Parking problems associated with CVC – B1046 road including junction with Kentings

Thank you to all the residents who took the time to write to the Council in response to the article in last month's Contact about the cost to the village of yellow lines in Kentings. The Parish Council has considered these and decided not to pay for the lines and if the County Council still won't then the Parish Council will reconsider the matter again once CVC is at capacity.

A site meeting will be taking place in November with representatives from the Parish Council, the County Council, Bennell Farm, Toft Parish Council to discuss the proposals for yellow lines along West Street outside the Village College.

Dogs on the recreation ground

Thank you to everyone who, when walking their dogs on the recreation ground keep them under control and cleans up after them. Unfortunately there are some that do not and the Council would like to ask that all dog owners keep their dogs under control, on a lead if necessary and appreciate that not everyone likes dogs and some people and children may be scared of loose dogs. There has been an increase of dog mess on the recreation ground so please ensure that dog mess is picked up and disposed of in one of the dog bins. 



NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All



This month I wanted to tell you about a collaboration between schools which is proving to be a very effective way of extending opportunities for both our children and staff. Network 11 is a group of schools consisting of ten local primary schools and the secondary school they feed in to – Comberton Village College.

The Headteachers of those schools had always met about once a half term but we strongly felt that we wanted a grouping that was much more dynamic and supportive. Hence Network 11 was created in 2009. The first thing we did (after deciding on the name!) was to appoint a co-ordinator, whose role is to strengthen the links between us.

Now it's no longer just the Heads who meet. Regular meetings take place between teachers who lead Maths, Literacy, Music, Eco-schools leaders and, more recently, Chairs of Governors. We also take part in joint training sessions – sometimes just a couple of schools are involved, sometimes many more. In April, for example, all the teachers of the ten primary schools will spend a day learning from Pie Corbett, the well-known children's writer.

We also put on special events for the children – in the pipeline at present are a Careers Conference for Year 6 children, a singing day for Year 3, and we are exploring the possibility of a Network 11 Saturday Orchestra. Working parties split off to organise particular events but behind it all is our very efficient co-ordinator, who ensures that Network 11 functions effectively.

We have lots of ideas for the future including sharing use of facilities, expertise and, in these straitened times, shared service provision. We believe that, because of Network 11, our joint voice is much stronger and we can represent our communities much more effectively in our dealings with outside agencies. Our schools are all very different but our desire to achieve the best for our children is the great unifying factor.

Those half-termly Heads' meetings still take place, but now they are just one small part of the activities of that dynamic, supportive collaboration we were seeking.

COMBERTON VILLAGE COLLEGE: A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Change is in the air. Not just the move to Autumn and then on into Winter, but change on the political and educational landscape. All of us involved with public services are obviously now working our way through the implications of the public spending review. As schools, we know that we have been protected from some of the most radical cuts, but there are still very significant changes and challenges ahead for us in the new world that is emerging.

In such times, a key question for any of us must be: 'What is it that we really stand for?' If we are to reflect on how we should react to the new challenges and opportunities of a changing world, we need a guide. We need some clear principles. Without this, we are likely to flounder and to be uncertain and unclear in our reaction and our decision-making. In this context, the principles of the Comberton Educational Trust, now formed and overseeing Comberton Village College for two years (and Jeavons Wood Primary School since it opened in September 2009) seem especially helpful and important. The trust holds 5 key principles:

- Education of the highest standard.
- Education for all pupils, regardless of ability, background and other possible factors.
- Education at the heart of the community: the Henry Morris principle.
- An outward-looking approach that always seeks to work in partnership for mutual benefit.
- Education with a clear international dimension.

