, turn off the light'. Children were invited to wear a bright accessory for assembly (a hat, tights, scarf, jacket, for example) – the hall was a positive riot of neon

LAWN CARE IN MAY

Weed Control

In most seasons this is the best month for weed killing with either a selective weed killer or a weed and feed fertiliser. Selective means that the weed killer will only affect the weeds and leave the grass unharmed. This is by far more effective and longer lasting. As the weed recedes and dies back so the grass that it was previously strangling can branch (tiller) out to take the place of the weed.

Mowing

Continue mowing, and increase the frequency. The grass will look and grow better if cut little and often, rather than one big cut. This month cut no lower than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch (2 cm).

Irrigation

Whilst there is usually plenty of moisture around in the soil, the grass will grow vigorously. However we are due a hot and dry spell, and this can sometimes occur in May, which could cause drought conditions in our lawns. If you do plan to water your lawn (I have mixed views on whether it is or isn't the right thing to do) then make sure it is watered properly. By this I mean let the water soak in at least 7-10 cm (3-4"), other wise you can do more harm than good by literally only wetting the surface. It is better to water once a week and to do it properly than 2 or 3 times poorly.

Actions required in May

- Feed lawn with Nitrogen fertiliser
- Treat weeds with herbicide once actively growing.
- Mow lawn lightly. Don't cut shorter than ³/₄ inches (2 cm) this month. Grass will respond better if cut little and often.
- Neaten edges of lawn with half moon edging tool.
- Possible irrigation requirement

Some of the above tasks can be carried out by the lawn owner, other tasks may need some professional intervention.

PUTTING YOU IN CONTROL OF YOUR SOCIAL CARE

A new approach to social care introduced by Cambridgeshire County Council and its NHS partners means individuals can now choose the help they need to meet their social care needs.

Self-Directed Support involves identifying and allocating a Personal Budget – an upfront allocation of funding for eligible individuals to plan how to meet their social care needs and to achieve their personal goals.

Help is available at every stage, from completing the initial assessment to producing a support plan to show how the money will be spent and managing the budget. This can be taken as a Direct Payment or left with the County Council to manage on behalf of the individual service user.

Self-Directed Support is being introduced over a two-year period. By March 2011 all new and existing users of social care services who are eligible for support will have been moved over to the new system and will be more in control of the support and services they receive.

MAY PLANTING

With spring in full flow, it will be interesting to see how quickly the plants catch up with normal flowering times after the long delay of a cold winter. This winter was the 14th coldest in Britain in the last 160 years. Although most of my frost-tender plants are well and truly dead, it has been a brilliant year so far for camellias; the shrubs are laden with flowers. Once they have finished flowering, it will be a good time to feed them for next year. Keep the shrubs well watered; if the soil round them dries out, bud growth for next year will suffer and this makes the plants susceptible to bud drop next spring. If you are tempted to buy camellias, you will need to grow them in ericaceous compost to reduce calcium levels that are too high in Comberton soils. Those with the largest flowers belong to the species C. reticulata. My favourite red-flowered one is 'R.L. Wheeler'.

A good white-flowered shrub for May is spiraea. It looks like a hawthorn in flower but has a more delicate growth and arches down to the ground. The stems are covered in clusters of white flowers, looking as though heavy snow has fallen. A fine variety is S.

vanouttei. It can grow nicely through an open fence to soften the fence edges.

Good colour contrasts

These are very good perennials and form excellent colour contrasts. For example, Erysimum marshallii has orange flowers and is usually out at the same time as the pale blue spikes of camassia. Plant the wallflowers in groups with the taller camassia behind. If you have a swath of purple alliums, let the Siberian wallflower wander through them to liven up the colour scheme. A mauve wallflower is E. linifolium and this contrasts well with yellow or orange tulips. Another blue-flowering plant that is also low growing, with a long flowering period and an alternative to forget-me-nots, is Brunnera macrophylla. This plant will grow well in partial shade. Make a note to buy bulbs of the late Pheasant's eye narcissus for next spring; these flower towards the end of May and are beautifully scented. If you have a damp patch in the garden, then the globe flower Trollius europaeus will flourish well, normally these are golden but there are some orange-flowered varieties available.

Splash out on bedding plants

Now is the time to buy your summer bedding plants. Decide on a good contrasting or complementary colour plan, dig the ground well and add garden compost to give a good texture for the roots. Add a little fertilizer with a good potassium content to encourage flowering. Similarly, plant up tubs so that the tub has height at the centre to give it visual structure. Choose some cascading plants to tumble over the edge. This hides unsightly pots. Remember pots and hanging baskets need daily watering on hot summer days. Use slow release pellet feed to initiate constant flowering. Remove the dead heads constantly. R.T. Choke