Any school that affiliates to the Comberton Educational Trust must adhere to these principles. A key role of the trustees is to ensure that this is the case. The principles can then be helpful to judge what might be done in a changing world. For example, as a school judged as 'outstanding' in its last full Ofsted inspection, Comberton Village College was invited to join the first wave of the new 'converter' Academies in the country. How should such a decision be made? The answer becomes clear: how does this possible move match up against the key principles? If it can enhance some of the principles and not detract from others, then it looks a good way to proceed. If it does the reverse, then it would be a bad idea. Through this logic, both the governing body of Comberton Village College and the trustees of the Comberton Educational Trust voted unanimously to proceed with an application for Academy status. If all proceeds smoothly, Comberton Village College will thus become an Academy at some point in the New Year. Out of interest, the name of the Academy will be: Comberton Village



Fallen leaves

Leaves should be cleared away as they fall. If left for more than a few days, then grass may become damaged. Compost the leaves and then use on borders etc.

Worm Casts

This month will probably see the appearance of worm casts (small mounds of earth brought to the surface by worms). Treatments can be applied to stop the casts occurring in the first place.

Disease

With damp dewy days ahead diseases such as fusarium can kill patches in your lawn. If you see white mould or dead patches please call us for an accurate diagnosis as it may need treating with a fungicide.

Moss

Moss will start to encroach now and it is advisable to treat now before it competes with the lawn.

Actions required in November

- Aerate lawn if conditions allow
- Remove fallen leaves
- Brush off worm casts (or treat the cause of the problem)
- Look out for disease
- Plan moss control

The lawn owner can carry out some of the above tasks; other tasks may need some professional intervention.

PLANNING FOR SPRING BERRIES FOR BIRDS

November gardens are brightened up by berries. These are carried either on shrubs or small trees. Some of the berries attract garden birds and for anyone finding it difficult to walk about, the bird's antics are engaging to watch from a chair inside. Therefore, it is useful to have a number of berry bushes that are also good bird feeders. The ideal situation is to have a hedge planted with shrubs native to Britain. The hedge will provide cover for the small birds and reduce predation by sparrow hawks. Native shrubs and trees will also be a haven for insects which will attract other types of birds, such as tits, that have a preference for insects.

Hedging

Hawthorns provide their white or pink profusion of flowers in May-June; their

clusters of red berries appear in late September. The common hawthorn, *Crataegus monogyna*, with its deeply cut leaves and one seed per berry, is better than *C. laevigata* whose leaves are shallow cut and contain two seeds per berry. Generally, single-seeded berries have more flesh and are therefore more nourishing to birds. The berries are eaten by blackbirds and thrushes. When wintering flocks of fieldfare and redwing arrive from Scandinavia in October, a good haw crop can be grazed over quite quickly. Mistle thrushes can be territorial on hawthorns and chase off other birds. Ivy, *Hedera helix*, growing naturally in the hedge, flowers in autumn and does not produce berries until the winter, December through to May. The berries are black and very nutritious for hedgerow birds.

Shrubs

The spindle bush, *Euonymus europaeus*, so called because its growth in thin and spindly, provides attractive berries with a pink four-lobed outer casing that splits to reveal the bright orange fruits. Robins and long-tailed tits are very partial to this fruit; the berries appear in October and last until February. The common holly, *Ilex aquifolium*, produces berries only on female bushes; a male bush is needed nearby to provide pollen for fertilizing the female flowers. Holly berries have the longest season and are food for blackbirds, thrushes, robins and blackcaps. Often a pair of mistle thrushes will defend a holly tree and ward off intruders. Holly berries are bright red and contain a poison, ilicin, that causes stomach upsets in man. If there is snow in the winter, mistle thrushes can be overwhelmed on holly by masses of other birds, e.g. redwings and fieldfares trying to find food to survive.

Trees

The rowan tree, *Sorbus aucuparia*, and its relative the whitebeam, *S. aria*, provide a good flush of berries each year. The rowan's red berries do not last long; blackbirds are the main eaters and hardly any fruits remain in mid-November. The whitebeams provide fruit until December for the thrush families and seed eaters like the finches. Even magpies, jays and crows will eat them if there is little else. Crab apples, *Malus sylvestris*, form a good food source if left on the ground. A wide range of birds eat them in late January and early February.


